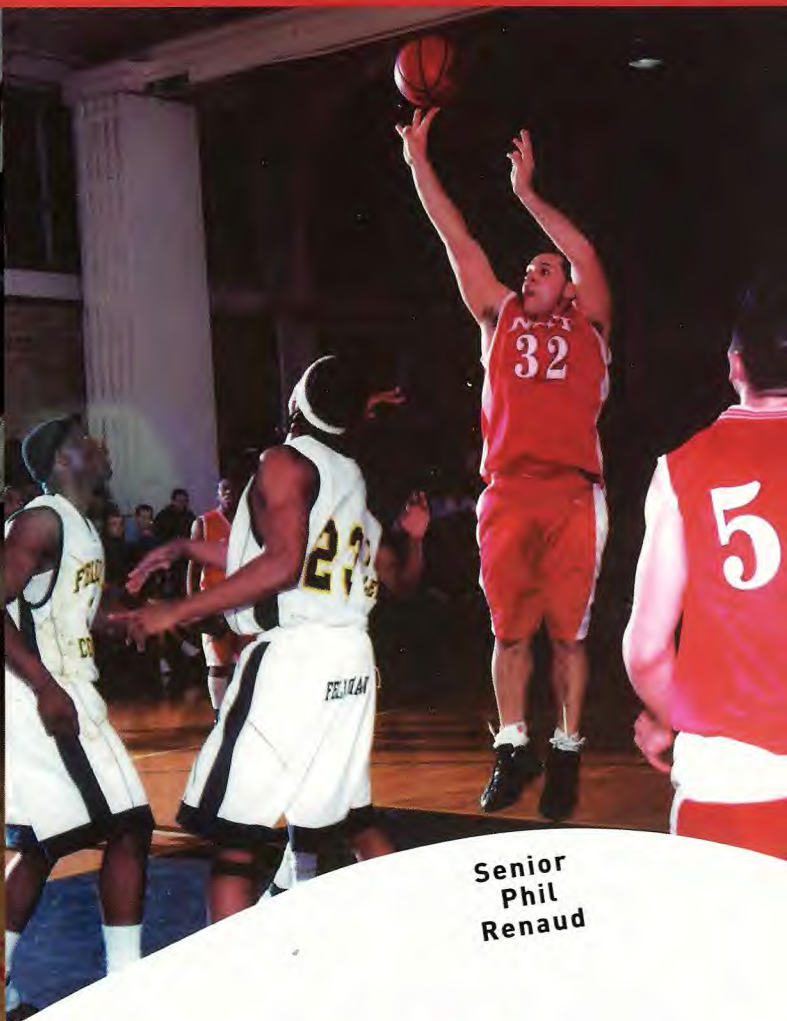

"NJIT Men's Basketball – The Best of Both Worlds"

In **Jim Casciano's** 17 years as a collegiate head coach, he has come to realize that the ideal basketball season resembles the plot of a novel. Each practice and each game should be a building block toward a peak level of performance that, the coach hopes, occurs in February and March. For Casciano's 2003-04 New Jersey Institute of Technology men's team, there will be several challenges the team must overcome to follow a proper storyline.

For one, the expectation level will be high for the defending Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference champions. NJIT returns four starters from an 18-11 season, during which it was twice regionally ranked and was the runner-up in the ECAC Tournament. Coming off their 16-4 CACC record of a year ago, the Highlanders were selected No. 1 in the league's preseason coaches' poll.

"The preseason ranking is a sign of recognition and respect," said Casciano, beginning his third year with the Highlanders. "But with that comes a price. Now we're the team people feel they need to beat to win the league, and it takes a different level of motivation and intensity to be successful. If our kids aren't physically and mentally ready, they could be in for a surprise."

A setback to the physical preparation has been nagging injuries suffered by several key players. While Casciano knows he is behind in his evaluation process, he is not allowing his team to feel sorry for itself.

"We won't settle into a rotation as early as I would like," he said. "We really haven't figured out who we are yet, but in time, we will put the pieces together. Those things will work themselves out. Unfortunately, our early-season schedule may not allow us the luxury of healing at our own pace, but the schedule is geared toward helping us get better."

NJIT's potential non-league opponents include two preseason Top-25 teams (Queens University of Charlotte and Florida Gulf Coast University) and two others who spent significant time in last year's national poll (Shaw University and West Chester University). But despite all of the potential roadblocks, the Highlanders remain con-

fident they can attain their goals.

"We certainly hope to repeat as conference champions, increase our win total, garner regional and national recognition, and ultimately qualify for the NCAA Tournament," Casciano said. "Our job as coaches is to make sure the team improves daily and plays its best basketball from mid-January through March."

Backcourt

Sophomore **Clayton Barker** (13.1 ppg, 3.8 apg, 2.4 spg in 2002-03) is coming off a tremendous freshman season at point guard. The problem for Casciano will be getting him rest. NJIT lost both of his projected back-

ups when **James Hurt** went down for the season with a torn anterior cruciate ligament and **Joe Spruill** left school for personal reasons.

Junior **Randle DeFalco** (5.0 ppg, 40 3FG), who started at the wing the last two years, is the front runner to replace graduated all-CACC performer **Ahmad Rasool** in the backcourt. He will be pushed, however, by junior **Ricky Urban** and freshman **Eugene Harris**.

"Point guard will be our biggest question mark," Casciano said. "We are hopeful that wings like Randle and Ricky can buy us some time there when Clayton is out."

Frontcourt

The Highlanders have experience in the post with the return of all-CACC performer **Demond Cowins** (19.0 ppg, 8.9 rpg, 35 blocks) and fellow senior **Phil Renaud** (8.7 ppg, 4.6 rpg). Off the bench, sophomore **Henry White** (3.1 ppg, 2.9 rpg) looks for a breakout season, and his high-school teammate, redshirt freshman **Marc Milbourne Swan**, should have an immediate impact. **Josh McKay** is another promising newcomer.

At small forward, Casciano would like to see sophomore **Jose Mikulas** (7.4 ppg, 4.3 rpg, 23 blocks) emerge as the starter due to his athleticism and versatility. Urban's three-point shooting range could earn him significant minutes, and senior **Mike Lee** provides depth.

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch was once a prominent soccer official. He was the referee for the 1987 NAIA women's national championship game, and also worked the middle for five consecutive Kentucky state high school championships.

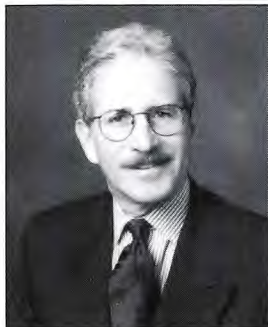
Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



DR. JOEL BLOOM

Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990.



In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including Physical Education and Athletics.

Dr. Bloom is also Dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls more than 525 students who are typically in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.

Prior to NJIT, Dr. Bloom spent seven years as Assistant Commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He is currently the Chair of the NASULGC Council of Chief Student Affairs Officers and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Dr. Bloom earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a Master's and Doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN

Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's



newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals. He assumed the duties of director of athletics shortly thereafter.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000. He is the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference Executive Committee Supervisor for men's basketball, and serves on the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

Coaching Staff

JIM CASCIANO

Head Coach

Jim Casciano has wasted no time in finding success as the head men's basketball coach at New Jersey Institute of Technology.

Last season, Casciano's Highlanders finished in



first place in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference, and were the runners-up in the ECAC Tournament. With an 18-11 overall record, NJIT had the most victories of any of its six seasons in Division II. In 2001-02, his first season in Newark, Casciano earned CACC Co-Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Highlanders to a second-place finish.

Casciano came to NJIT after winning the ECAC Division III South Championship in 2000-01 with King's College. The Monarchs also earned their first Middle Atlantic Conference playoff berth since 1993-94.

Casciano brought to the Highlanders his reputation for building winning programs. He spent five seasons at King's, and amassed 12 combined victories in the first three. The Monarchs, however, improved to 13-11 in 1999-2000 to enjoy their first winning campaign in six years, then improved to 19-9 in 2000-01.

Casciano has coached in all three divisions of the NCAA as well as at the NAIA and junior college levels. As a head coach, he has become best-known for rebuilding struggling programs. In his only season at Castleton State (Vt.) College in 1982-83, he established a school record for victories, going 14-11, and earned a berth in the NAIA tournament.

Casciano then moved on to Division-II St. Michael's College in Winooski, Vermont. After two rebuilding years, his 1985-86 squad went 19-10, earning Casciano Mid-East Collegiate Conference coach-of-the-year honors.

The next year, the Purple Knights won the MCC championship and earned the program's first NCAA tournament berth in 20 years. With an overall record of 20-11, it was St. Michael's first 20-win season in 12 years.

The Knights were ranked No. 1 nationally in Division II by several publications, including *Sports Illustrated*, in the 1987-88 preseason.



Casciano compiled four consecutive winning seasons with St. Michael's before leaving after the 1988-89 season. After four years as a Division-I assistant, he became the head coach at Valley Forge Military College in Wayne, Pennsylvania. In three seasons with the NJCAA school, he compiled a 50-19 record and had five players earn Division-I scholarships.

Casciano began his coaching career as an assistant to Rollie Massimino at Villanova University. He has also assisted at the University of Delaware, Washington & Lee University, Old Dominion University, and Radford University.

Casciano played collegiately at Drexel University, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1977. A native of Bridgeport, Pennsylvania, he resides in Basking Ridge with his wife, Daphne.

JIM CASCIANO'S "TEN-STEP APPROACH"

to Academic Success

In his 17 years as a head coach, Jim Casciano has a near-100-percent graduation rate of players who have remained in his program for four years. He credits this to his ***"Ten-Step Approach"*** to academic success, listed below:

1. Place sincere emphasis on academics.
2. Develop communications with the academic community.
3. The assignment of an assistant coach as academic coordinator, with other coaches serving as academic coaches.
4. Academic Coaches – Time Management Program. (Each coach is assigned players and is responsible for monitoring their academic progress. Use of time management sheets and meeting individually with players weekly or bi-weekly.)
5. Letters of introduction to professors.
6. Monthly Grade Sheets – Each player must personally have his instructors fill out grade sheets and return them to the academic coordinator.
7. Mandatory Study Hall – Held Monday through Thursday, two hours each day, eight hours per-week. Mandatory for all freshmen, transfer students, and any player with less than a 2.75 GPA.
8. Effective use of tutors, counselors, advisors, and resource materials.
9. Effective use of summer school sessions. Helpful in students maintaining credits and staying on course to graduate.
10. Emphasis on class attendance and minimizing conflicts with classes as a result of practice, games, and travel.

Coaching Staff

JEFF SONNEMA

Assistant Coach

Jeff Sonnema, a 1999 graduate of NJIT, is in his fifth season on the men's basketball staff at his alma mater, and his first as the lead assistant.



Sonnema is a former Highlander Most Valuable Player in both basketball (1997) and baseball (1999) and was a four-year letterwinner in both sports. He posted a team-high 15.2 points and 6.0 rebounds per game in 1996-97, and was selected as a New Jersey College Basketball Coaches Association All-Star. He was NJIT's Outstanding Senior Male Athlete in 1998.

As a freshman, Sonnema was a member of the most successful team in school history. The 1995-96 Highlanders had a won-lost record of 28-2, won 22 consecutive games, and advanced to the Division III national quarterfinals.

A pitcher/first-baseman for the baseball team, Sonnema hit .307 and had a team-best 3.55 earned-run average in 1999. He holds the school single-game record of nine runs batted in. He was also an assistant baseball coach with the Highlanders for four seasons.

Sonnema earned a bachelor's degree in management. He and his wife, Katie, reside in Wyckoff.

RICH SPOTTSWOOD

Assistant Coach

Rich Spottswood is beginning his third year at NJIT and his first as a full-time employee of the athletics department. He was previously an assistant for Coach Casciano at King's College in Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania. Among his responsibilities is the coordination of the players' strength and conditioning programs, as well as scouting and recruiting.



A New Orleans native, Spottswood scored over 1,000 points in two seasons at Valley Forge (Pa.) Military College while playing for Coach Casciano. He averaged 22.0 points per game for his career and was an Eastern Pennsylvania All-Star. He then earned a scholarship to NAIA Division-I University of Mobile (Ala.), where he finished his playing career with two injury-plagued seasons.

Spottswood was a two-time all-league selection for Archbishop Rummel High School in New Orleans. He received a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation, with a minor in sports medicine, from Mobile in 1999. He lives in Princeton.

AHMAD RASOOL

Student Assistant

Ahmad Rasool, who completed his playing eligibility for NJIT last season, remains with the program while completing his bachelor's degree in business management.



Rasool transferred to NJIT after playing at Wheeling Jesuit University as a freshman. In three years with the Highlanders, he was a two-time all-Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference selection, played in two ECAC tournaments, and became the 17th member of the school's 1,000-point club. He totaled 1,082 points, 379 assists and 198 steals in a Highlander uniform.

Rasool is a 1999 graduate of Lower Cape May Regional High School.

KHARA BROWN CHELISE GRAY

Managers

After three years as managers for the NJIT women's basketball team, **Khara Brown** and **Chelise Gray** have joined the men's staff for their senior years.



Brown is a 2000 graduate of John P. Stevens High School in Edison. Gray was a manager for coach Mark Scarano at Woodbridge High.

One of the nation's leading public technological universities, New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) prepares students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. Founded in 1881, NJIT currently has a student enrollment of more than 8,800 on its 45-acre campus, of which about 3,000 are graduate students.

- *Money* magazine's "Best College Buys" rated NJIT sixth among the top 10 scientific and technological schools in the United States and among the top 100 best values in higher education.
- According to *Careers and Colleges* magazine, NJIT is among the top 15 schools in the nation offering great schooling at a great price.
- NJIT ranks 7th in the nation in campus diversity, according to the *U.S. News and World Report* survey.
- NJIT ranks first in New Jersey for graduating African-American and Hispanic students, according to the journal *Black Issues in Higher Education*.
- *U.S. News and World Report's* "Annual Guide to America's Best Colleges" ranked NJIT among the top colleges and universities.
- *Princeton Review* calls NJIT "an excellent school for academics."
- The campus is one of the most computing-intensive in the country.
- Students are offered a unique advantage when seeking full-time employment, through strong cooperative education and internship programs as well as close ties to the leading technological companies.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30 graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, Newark College of Engineering (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The New Jersey School of Architecture, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The School of Management, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The Albert Dorman Honors College, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The College of Computing Sciences, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education.
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
- extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$50 million today. The university conducts cutting-edge applied research through

multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

U.S. NEWS: NJIT A "TOP SCHOOL"

NJIT is again among the top-ranked universities in the nation in *U.S. News and World Report's* annual "Best Colleges" issue. NJIT's rankings place the university among the leaders in education, research, diversity, and cost-effectiveness.

Overall, NJIT ranked No. 117 of 248 national universities offering a full range of undergraduate majors, plus master's and doctoral degrees. There are nearly 600 such universities, but not all are selected to be ranked. Among the 89 public universities in the rated group, NJIT ranked 59th.

The magazine uses expert opinion about program quality and statistical data that it says are reliable indicators of the quality of a school's research, faculty and students. Among the criteria used to score schools are the rate of students who graduate, class size, the student/faculty ratio, and the class ranks and test scores of entering freshmen. The current study is based on interviews and data collected in 2002.

NJIT's ranking ties it with Howard University, SUNY-Stony Brook, the University of Oklahoma, and the University of San Francisco.

In a separate study, NJIT's engineering school's undergraduate program was rated 84th out of 115 ranked engineering schools. Again, not all schools are selected to be ranked.

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the **Estelle and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.



The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling, plus a full intramural program. The newly expanded and renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, swimming, skiing, strength training and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.

NJIT students may also enrich their educational experience by enrolling in Rutgers-Newark courses and in full degree programs in disciplines not offered at NJIT, such as art, music, geology and psychology.

Each year the two universities co-sponsor a common season of theatrical productions, as well as "World Week," a joint program of honors colloquia, and a variety of other cultural and social activities.

Division II at a Glance



Almost every serious sports fan is familiar with the three NCAA membership classifications: Divisions I, II and III. The public may be less familiar with what the classifications mean, especially in the case of Division II.

In brief, Division I members are required to sponsor the most sports and provide the most athletically related financial aid for student-athletes. Division III members, on the other hand, are prohibited from providing athletically related financial assistance.

So, what does it mean to be an NCAA Division II member? More than anything, it is a commitment to balance.

First, members are required to sponsor at least 10 varsity sports (at least five women's sports) and offer at least a limited amount of athletically related financial aid, although the requirement is far less than Division I's. Those are the principal nuts-and-bolts standards that separate Division II from Divisions I and III.

But other, less tangible, considerations characterize Division II membership. Student-athletes generally come from the area in which their institution is located. They are integrated with the student body. Many coaches and administrators perform other jobs or functions at their institutions, including teaching. Most Division

II student-athletes pay for school through a combination of scholarship money, grants, student loans and employment earnings. The division's philosophy emphasizes participation, and its financial aid requirement helps ensure quality competition.

National championship opportunities in Division II are comparable to those in Divisions I and III. For 2003-04, Division II national championship competition will be offered in the following sports:

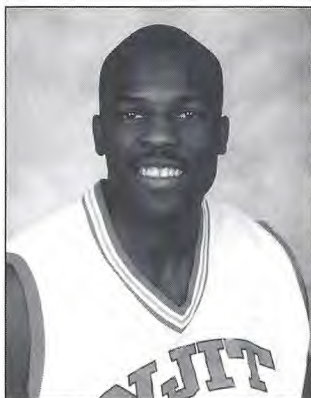

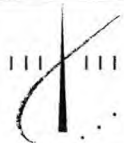

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997, the Highlanders joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 when they became members of the **Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC)**.

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For its first two seasons in the league, NJIT was the only CACC school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

However, five other CACC members completed their provisional requirements in 2002, and this year, four more make their NCAA debuts: Goldey-Beacom College, Holy Family University, Nyack College, and University of the Sciences in Philadelphia.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries. The CACC champion does not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament, but Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC playoffs on an at-large basis.
