



#### **DIRECTIONS TO NJIT**

Garden State Parkway: Take exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow <u>Route 280 East</u> directions. New Jersey Turnpike: Take exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow <u>Route 280 West</u> directions.

Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 1 & 9 North & South: Take exit marked Newark, Route 21 (McCarter Highway). Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. (There are clear signs for Broad Street) Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

**Route 78**: Take Route 78 to the Garden State Parkway. Follow <u>GSP</u> directions.

Route 22: Take Route 22 to Route 21 North. Follow directions for <u>Route 21 North</u>.

Route 21 North: Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. (There are clear signs for Broad Street.) Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to the NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 21 South: From 21 South, turn right on Bridge Street. Turn left on Broad Street. Go one block and turn right on Washington Place. Go one block and turn right on Halsey Street. Go one block and turn right on Central Avenue. Make the third left on King Blvd. At first light, turn right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

New York Thruway: Thruway to Exit 14A, Garden State Parkway. Follow <u>GSP</u> directions above. George Washington Bridge: NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow <u>Route 280 West</u> directions above.

Lincoln Tunnel: West on Route 3 to NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow <u>Route 280 West</u> directions above.

From Brooklyn, Queens and Long Island: Take Verrazano-Narrows Bridge (Interstate 278) and follow 278 across Staten Island. Cross Goethels Bridge Follow signs to New Jersey Turnpike North then follow New Jersey Turnpike directions above.

### SEASON OUTLOOK


The last five years have seen a great deal of change for the New Jersey Institute of Technology men's basketball program. The approach of 22nd-year head coach **Jim Catalano**, however, has always remained the same.

The Highlanders begin their fourth year of Division-II competition since reclassifying from Division III in 1997. Starting in 2000-01, NJIT will play in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) after three years in the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference.

Furthermore, Catalano not only loses all five starters from last year's 15-12 campaign, but his returnees combined for just 4.0 of the 79.1 points per game that the 1999-2000 squad posted.

Catalano, however, is sticking with the same philosophy that has led him to a 420-162 overall record and placed him among the top 15 winningest active Division-II coaches in the country.

"Our goal has always been simply to win our next game," he said. "We play one game at a time and work to improve from day one to the last game."

fun to watch this season, as Catalano intends to use every player on his 14-man roster. The CACC also provides the opportunity to foster local rivalries with nearby schools such as Caldwell, Bloomfield and Felician.

"We know the talent of the Jersey schools," Catalano said, "but I don't have much of a read on the others. And the nonconference games could be the seven toughest on our schedule.

"Division II raised the bar for us in terms of strength of schedule. There are no easy games - anyone can beat anyone. But my approach has always been to be ourselves and let other teams prepare for us."

#### **GUARDS**

Just about anyone that appears in the NJIT backcourt this season will be able to play both guard positions. Catalano prefers the versatility that combination guards afford him on the floor.

The most experienced faces were both missing last season: senior tri-captains **Anthony Coley** (community college) and **Owain States** (redshirt year). Coley averaged 14.3 points in 1997-98, while States posted 11.3 points per game and 47 three-pointers in 1998-99.

Pushing Coley and States are a trio of talented newcomers. Sophomore transfers Keith Forst

(Middlesex CC) and Ahmad Rasool (Wheeling Jesuit Univ.) are both smart, confident and quick ball-handlers, while true freshman Ricky Urban from North Arlington High is a potentially deadly shooter.

Also in the mix are sophomore returnees **Olivier Eyheramendy** and point guards **Justin Feintuch** and **Matthew Martins**.

#### POST PLAYERS

Only one player from this unit, sophomore **Joe Accurso**, has played for Catalano before. Accurso, who stands a wide 6foot-7, averaged eight minutes in a reserve role.

The elder statesmen of the frontcourt are senior **Pedro Trevino** and juniors **Keicey Castle** and **Mike Ranft**. But Trevino played volleyball at NJIT for the last four years, and Castle (Stockton College) and the sharp-shooting Ranft (LIU-C.W. Post) are transfers.

The development of freshmen **Phil Renaud** and **Demond Cowins** could be vital. Renaud, an imposing presence at 6-foot-4 and 230 pounds, has the makings of a dominant rebounder. Cowins, a 6-6 leaper, battled injuries in the preseason, but has been lauded by the coaching staff for his court awareness and his ball-handling for a player his size.

### DR. SAUL K. FENSTER President

**Dr. Saul K. Fenster** is the sixth president of New Jersey Institute of Technology. Prior to joining NJIT in 1978, he served in various faculty and administrative capacities at Fairleigh Dickinson University, including six years as provost of the Rutherford campus.

Fenster is a mechanical engineer. He earned a bachelor's degree from the City College of New York, a master's degree from Columbia University and a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. He has authored and co-authored two textbooks and numerous research papers and technical articles. His industrial experience includes a period as senior research engineer with the Sperry Rand Corporation and as a partner in an industrial consulting firm.

Fenster has served on many statewide task forces, commissions and committees. Currently, he is a board member of Prosperity New Jersey; the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology, Research and Development Council of New Jersey, which he chairs; the New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce; the New Jersey Alliance for Action; the New Jersey Association of Colleges and Universities; the National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering; and the Liberty Science Center.

### DR. JOEL BLOOM Vice President, Academic and Student Services

**Dr. Joel Bloom** has worked at NJIT since July 1990, and is currently vice president for academic and student services. Among his student services responsi-



bilities is overseeing the department of athletics and physical education.

Bloom also serves as the dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls 460 students from 15 states and several foreign countries with an average SAT score of 1322.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education for the division of general academic education. He currently chairs the State College Advisory Bound Board and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a master's and doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

### LENNY KAPLAN Senior Administrator, Athletics, Physical Education, Recreation and Intramurals

After serving 11 years in the athletic department at Division-I Manhattan College, Lenny Kaplan was



appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletic administration. After

three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he spent the last eight as an assistant athletic director. At NJIT, he reports to Dr. Joel Bloom, vice president for academic and student services.

Kaplan is a native of Commack, Long Island, and attended Commack High School South. He resides in Manhattan with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.





### DR. JAMES CATALANO Head Coach

New Jersey Institute of Technology can boast of one of the winningest college basketball coaches in the country in **Jim Catalano**.

Catalano has spent his entire 21-year head coaching career with the Highlanders, posting an all-time won-lost record of 420-162. He enters 2000-01 ranked 14th among active Division-II coaches in both winning percentage (.722) and victories.

During his career at NJIT, Catalano's teams have won at least 20 games 11 times, and won 11 Independent Athletic Conference (IAC) championships, including six consecutive from 1990-91 to 1995-96, and six



Skyline Conference titles. The Highlanders appeared in five NCAA Division III Tournaments in the 1990s.

At one point, Catalano won six consecutive coach of the year awards, four in the IAC and two from the Skyline Conference. The National Association of Basketball Coaches

(NABC) selected him Division III Atlantic District Coach of the Year in 1993 and 1995. Last season, Catalano and assistants Joe Caiola, Gerald Holmes and Jeff Sonnema were selected Division-II Staff of the Year by the New Jersey Basketball Coaches Association.

NJIT enjoyed its best-ever season in 1994-95. The Highlanders set school records for victories and winning percentage by going 28-2, won 22 consecutive games, hosted the NCAA Atlantic Region Finals, and advanced to the round of eight.

Catalano and the Highlanders competed for the first time in NCAA Division II in 1997-98 when they joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). They became the initial first-year member of the 12-team NYCAC to advance to the conference tournament.

Two seasons ago, Catalano recorded his 400th career victory when the High-



landers defeated Southampton College, 82-59, on Feb. 6, 1999. He has enjoyed a near-unbroken string of success, posting only one sub-.500 season in 21 years.

A native of New Jersey, Catalano was a standout athlete at Belleville High School, earning all-Essex County honors in basketball and Parade all-America and all-state recognition in baseball. In 1977, he was inducted into the Belleville Athletic Hall of Fame.

After attending Newark State College (now Kean University) for one year, Catalano transferred to Jersey City State College (now New Jersey City College), where he was a three-year starter in basketball and baseball before graduating in 1973. In his senior season, he was named to the Division-III all-Metropolitan team. Catalano went on to earn a master's degree in educational administration and supervision from William Paterson University and a Ph.D. in education from LaSalle University.

Catalano is also the director of athletics at NJIT, admininstering the day-to-day happenings of the department. He has served on numerous committees, including two terms each as president of the IAC and Skyline Conference, and co-founded the Skyline and the Jersey "9" Association. He has also served on the NABC national college committee, chaired the Division-III all-America committee, and been the president of the Kinnelon Board of Education.

He has teamed up with his wife, Pattie, to develop a nationally-recognized educational program called "Athlemics," which involves teaching academic subjects to at-risk youths through athletic examples and experiences. The Catalanos reside in Kinnelon with their son, Michael, 22, a Highlander assistant coach, and daughter, Jenna, 21, a senior at NJIT majoring in history.

### GERALD HOLMES Assistant Coach

Former NJIT captain and point guard Gerald Holmes begins his second season as a Highlanders assistant coach, and first as a full-time staff member in the athletic department.



Holmes played under Coach Catalano from 1982-1986 and was team captain as a senior. His 1983-84 squad won the ECAC championship. He graduated from NJIT in 1987 with a degree in engineering science.

Holmes is a 1982 graduate of Columbia High School in Maplewood, N.J., where he coached from 1993-1999. He is also a certified IAABO official.

### JEFF SONNEMA Assistant Coach

Jeff Sonnema joined Catalano's staff almost immediately after graduating from NJIT in 1999 with a



bachelor of science degree in management. He is a former Highlander MVP in both basketball (1997) and baseball (1999) and was a four-year letterwinner in both sports.

Sonnema led NJIT in scoring

(14.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.5 pg) in 1996-97. Following that season, he was selected to the New Jersey College Basketball Coaches All-Star Game. He was NJIT's Outstanding Senior Male Athlete in 1999.

Sonnema is also an assistant baseball coach at NJIT. He lives in North Haledon.

### LANCE ANDREWS Assistant Coach

Lance Andrews, one of the top players in NJIT history, returns to his alma mater for his first season as an assistant coach.

Andrews is the Highlanders' all-time assist leader with 611 from 1989-93, and his 1,755 points ranks third on the school career list. He resides in Newark.

### MICHAEL CATALANO Assistant Coach

Michael Catalano is another first year member



of the coaching staff, staying on after his recently concluded four-year playing career.

The son of NJIT head coach Jim Catalano, Michael was a two-year captain for the Highlanders. Currently a video store manager, Catalano will receive his bachelor's

degree in December 2000. He resides in Kinnelon.

### DeSHAWN CHARLES Manager

After concluding his athletic eligibility last sea-



son, **DeShawn Charles** has stayed on with the Highlanders as a manager while he finishes his degree.


Charles, a Union High School graduate, started his collegiate career at Union County College. He then transferred to NJIT and posted two-

year totals of 776 points, 226 rebounds, 279 assists and 158 steals. As a senior, he finished fifth nationally in Division II in steals per game.

### ATHLETIC FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at Entwisle Gymnasium, the main facility in the Estelle and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center.




Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the floor. main making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural

events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at Lubetkin Field, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.



NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling. The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, learn to swim, skiing, strength training and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.







#### NJIT and the CACC

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Divison II from Division III in 1997, the High-



landers joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in 2000-01 when they be-

came a member of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC).

NJIT is the only school in the 12-member CACC with full NCAA membership. The other member institutions possess provisional NCAA status, as they are in the process of switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Four CACC schools are within a 30-minute radius of NJIT's Newark, N.J., campus, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries.

CACC members for 2000-01 include Bloomfield College, Caldwell College, Dominican (N.Y.) College, Felician College, Georgian Court College, Goldey Beacom College, Holy Family College, NJIT, Nyack College, University of the Sciences in Philadelphia, Teikyo Post University, and Wilmington College.

Due to its NCAA status, NJIT cannot participate in the CACC postseason tournament until 2002-03. The Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC Division-II playoffs on an at-large basis.


