THE Peabody Museum of Natural Science, now in course of erection at Yale College, was endowed by the late George Peabody. When completed, it will be 350 feet in length, and about 100 feet in depth. One section of it is now well advanced. The materials are brown and Nova Scotia stone, and Philadelphia pressed brick. The interior halls are in finely finished masonry, delicate in color. The stories are of sufficient height for galleries, which will run through the greater number of the departments.
