




"NJIT Men's Basketball – The Best of Both Worlds"

The status quo will not be acceptable this season for the New Jersey Institute of Technology men's basketball team. Second-year head coach **Jim Casciano** has put together an ambitious schedule, and expects increased contributions from his seven returning letterwinners.

The biggest challenge for the veterans and four newcomers alike will be replacing the statistics and intangibles left behind by last year's only senior, **Mars Mellish**. In his only season as a Highlander, Mellish averaged 20.9 points and 2.9 steals.

"Besides the obvious statistics, we must replace the intangibles, the defense, and the willingness to take the big shot that Mars gave us," Casciano said. "We must distribute our scoring across the board, therefore everyone must step up. We can't live with the same numbers as last year from our returnees. Freshmen are unpredictable, but they, too, must give us production and solid minutes."

To equal or better last year's second place finish in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference will be only one of the challenges put before NJIT this season. Of the schedule's seven potential non-league opponents, three are ranked in the national Division II preseason Top 25 poll.

"You always want to test yourself with quality opponents," Casciano said. "Our conference is underrated and underappreciated. There are a lot of solid teams. But like all the other teams in our league, we need to go out and beat Northeast-10, NYCAC and PSAC teams and beat them regularly. If we can win enough games to put ourselves in position, our strength of schedule may make the difference for a postseason bid."

BACKCOURT

Senior **Ahmad Rasool** (11.7 ppg, 4.9 apg in 2001-02) will be looked upon for leadership among the guards. An all-CACC selection as a sophomore after transferring from Wheeling Jesuit University, he will be asked to play both guard spots this season.

Freshman Clayton Barker could win the other guard spot. Another option is senior Olivier Eyheramendy (3.0 ppg, 1.1 apg in 11.0 minutes), but Casciano often likes to use Eyheramendy as a "spark plug" off the bench. Sophomore Kevin Burns (1.7 ppg,

1.8 rpg in 16.5 minutes) will play on the perimeter as either an off-guard or small forward.

"We're not deep at guard," Casciano said. "There's uncertainty where Mars's 20 points a game will come from. I could use a bigger line-up, but we may sacrifice some defense."

FRONTCOURT

At the power forward and center spots, returning starters **Demond Cowins** (12.6 ppg, 7.3 rpg, 36 blocks) and **Yung Kiely** (3.7 ppg, 5.3 rpg) will be pushed by junior **Phil Renaud** (10.3 ppg, 5.3 rpg, .522 FG%) and freshman **Henry White**.

"I expect big things from Demond in the post just as I do from Ahmad in the backcourt," Casciano said. "They must be our leaders. Yung and Phil logged a lot of minutes last year; now we need consistency from them. White is like a young colt with all that energy."

Youth will reign at the small forward spot. Looking for a regular role will be sophomores Burns and Randle DeFalco (2.0 ppg, 2.1 rpg) and Argentinian freshman José Mikulas. Junior Mike Lee provides depth in the post.

Administration

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002. He succeeds Dr. Saul K. Fenster, who retired after 24 years of service to the university.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in

university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990. In his current position of vice-president for aca-



demic and student services, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including physical education and athletics.

Bloom also serves as the dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls 460 students from 15 states and several foreign countries with an average SAT

score of 1322.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education for the division of general academic education. He currently chairs the State College Advisory Bound Board and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a master's and doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN

Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created po-



sition of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals. He has since taken on the responsibilities of director of athletics.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of op-

erations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000.

While at NJIT, Kaplan has served on NCAA regional and ECAC selection committees. He is a member of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference's finance committee.

Kaplan is a native of Commack, New York, and attended Commack High School South. He resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

JIM CASCIANO

Head Coach

Jim Casciano wasted no time in finding success as the head men's basketball coach at New Jersey Institute of Technology. Last season, his first with the Highlanders, he guided NJIT to a second-place finish in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference and was named CACC co-Coach of the year.

Casciano came to NJIT after winning the ECAC Division III South championship in 2000-01 with King's College. The Monarchs also earned their first Middle Atlantic Conference playoff berth since 1993-94.

Casciano brought to the Highlanders his reputation for building winning programs. He spent five seasons at King's, and amassed 12 combined victories in the first three. The Monarchs, however, improved to 13-11 in 1999-2000 to enjoy their first winning campaign out of the previous six, then improved to 19-9 in 2000-01.

"I came to NJIT for the challenge," Casciano said.
"I wanted the opportunity to once again build a program, and to work with scholarship athletes. NJIT has great academics, and an athletic department that has a commitment to its athletes and wants to be successful."

Casciano has coached in all three divisions of the NCAA as well as at the NAIA and junior college levels. As a head coach, he has become best-known for rebuilding struggling programs. In his only season at Castleton State (Vt.) College in 1982-83, he established a school record for victories, going 14-11, and earned a berth in the NAIA tournament.

Casciano then moved on to Division-II St. Michael's College in Winooski, Vermont. After two rebuilding years, his 1985-86 squad went 19-10, earning Casciano Mideast Collegiate Conference coachof-the-year honors.

The next year, the Purple Knights won the MCC championship and earned the program's first NCAA tournament berth in 20 years. With an overall record of 20-11, it was St. Michael's first 20-win season in 12 years. The Knights were ranked No. 1 nationally in Division II by several publications, including *Sports Illustrated*, in the 1987-88 preseason.

Casciano compiled four consecutive winning seasons with St. Michael's before leaving after the 1988-89 season. After four years as a Division-I assistant, he became the head coach at Valley Forge



Military College in Wayne, Pennsylvania. In three seasons with the NJCAA school, he compiled a 50-19 record and had five players earn Division-I scholarships.

Casciano began his coaching career as an assistant to Rollie Massimino at Villanova University. He has also assisted at the University of Delaware, Washington & Lee University, Old Dominion University, and Radford University.

Casciano played collegiately at Drexel University, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration. A native of Bridgeport, Pennsylvania, he resides in Basking Ridge with his wife, Daphne.

JIM CASCIANO'S "TEN-STEP APPROACH"

to Academic Success

In his 13 years as a head coach, Jim Casciano has a 100-percent graduation rate of players who have remained in his program for four years. He credits this to his "*Ten-Step Approach*" to academic success, listed below:

- 1. Place sincere emphasis on academics.
- 2. Develop communications with the academic community.
- 3. The assignment of an assistant coach as academic coordinator, with other coaches serving as academic coaches.
- 4. Academic Coaches Time Management Program. (Each coach is assigned players and is responsible for monitoring their academic progress. Use of time management sheets and meeting individually with players weekly or bi-weekly.)
- 5. Letters of introduction to professors.
- 6. Monthly Grade Sheets Each player must personally have his instructors fill out grade sheets and return them to the academic coordinator.
- 7. Mandatory Study Hall Held Monday through Thursday, two hours each day, eight hours per-week. Mandatory for all freshmen, transfer students, and any player with less than a 2.75 GPA.
- 8. Effective use of tutors, counselors, advisors, and resource materials.
- 9. Effective use of summer school sessions. Helpful in students' maintaining credits and staying on course to graduate.
- 10. Emphasis on class attendance and minimizing conflicts with classes as a result of practice, games, and travel.

ANTHONY WALKER

Assistant Coach

Anthony Walker is working under Coach Casciano for the fourth consecutive year, two at King's and two



for NJIT. He will work with the Highlanders' perimeter players and coordinate recruiting.

Walker enjoyed a stellar collegiate playing career at Division-I Radford University. He graduated in 1997 as Radford's second-all-time

leading scorer with 1,601 points and the career assist leader with 510.

As a senior, Walker was a first-team all-Big South Conference selection. He became the first player in Radford history to be invited to the Portsmouth (Va.) NBA pre-draft camp. He was the Big South rookie of the year in 1994.

Walker is a graduate of Linden McKinley High School in Ohio, where he was a two-time all-state selection. He then played one season at Hargrave Military Academy. He resides in Newark.

JEFF SONNEMA

Assistant Coach

Jeff Sonnema, a 1999 graduate of NJIT, is in his fourth season as an assistant men's basketball and baseball coach at his alma mater.



Sonnema is a former Highlander MVP in both basketball (1997) and baseball (1999) and was a four-year letterwinner in both sports. He led NJIT in scoring (14.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.5 pg) in 1996-97, and was selected as a New

Jersey College Basketball Coaches Association All-Star. He was NJIT's Outstanding Senior Male Athlete in 1998.

A pitcher/first-baseman for the baseball team, Sonnema hit .307 and had a team-best 3.55 earned-run average in 1999.

Sonnema, who received a bachelor's degree in management, lives in North Haledon. He is engaged to be married to Katie Steiginga in March 2003.

RICH SPOTTSWOOD

Assistant Coach

Rich Spottswood is beginning his second year at NJIT. He previously played for Coach Casciano at Val-



ley Forge Military Academy and coached with him at King's College. Among his responsibilities is the coordination of the players' strength and conditioning programs.

A New Orleans native, Spottswood scored over 1,000

points in two seasons at Valley Forge Military. He averaged 22.0 points per game for his career and was an Eastern Pennsylvania All-Star. He then earned a scholarship to NAIA Division-I University of Mobile (Ala.), where he finished his playing career with two injury-plagued seasons.

Spottswood was a two-time all-league selection for Archbishop Rummel High School in New Orleans. He received a bachelor's degree in health education from Mobile in 1999.

MARS MELLISH

Graduate Assistant

Mars Mellish, who completed his playing eligibility for NJIT last season, has remained with the pro-



gram while completing his master's degree in financial management.

In his only season as a Highlander, Mellish was an all-Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference and all-New York Met Writers selection. He finished 19th nationally in Divi-

sion-II scoring (20.9 ppg), 8th in steals (2.9 pg) and tied for 30th in three-point field goals per game (3.0)

Mellish was born in Liberia and raised in New Brunswick, New Jersey. He is a 2001 graduate of Manhattan College, and played three seasons of basketball for the Jaspers before attending NJIT.

Freshman manager Will Cottman is a 2002 graduate of Pleasantville High School. The son of William V. Cottman, he is majoring in computer engineering.

About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research. economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university has state-of-the-art facilities with more than 2,000,000 square

feet of space located on a 45-acre campus in Newark, a Technology and Engineering Center at our campus in Mount Laurel shared with Burlington County College, and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. 

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at Entwisle Gymnasium, the main facility in the Estelle and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center.

Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.






The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling, plus a full intramural program. The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, swimming, skiing, strength training and

CENTRAL ATLANTIC CACC

COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Divison II from Division III in 1997, the Highlanders joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 when they became members of the **Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference** (CACC).

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For the last two seasons, NJIT was the only league school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

However, five other CACC members have completed their provisional requirements and will make their NCAA debuts in 2002-03: Bloomfield College, Caldwell College, Dominican (N.Y.) College, Felician College, and Teikyo Post University.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries. The CACC champion does not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament, but Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC playoffs on an at-large basis.
