"Our blood is strong and our hearts are highland."

The New Jersey Institute of Technology women's basketball team, in search of inspiration for the 2001-02 season, has looked no further than its own mascot. As a preseason project, third-year head coach **Sharon Manning Beverly** asked her players to research what exactly is a Highlander.

"We found out they were fierce warriors and barbaric fighters," Beverly said. "They would fight to the death. We will try to draw inspiration from that."

The research project also had ancillary goals – to turn NJIT's focus away from the 4-23 season the team suffered through last year, and to put a team with only nine players on its roster in the proper frame of mind to compete with the best teams in the Northeast region and the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference.

"This is a new team with a new attitude," Beverly said. "The obvious big key is that we need to stay healthy. And if that happens, we have nine players that are all very talented and that I would not be afraid to play in any situation. I am confident that we'll have a good year and put this program in the direction we would like it to be going."

BACKCOURT

Junior co-captain **Nicole Ballou** (8.7 ppg, 3.8 apg in 2000-01) is the incumbent at point guard and the leading returning scorer. Once again, she will be asked to take on a larger role than the previous season.

"Nicole has run the point for us for two years, and each year we've asked her to do something different," Beverly said. "She's our heart and soul and our leader, and this year she must run the show for us on offense."

Sophomore **Lindsey Reggo** (8.0 ppg, 2.7 rpg, 28 3FG) will figure prominently in the rotation at shooting

guard, replacing the school's second-all-time leading scorer, Jackie O'Connor (13.4 ppg, 3.8 rpg, 68 3FG). The Highlanders are hopeful that Reggo will play with increased confidence with a year of collegiate experience behind her.

The rest of the backcourt comes courtesy of Columbia High School in Maplewood, N.J. Junior **SchrKya Massey**, a transfer from Division-I Loyola College, and freshman **Button England** both won state champion-

ships as seniors at Columbia. Massey has solid point guard skills which may let Ballou move to off-guard at times, and England is a potentially lethal outside shooter.

"Coach Johanna Wright does a great job at Columbia," Beverly said. "We are able to offer her players a product that is not just basketball but also strong academically. We are elated to get players from such a perennial high school power. That's what we need to take us to the next level".

FRONTCOURT

Junior co-captain **Chevanese Samms** (3.3 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 30 blocks) should start at center. The 6-foot-2 Samms, who has only been playing basketball for three years, is a dominating defensive post presence and will look to get more involved in the offense.

Senior **Tennille Jordan** (5.4 ppg, 5.8 rpg in 12 games) and sophomore **Kate Duncan** (5.3 ppg, 4.5 rpg) also return to the Highlander frontcourt. Duncan has the size and shooting ability to play either the guard or forward spot. Jordan, after an injury-plagued junior season, hopes to infuse some energy with her quickness and anticipation skills. Another Columbia High product, freshman **Selena Kershaw**, gives Beverly strength in the post.

Amy Howlett, a 1997 graduate of Division-I Fairleigh Dickinson University who played for Beverly as an undergraduate, will help up front when she becomes an eligible graduate student in late December.

DR. SAUL K. FENSTER

President

Dr. Saul K. Fenster is the sixth president of New Jersey Institute of Technology. Prior to joining NJIT in 1978, he served in various faculty and administrative capacities at Fairleigh Dickinson University, including six years as provost of the Rutherford campus.

Fenster is a mechanical engineer. He earned a bachelor's degree from the City College of New York, a master's degree from Columbia University and a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. He has authored and co-authored two textbooks and numerous research papers and technical articles. His industrial experience includes a period as senior research engineer with the Sperry Rand Corporation and as a partner in an industrial consulting firm.

Fenster has served on many statewide task forces, commissions and committees. He is currently a board member of the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology, and a past chair of the Research and Development Council of New Jersey.



DR. JOEL BLOOM

Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990. In his current position of vice-president for academic and student services, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including physical education and athletics.



Bloom also serves as the dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls 460 students from 15 states and several foreign countries with an average SAT score of 1322.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education for the division of general academic education. He currently chairs the State College Advisory Board and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a master's and doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN

Senior Administrator for Athletics, Physical Education, Recreation and Intramurals

After serving 11 years in the athletic department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals.



Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletic administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he spent the last eight as an assistant athletic director. At NJIT, he reports to Dr. Joel Bloom, vice-president for academic and student services.

Kaplan is a native of Commack, Long Island, and attended Commack High School South. He resides in Manhattan with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

SHARON MANNING BEVERLY

Head Coach

Sharon Manning Beverly has completed just two seasons as women's basketball coach at New Jersey Institute of Technology, but she is no stranger to the sidelines of the New York metropolitan area. Beverly, will begin her 22nd season as a collegiate head coach when the 2001-02 campaign tips off.

Beverly is the all-time winningest women's basketball coach at Division-I Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck, N.J. Her 11-year stint with the Knights included Northeast Conference (NEC) championships in 1990 and 1992 and a regular-season NEC title in 1993. The 1989-90 season was capped by her selection as New Jersey State Division 1 Coach of the Year.



The 1991-92 FDU squad finished 23-6 overall, setting a school record for victories. The following season, the Knights went 15-12 and tied for the NEC regular-season title with a 14-4 conference mark. At season's end, Beverly was selected NEC Coach of the Year.

Beverly, who has bachelor's and master's degrees from Queens College, secured her first head coaching position in 1980 at her alma mater after two years as an assistant. After spending the 1981-82 season as the head coach at Molloy College, she returned to Queens and highlighted a six-year stay with a 16-13 record, an Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for

Women (AIAW) regional bid, and an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Division-I Tournament berth in 1987-88. Beverly has a record of 15-39 at NJIT.

Overall, she has 254 career coaching victories.

Beverly's collegiate playing career began at Queensborough Community College (QCC), where she was selected as a junior college all-star. QCC won regional junior college championships and qualified for the national tournament in both of her seasons. At Queens, her two teams finished seventh and ninth in the nation while competing in the AIAW national tournament.

Following graduation, Beverly played professionally in Europe. She led her French team in points, rebounds and assists for two consecutive seasons.

In 1991, Beverly was selected as a "Premier Inductee" into the athletic hall of fame at Christ the King High School in New York City. She was an assistant coach for the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival North Team, and served three years on the NCAA Division-I regional championship selection committee. She is currently NJIT's senior woman administrator and an assistant director of athletics.

Beverly's husband, Randy Beverly, is a former defensive back for the New York Jets and was a major part of the Super Bowl III championship team of 1968. They have one son, Preston, who is attending college on a Division-I basketball scholarship.

Assistant Coach

Kim Bowen joins the NJIT staff as a first assistant coach after two seasons as an assistant at the University of New Haven. She is responsible for scheduling, player development of the forwards, and recruiting northern New Jersey, New York and New England



Bowen was a four-year swing player and two-year captain at Southern Connecticut State University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1999. She holds the Owls' school record for assists in a game, dishing out 15 against Albertus Magnus College during her junior season.

A native of Valhalla, New York, Bowen earned a master's of business administration with a concentration in sports management from New Haven in 2001. She has additional coaching experience with the New York Future Stars AAU program and several summer camps. She resides in Hasbrouck Heights, New Jersey.

TAMMY MILLSAPS

Assistant Coach

Tammy Millsaps is beginning her first collegiate coaching position with NJIT in 2001-02. Her responsibilities include team travel, player development of the guards, and recruiting southern New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, and points south.



Millsaps was a four-year letterwinner at Division-I Virginia Commonwealth University, during which time she served on several NCAA student committees. She is active with YMCA basketball and has worked several summer camps.

Millsaps, currently of Orange, New Jersey, earned a bachelor of science degree in mass communications with a concentration in broadcasting from VCU in 1998. Before coming to NJIT, she was a production specialist for WWBT Channel 12 in Richmond, Virginia.

CAPTAIN SUE PHILLIPS

Assistant Coach

Captain Sue Phillips, a 1995 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy, enters her first season as a collegiate coach.

Phillips is an assistant professor of aerospace studies at NJIT for the Air Force ROTC Department. Along with her teaching responsibilities, she is the ROTC's admissions officer for northern New Jersey.

Collegiately, Phillips played basketball and softball for the Division-I Falcons. Upon graduation, she was commissioned and began a career in communications and information technology for the Air Force. She has been stationed at Travis Air Force Base (Fairfield, California), Wright-Patterson AFB (Dayton, Ohio) and Nellis AFB (Las Vegas, Nevada).

Phillips hails from Salem, New York. She has a bachelor's degree in humanities and a master's in information resource management.

RICH SNEDAKER JR.

Strength and Conditioning Coach

Rich Snedaker in his third year as NJIT's strength and conditioning coach. He brings 18 years of experience in the field of exercise science to the Highlanders.

Snedaker is a former strength and conditioning coach for the New Jersey Nets under head coach Chuck Daly, and is the personal trainer for several professional athletes, including retired Net Jayson Williams. 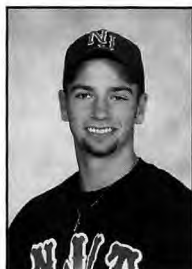

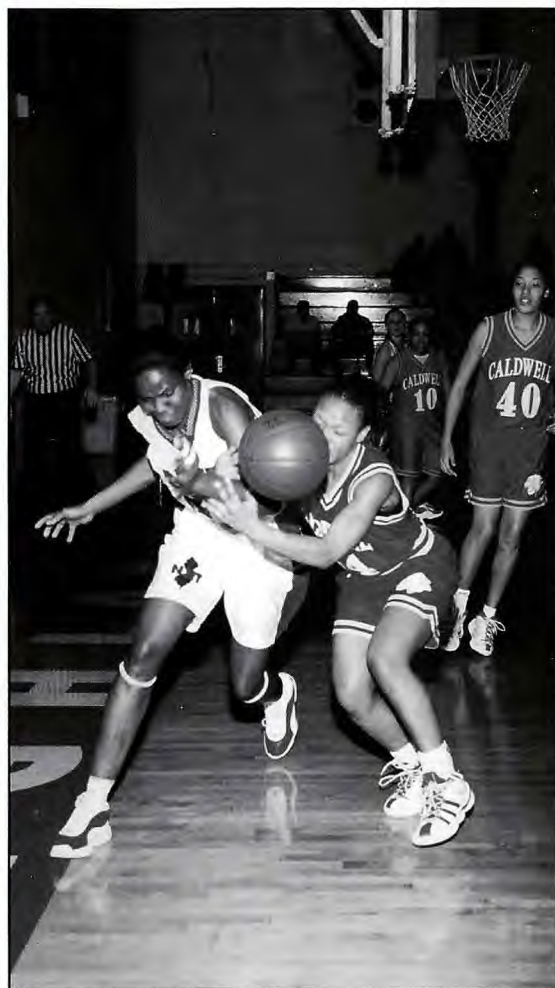

About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university has state-of-the-art facilities with more than 2,000,000 square

feet of space located on a 45-acre campus in Newark, a Technology and Engineering Center at our campus in Mount Laurel shared with Burlington County College, and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering (NCE)** has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for

the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The **College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA)**, established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar physics to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management

to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The **Albert Dorman Honors College**, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of



study.

The **College of Computing Sciences**, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

Yahoo! Internet Life magazine has perennially ranked NJIT as a “most-wired” university. As such, the university is nationally recognized as a pioneer in the use of computing and information technologies.

As a public research university, NJIT is educating leaders for a technology-driven economy. The university is rethinking educational programs to emphasize marketplace skills, and redesigning its methods of delivering education. Indeed, computing and information technology underpin every facet of the NJIT mission.



NJIT received Carnegie Foundation designation as a Doctoral II university in 1994 and has ranked among the top universities by U.S. News and World Report every year since. NJIT expends more than \$50 million in a panoply of research and development partnerships with industry, government, and other universities. NJIT researchers are making important advances in a wide range of areas, including the bio-sciences, manufacturing, microelectronics, multimedia, transportation, computer science,

solar physics, environmental engineering and science, and architecture and building science.

NJIT plays an essential role in the economic and social life of the state and nation. At NJIT, the objective is to provide graduates with the requisite analytic skills as well as an ability to integrate the work of multiple disciplines to manage and lead knowledge-based and technology-dependent businesses.

Each year the two universities co-sponsor a common season of theatrical productions, as well as "World Week," a joint program of honors colloquia, and a variety of other cultural and social activities.

The NJIT campus is in one of the nation's most exciting cultural and business regions. Advantages include:

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the **Estelle and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.



The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.



The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling. The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, learn to swim, skiing, strength training and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.

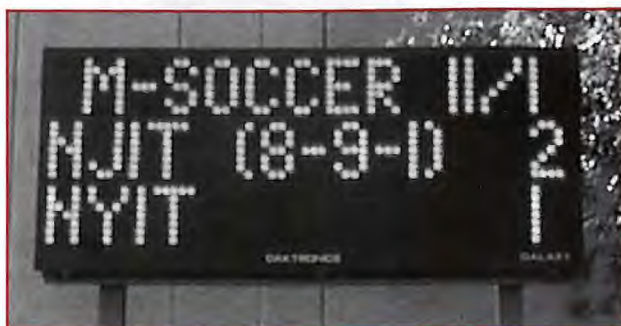

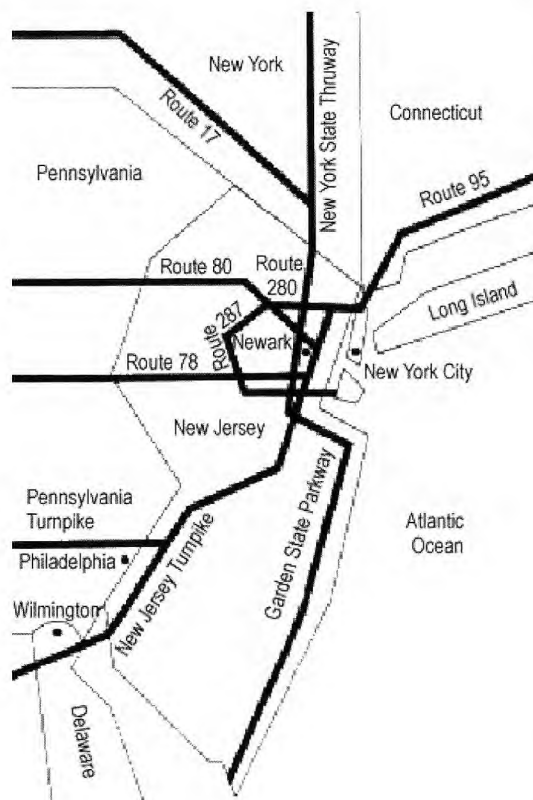

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997, the Highlanders joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 when they became members of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC).

NJIT is the only school in the 12-member CACC with full NCAA membership. The other member institutions possess provisional NCAA status, as they are in the process of switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and three other member schools are in New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries.

Due to its NCAA status, NJIT cannot participate in the CACC postseason tournament until 2002-03. The Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC Division-II playoffs on an at-large basis.
