IACOCCA, SAGAN AMONG WRITERS TO BE HONORED AT NJIT CONFERENCE

NEWARK, N.J. -- Lee Iacocca, Ashley Montagu and Carl Sagan are three of the literary luminaries who will be honored at the 26th annual New Jersey Author Awards Luncheon at New Jersey Institute of Technology Saturday, March 8. The event is part of the day-long 19th Annual New Jersey Writers Conference at the university; both events are sponsored by NJIT's Alumni Association.

At the conference, New Jersey writers who have published books in the last year will receive citations of merit; many of them will be available to autograph books following the luncheon. The occasion is designed both to congratulate and encourage New Jersey writers and to educate state residents about the rich and varied literature produced by New Jersey natives and residents, says Herman A. Estrin, professor emeritus at NJIT and director of the Writers Conference.

"Many people are not aware that New Jersey has a rich literary cultural history," Dr. Estrin says. Among the many great authors who live or did live here are Stephen Crane, Walt Whitman, Joyce Carol Oates, Gay Talese and Amiri Baraka, he adds.

This year's group of honored writers includes former Princeton residents Iacocca, author of <u>Iacocca: An Autobiography</u>, and Montagu, who in 1985 published <u>The Dehumanization of Man</u>. Sagan, who will be cited for <u>Comet</u> and <u>Contact</u>, is a native of Rahway, and Edward Koch, Mayor of New York City and author of last year's <u>Politics</u>, went to high school in Newark.
