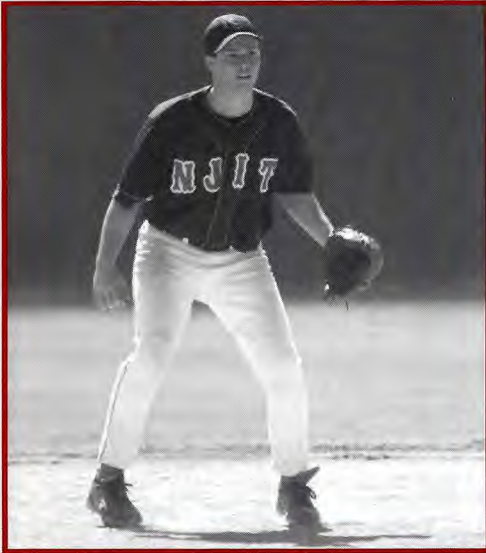

Season Outlook

In **Brian Callahan's** first two seasons as head coach of the New Jersey Institute of Technology baseball team, he has been satisfied with the program's modest improvement. After combining for a 16-92 record in the three years before Callahan's arrival, the Highlanders have posted back-to-back 14-victory seasons.

But NJIT is now entering its sixth year as a member of Division II, and is eligible for the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference playoffs for the first time since joining the league in 2001. The upgraded schedule includes eight teams that won 30 or more games last year, and three that reached the NCAA Division II Tournament. So as Callahan welcomes his third recruiting class, he is ready to raise the expectation level.

"It's time to start seeing results, especially within the conference," said Callahan, who is 28-40 overall and 16-20 in CACC games. "The kids we brought in two years ago are juniors now, and have had time to grow. It's time to see what we're made of. Anything less than reaching the conference tournament will be a disappointment."

BATTERY: The pitching staff was hampered by the season-ending leg injury suffered by last year's staff ace and starting first-baseman, **Chris Legiadre** during the winter. However, the other four starters return, including junior co-captain **Dan Raczynski**.

Raczynski is backed by **Zach Porcello**, a transfer from Division-I Lehigh University. Freshman **Vinny Tavaglione** and left-hander **Rob Forbes** have earned spots in the rotation, along with junior **Ryan Wendolowski**.

Southpaw **Mike Palomino** and right-hander **André Narvaéz** are the top two relievers and can spot-start when necessary. Junior **Chris Schwartz**, the everyday first-baseman, is the likely closer. Callahan will also look for quality innings from veteran **Robert Olohan** and newcomers **Brian Ascolese** and **Brian Ragas**.

Sophomore **Phil Resciniti** and junior **Ryan Held** will battle for time behind the plate. Freshman **Jeff Potter** provides depth.

INFIELD: The Highlander infield will have a shaken-up appearance. Legiadre's injury forces Schwartz from left field back to his freshman position of first base, with Forbes as the back-up. Co-captain **Steven Kosinski**, who began his career at third base before moving to shortstop, shifts again to second base. Newcomers **Matt Carlucci** and **Justin Racz** will platoon at shortstop. **Steve Craig**, who played four positions last year, has earned a full-time spot at third base, where sophomore **Ryan Blair** will also see time. **Jeff Schaffer** is the utility infielder.

OUTFIELD: After two years as a reserve, junior **Jesse Gargano** will be given the first crack at the left-field spot vacated by Schwartz, with Forbes also under consideration. Strong-armed sophomore **Dan Lupo** shifts from right field to center, and highly-touted freshman **Kwesi Mitchell** takes over in right. Another rookie, **Anthony Dagosta**, can back up at all three outfield positions.

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002. He succeeds Dr. Saul K. Fenster, who retired after 24 years of service to the university.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



DR. JOEL BLOOM

Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990. In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including physical education and athletics.

Bloom is also dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls 460 students from 15 states and several foreign countries.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He currently chairs the State College Advisory Bound Board and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a master's and doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.



LENNY KAPLAN

Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000.

Kaplan is a native of Commack, Long Island, and attended Commack High School South. He resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

6 BRIAN CALLAHAN

Head Coach

Brian Callahan's 14 victories in each of his first two seasons as NJIT's head baseball coach represent the most wins for the Highlanders in their five years as a member of NCAA Division II.

Callahan, who has a 28-49 overall record, was one of the nation's youngest head coaches when he was hired in

the fall of 2000. He had spent the previous spring with NJIT as an assistant to Dave Sawicki. He has also been an assistant at Ferris High School and Felician College.

Callahan, 28, was a four-year letterwinner at Division-I St. Peter's College in Jersey City. As a senior for the Peacocks, he was a Metro-Atlantic Athletic Conference all-academic selection. From 1996 to 1998, he served as graduate assistant sports information director and assistant baseball coach at his alma mater.

A graduate of Bayonne High School, Callahan received a bachelor's degree in history and elementary education in 1996, graduating magna cum laude, and a master's in education administration

and supervision in 1998 from St. Peter's. He resides in Bayonne.

20 JEFF SONNEMA

Assistant Coach



Jeff Sonnema, a 1999 graduate of NJIT, is in his fourth season as an assistant men's basketball and baseball coach at his alma mater.

A former pitcher and first-baseman, Sonnema led the Highlanders in both wins (3) and earned-run average (3.55) in his senior season. He also hit .307 that year with four home runs and 27 runs batted in. For his efforts, he was chosen the team's most valuable player.

Sonnema was a four-year letterwinner in both basketball and baseball. On the hardwood, he was the Highlanders' MVP as a junior in 1996-97 after leading the team in scoring (14.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.5 pg). He was selected as a New Jersey College Basketball Coaches Association All-Star. In 1998, he was named NJIT's Outstanding Senior Male Athlete following his final basketball season.

Sonnema, who earned a bachelor's degree in management, lives in North Haledon. He will be married to Katie Steiginga during the season.

41 ED WARD

Assistant Coach



Longtime area coach and official Ed Ward joined the NJIT baseball staff in the fall of 2001. In his first season as hitting instructor, the Highlanders broke the school record for team batting average (.308).

Ward was the first-ever head coach at Felician College, going 34-42 in two seasons. During his tenure, his teams defeated three nationally-ranked Division-II opponents and one Division-I squad. The Golden Falcons reached the CACC playoffs each season.

Prior to Felician, he spent 12 years as an assistant coach at Division-I Fairleigh Dickinson University, with recruiting, field maintenance, fundraising and development of the outfielders among his responsibilities.

Ward is an assistant men's basketball coach at Montclair State University, and helped guide the team to the NCAA round of 16 in 2002-03. During his five years with the Red Hawks, they have a overall record of 89-46 and three ECAC Tournament appearances. Ward is also an IAABO-certified basketball official and an NJSBUA-certified baseball umpire, and has coached both sports at the high school level.

Ward received a bachelor of arts degree in physical education from Kean College in 1981. An Elizabeth resident, he is a physical education and health teacher at St. Aloysius High School in Jersey City.

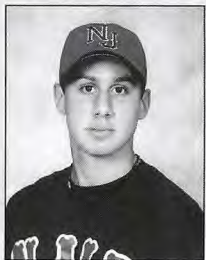

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT baseball team plays its home games at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility adjacent to the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Lubetkin, which is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's soccer teams, contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and has seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators. The field is also used for physical education classes and intramurals.

The NJIT men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home games in **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the Fleisher Center. Entwisle seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main

floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

The baseball team also has access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a free-weight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university has state-of-the-art facilities with more than 2,000,000 square-feet of space located on a 45-acre campus in Newark, a Technology and Engineering Center at our 125-acre campus in Mount Laurel, N.J., shared with Burlington County College, and a solar observatory in Big Bear, Calif.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering (NCE)** has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and main-

tain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The **College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA)**, established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The **Albert Dorman Honors College**, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The **College of Computing Sciences**, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

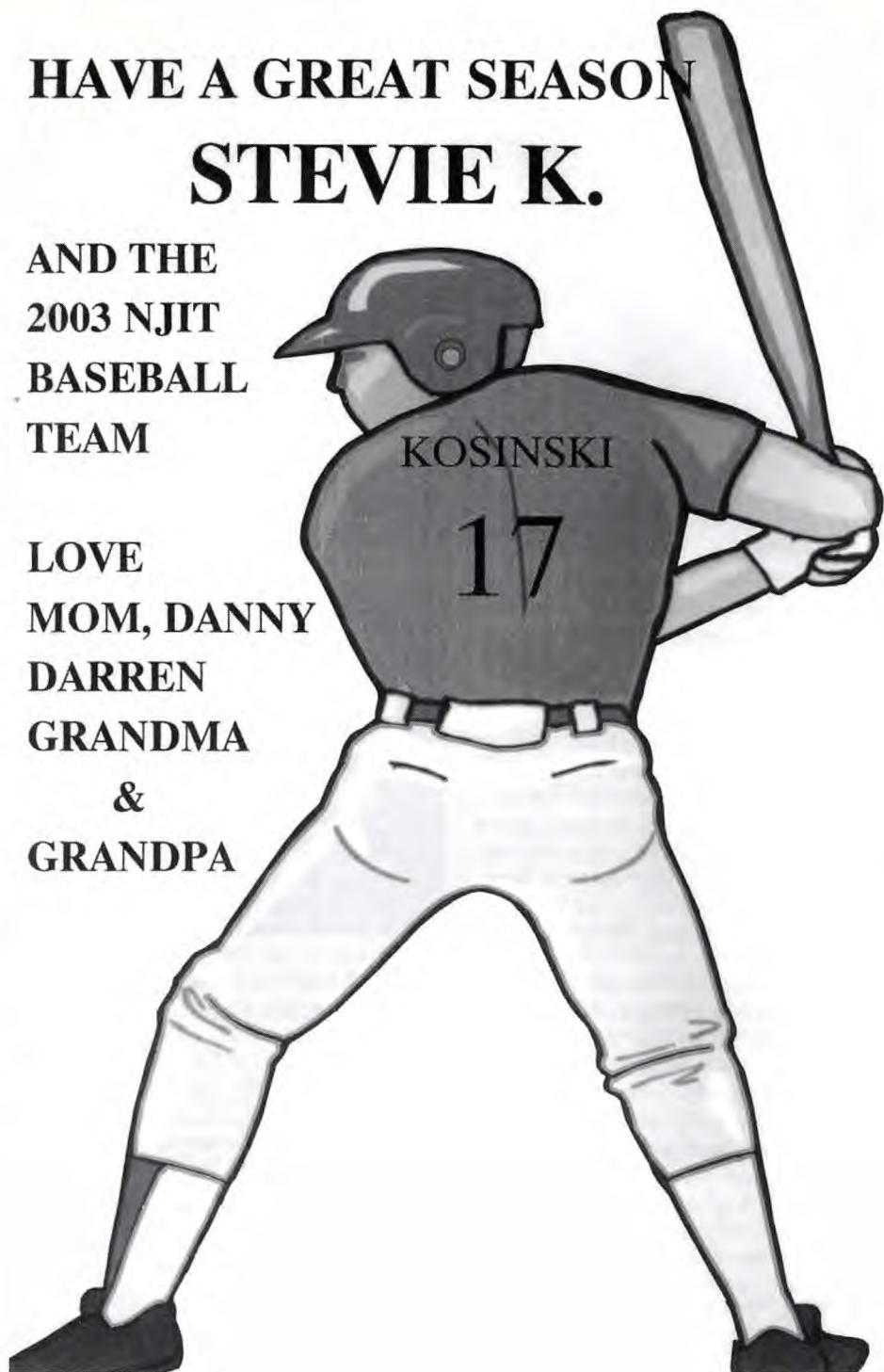

For the fourth consecutive season, the NJIT baseball team will play selected home games at Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium in downtown Newark.

NJIT will play five games on three of its 2003 home dates at Riverfront. Located just a mile from the NJIT campus, Riverfront is home to the Newark Bears of the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball Clubs. Opened in July 1999 at a cost of \$30 million, Riverfront seats 6,200 spectators.

NJIT was 14-26 overall last season, but 4-3 at Riverfront. Its overall record at the stadium is 8-5.

"It's a great experience to play at a professional baseball stadium," said third-year NJIT head coach **Brian Callahan**, who was an assistant in 2000 when the relationship began. "This is a great agreement for both sides. The Bears can show people what a beautiful facility they have, and we can showcase our program to recruits."

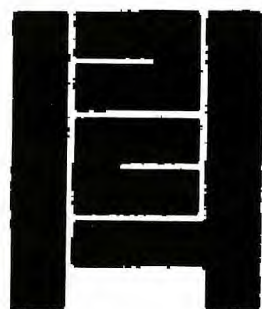

When NJIT reclassified its athletics programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997, it joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 as members of the **Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC)**.

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For the last two seasons, NJIT was only league school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). However, five other CACC members have completed their provisional requirements and will make their NCAA debuts in 2002-03: Bloomfield College, Caldwell College, Dominican (N.Y.) College, Felician College, and Teikyo Post University.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, allowing the opportunity to foster local rivalries.
