2005 Outlook

The New Jersey Institute of Technology baseball team has improved in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference standings each season under head coach **Brian Callahan**. The only way to continue that trend in 2005 would be to win the championship.

The Highlanders were the runners-up in both the regular season and CACC tournament a year ago. In the process, they set a school record for victories with 23, and earned their first ECAC Division II playoff berth. The success earned Callahan CACC Coach of the Year honors, and nine out of 12 starters return.

"Last year was very special for us," Callahan said. "Although we did not win the conference, we became the first team in the Division II history of NJIT to reach the finals. Even though we lost eight players from last year's team (including CACC Player of the Year **Chris Schwartz**), we return some high-caliber players. The key to our offense will be our team speed, and I also believe we have the best defensive team in my five years at NJIT."

While Callahan lists winning the conference as the season's primary goal, the CACC champion does not receive an automatic berth into the NCAA Division II playoffs. To earn the program's first such invitation, a selection committee needs to be impressed, and every game matters. Callahan has had no problem creating the necessary sense of urgency.

"With the school's impending move to Division I, I have stressed that this is our last chance to leave our mark on the Division II ranks. We took giant steps last season, and now all 28 players must play like seniors. What better way to make Division II history at NJIT than a trip to NCAAs."

BATTERY/DH: The Highlanders' top two starting pitchers return in junior right-hander **Chris Legiadre** and junior lefty **Robert Forbes**. Legiadre, a two-time All-CACC selection, walked just five batters in 75 innings last year. Senior **Zach Porcello** looks for a rebound season in the No. 3 spot. Completing the rotation are junior **Brian Ascolese** and freshman **Robert Pietrocola**.

Hard-throwing senior **Dennis Keefe** will be moved from starter to closer to ease his workload after knee surgery. **Pedro Rivera**, a newcomer with a strong arm, will often be the first man out of the bullpen and will be asked to be versatile. Freshman **Cory Kuzmik**, sophomore **Austin DeRogatis**, and starting shortstop **Justin Racz** will get work, and freshmen **Chuck Leppo** and **Danny Kapica** are the long men.

Senior catcher **Phil Resciniti** will once again see the bulk of playing time. Junior **Jeff Potter** has improved steadily and will likely split doubleheaders with Resciniti. Sophomore **Jon Palumbo** and freshmen **Scott Iwanowski** provide depth.

Legiadre will be the designated hitter in most games that he doesn't start on the mound. Forbes, Resciniti and Potter are also possibilities.

INFIELD: Last year's middle infield of second-baseman Dan Morogiello, and Racz returns intact. Newcomers Chris Cardone, Matthew Schlitter and Tyler Hamilton will back up. Freshman Mike Turner will begin the season at third base, but will be pushed by junior Jeff Schaffer. The lefty-swinging Forbes is slated to platoon with right-hander DeRogatis at first base.

OUTFIELD: The outfield could end up as one of the best offensively and defensively in the Northeast Region. Sophomore **Derrick McCain** moves from first base to his high-school position of left field. All-region centerfielder **Dan Lupo** is already fourth on NJIT's all-time hits list and won the team batting crown a year ago, while All-CACC selection **Kwesi Mitchell** returns in right. Freshmen Pietrocola and **Jerome Coleman** and junior **Anthony D'Agosta** are the reserves.

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch joined NJIT as as the university's seventh president in July 2002.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research,



teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch holds a PhD from Purdue University, a MS from the University of California-Berkeley, and a BSME from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.

DR. JOEL BLOOM Vice President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom joined NJIT in 1990.



In his current position of vice president for academic and student services, he is responsible for eight divisions of the university, including physical education

and athletics. He recently served one year as interim provost.

Bloom has also been dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College since 1998. The Honors College enrolls more than 500 students, from 15 states and several foreign countries, with an average SAT score of 1300.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He currently chairs the Greater Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College. and holds a master's and an EdD from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Manhattan College,



Lenny Kaplan was appointed in August 2000 to head NJIT's division of physical education and athletics.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's

University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director with the Jaspers from 1991-2000.

Kaplan is a member of the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

He resides in Merrick, New York. with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

6 BRIAN CALLAHAN

Head Coach

Brian Callahan has guided the Highlanders to their most successful seasons in NCAA Division II. The 2004 campaign was



the best yet, as NJIT finished second in the Central Atlantic Collegiate



Conference and set the school record with 23 wins. As a result, Callahan was voted to his first CACC Coach of the Year award.

Callahan, 30, was one of the nation's youngest head coaches when he was hired in the fall of 2000 after one year as an NJIT assistant. He has been steadily building the program ever since. The 14 victories in each of his first two seasons represented, at the time, the most wins for NJIT since it reclassified from Division III in 1998. In 2003, the team qualified for its first CACC playoff berth, a feat it repeated last season with a runner-up finish.

Callahan, who has a 62-96 overall record, is a member of the Division II Northeast Regional Advisory Committee. He has coached 10 all-conference and two all-region players, and one conference Player of

the Year. Before joining the Highlanders' staff, he was an assistant at Ferris High School in Jersey City.

Callahan was a four-year letterwinner at Division-I St. Peter's College. As a senior for the Peacocks, he was a Metro-Atlantic Athletic Conference all-academic selection. From 1996 to 1998, he served as graduate assistant sports information director and assistant baseball coach at his alma mater. He is also a member of the St. Peter's Intramural Hall of Fame.

A graduate of Bayonne High School, Callahan received a bachelor's degree in history and elementary education in 1996, graduating *magna cum laude*, and a master's in education adminstration and supervision in 1998 from St. Peter's. He is pursuing a doctorate in educational leadership from Capella University.

Callahan resides in Bayonne.

41 ED WARD Assistant Coach

Ed Ward is entering his fourth sea-



son as an assistant baseball coach at NJIT.

Ward's duties include instructing the hitters and outfielders along with being the bench coach on game days. He also

oversees the program's recruiting. In his first season, the Highlanders broke the school record for batting average (.308).

Ward was the first-ever head coach at Felician College, winning 34 games in two seaons. During his tenure, his teams defeated three nationally-ranked Division-II opponents and one Division-I squad. The Golden Falcons reached the CACC playoffs each season.

Prior to Felician, he spent 12 years as an assistant coach at Division-I Fairleigh Dickinson University, with recruiting, field maintenance, fundraising and development of the outfielders among his responsibilities.

During his coaching careeer, Ward has recruited 18 players who went on to sign professional contracts.

Ward recently completed his seventh season as an assistant men's basketball coach at Montclair State University, and was the interim head coach of the Red Hawks for the spring 2005 semester. He hepled guide Montclair State to the 2002-03 New Jersey Athletic Conference Championship. He has also coached both sports on the high school level.

Ward is an NJSBUA-certified baseball umpire and is the director of the Highlander Winter Hitting Camp and the Golden Falcon Baseball Camp. He received a bachelor of arts degree in physical education from Kean College in 1981. Ward lives in Elizabeth.

39 DAN MOROGIELLO Volunteer Assistant

Former major-leaguer Da



Morogiello is in his first season as NJIT's pitching coach.

Morogiello was a third-round draft choice of the Atlanta Braves in 1976. He played a total of 10 professional sea-

sons, reaching the majors with the Baltimore Orioles in 1983. That season, he posted a 2.39 earned-run average in 22 relief appearances, helping Baltimore to the World Series championship. Morogiello pitched two seasons at Seton Hall University, leading the Pirates to the College World Series in 1975.

Following his professional career, Morogiello pitched 10 years in the Metropolitan Baseball League, and was inducted into the Bergen County Hall of Fame. He is still active in over-30 baseball leagues. Morogiello was the pitching coach at Hunterdon Central Regional from 1999-2002.

Morogiello's son, Dan, is a secondbaseman for the Highlanders. He and his wife, Nancy, also have two daughters, Vanessa, 23, and Jenna, 11.

14 ANDRÉ NARVAÉZ Volunteer Assistant

André Narvaéz, a 2004 graduate of



NJIT, is in his second season as the team's first-base coach. He will also assist with the pitchers and outfielders.

Narvaéz posted three victories and two saves in his four-



About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's developement.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30 graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering** (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the

innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The Albert Dorman Honors College, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The College of Computing Sciences, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new

knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
 - · extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$75 million today. The university conducts cut-

ting-edge applied research through multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

Campus Center Construction Complete

NJIT's Campus Center, opened in September 2004, is the final phase of a three-year, \$83.5-million campus makeover. It is designed to be the focal point of a vibrant campus life. The center features a soaring, two-story circular dining hall, sheathed in gleaming, double-pane, energy-conserving glass.

The construction program encompasses two tall multi-story buildings – the East Building, housing the Albert Dorman Honors College, the Department of Biomedical Engineering, and administrative offices, and the center itself, featuring dining facilities, student offices and lounges, game rooms, campus store and ballroom. The two buildings are connected by a sky bridge and a European-style piazza featuring a 55-foot clock tower.

In an effort to improve communication and socialization on the 45-acre urban campus, the architects scaled the complex to create the feel of an outdoor room and give more spatial definition to the campus. "To promote socializing, we wanted to encourage people to move through spaces, not around them," said **Thomas Levering**, associate partner at the architectural firm Gwathmey Siegel.

The new round campus dining hall adds height and verve plus doubles the dining space. Its smoky gray glass provides a strong presence on the campus green. A 28,000 square-foot, rooftop grass terrace crowns it. Paths around it reroute traffic to the center. The clock tower stands adjacent to one entrance to the center. The donated tower features a carillon that chimes hourly.

The construction represents a major portion of more than a \$100 million facilities improvement plan. Completed are additional residence space and an additional building for the business incubator program. Upgrades in the works include two of NJIT's oldest buildings, Cullimore and Eberhardt halls, located adjacent to the complex.

"A good-looking center tells a visual story," said Levering. "A center with the right stuff says life outside the classroom is as important as life within it."

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT baseball team plays its home games at **Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium** in downtown Newark *(see next page)*, home to the Atlantic League's Newark Bears.

Lubetkin contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities. bleacher seating for ap-

proximately 1,000 spectators. It is also used for club sports and intramural events. The baseball team also has access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking

equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a freeweight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), and a martial arts/fencing center.

The NJIT men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home games in the main gymnasium of the



main gymnasium of the NJIT's hammer-strength weight room, in the basement of the Fleisher Center. The fac- Fleisher Athletic Center.

ility seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramurals, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building. The newly-renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.



Directions to NJIT

Garden State Parkway (GSP): Take exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

New Jersey Turnpike: Take exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.

Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 1 & 9 North & South: Take exit marked Newark, Route 21 (McCarter Highway). Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. (There are clear signs for Broad Street) Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 78: Take Route 78 to the Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions.

Route 22: Take Route 22 to Route 21 North. Follow directions for Route 21 North.

Route 21 North: From 21 North, turn left onto Raymond Boulevard. When Raymond Boulevard turns into Lock

Street, turn right onto Warren Street. Turn right onto Colden Street and follow signs to NJIT parking deck.

Route 21 South: From 21 South, turn right on Bridge Street. Turn left on Broad Street. Go one block and turn right on Washington Place. Go one block and turn left on Halsey Street. Go one block and turn right on Central Avenue. Make the third left on King Blvd. At first light, turn right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

New York Thruway: Thruway to Exit 14A, Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions above.

George Washington Bridge: NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

Lincoln Tunnel: West on Route 3 to NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

From Brooklyn, Queens and Long Island: Take Verrazano-Narrows Bridge (Interstate 278) and follow 278 across Staten Island. Cross Goethels Bridge. Follow signs to New Jersey Turnpike North then follow New Jersey Turnpike directions above.

OTHER TRANSPORTATION

Newark International Airport: Five miles from the NJIT campus. A minibus (Newark Airlink) or taxi service connects the airport with Penn Station in Newark. Bus, city subway, and taxi connections may be obtained at the station.

Newark Penn Station: Connections to the NJIT campus may be made by bus, city subway, or taxi.

Newark City Subway: From Penn Station in Newark, take the Warren Street stop for the NJIT campus.

FROM THE SOUTH

New Jersey Turnpike: Follow NJ Turnpike North to exit 15W (Newark / The Oranges). After toll booth follow Route 280 West to exit 15A (Route 21 - Downtown). Follow signs to Route 21 South (McCarter Highway). Make a right onto Route 21 South, 2nd light make a right on to Bridge Street.

Garden State Parkway: Follow the Garden State Parkway North to exit 145 [Route 280] Follow Route 280 East. Stay to the right to exit 15 [Route 21 South - Downtown]. At the bottom of the ramp, make right onto Route 21 South, [McCarter Highway]. At the 2nd light make a right onto Bridge Street.

FROM THE WEST

Route 280: Follow Route 280 East to exit 15 (Route 21 South - Downtown). At the Bottom of the ramp, make a right onto Route 21 South, (McCarter Highway). At the 2nd light make a right onto Bridge Street.

Route 78: Follow Route 78 East until it splits near Newark Airport, Stay right and follow Routes 1&9 South to Route 21 North (McCarter Highway). You will travel across the viaduct into downtown Newark. After crossing the viaduct stay in the left hand turn lane and at the first light make a left onto Miller Street. Make a right hand turn onto Broad Street. Follow Broad Street for about 20 blocks. Make a right on to Bridge Street.

FROM THE NORTH, NORTHEAST & NEW YORK CITY

From New York City: From GW Bridge or Lincoln Tunnel follow signs to the NJ Turnpike South. Take NJ Turnpike South to exit 15W. From the Holland Tunnel follow signs to the NJ Turnpike North. Take NJ Turnpike North to exit 15W. Follow directions from exit 15W below.

NJ Turnpike: Follow NJ Turnpike South to exit 15W (Newark / The Oranges). After the toll booth Route 280 West to exit 15A (Route 21 - Downtown). Follow signs to Route 21 South (McCarter Highway). Make a right onto Route 21 South, (McCarter Highway), at the 2nd light make a right onto Bridge Street.

Via Garden State Parkway: Follow Garden State Parkway South to exit 145. Follow signs to Route 280 East. Follow Route 280 East to exit 15 (Route 21 South - Downtown). Make a right at the bottom of the ramp onto Route 21 South (McCarter Highway), at the 2nd light make a right onto Bridge Street.

VIA PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

The following **New Jersey Transit** buses provide direct service to Newark Broad Street station, which is less than one block from the stadium: 11, 23, 27, 39, 41, 42, 43, 72, 76, 78, 108, and the Penn Station-Broad Station Shuttle.

Broad Street Station can also be accessed by any train on the Essex County Line. Any New Jersey Transit train can be taken to Newark Penn Station.



FROM NJIT TO BEARS & EAGLES (one mile)

From Fleisher Athletic Center (80 Lock Street), travel northeast on Lock (toward New Street) and turn right onto Central Avenue. Follow one-half mile to Washington Street and turn left. After 0.2 miles Washington becomes Bridge Street. The stadium will be on the left. Turn left onto Route 21, then the first left onto Division Street (one-way). Park on Division.



When NJIT reclassified its athletics programs to NCAA Divison II from Division III in 1997, it joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC).



After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 as members of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference [CACC]

For its first two seasons in the league, NJIT was the only CACC school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affilia-

tion from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). However, five baseball-playing institutions completed their provisional requirements in 2003, two more did so in 2004, and this year, Wilmington (Del.) College culminates the transition by making its NCAA debut. As a conference, the CACC was voted into active status by the NCAA membership committee in July 2004.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and three other member schools are in New Jersey, allowing the opportunity to foster local rivalries.
