



"NJIT Women's Basketball - The Best of Both Worlds"



NJIT's Guttenberg Information Technologies Center.

There are many familiar faces on the 2002-03 New Jersey Institute of Technology women's basket-ball team. To find change, one has to look to the side-line.

Head coach **Sharon Beverly** resigned in the summer to take an administrative position at Vassar College. The program has been turned over, on an interim basis, to last year's lead assistant, **Kim Bowen**.

Bowen inherits a squad which returns all five starters and all seven letterwinners. Thus, for the first time in many years, there are high expectations. At 15-12, the 2001-02 squad was the first winning team at NJIT since 1995-96. Accordingly, the Highlanders were selected 4th out of 12 in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference preseason coaches' poll.

The team's new leader welcomes the challenge, however.

"We don't look at ourselves as any worse than a fourth-place team," she said. "I know they only won four games two years ago, but we're well beyond that now. Our goal is to improve from last season, both individually and in the win total."

One factor that could lead to the desired improvement is the 12-player squad size. Beverly was forced to employ a seven-woman roster for most of last season, a problem Bowen is glad to have behind her.

"Having a good bench puts more internal pressure on the team," she said. "Everyone has to work hard to earn their positions, leading to more competitive practices. We should have more healthy bodies at the end of the season than last year, and be able to finish stronger."

BACKCOURT

NJIT will once again start in a three-guard set. Senior co-captain **SchrKya Massey** (20.7 ppg, 6.3 rpg, 4.3 apg, 3.3 spg in 2001-02) set single-season school records for points (539), assists (113) and steals (88)

after transferring from Division-I Loyola (Md.) College. In her final season, she should be a strong candidate for postseason honors.

Classmate **Nicole Ballou** (11.5 ppg, 3.8 apg) is a fourth-year starter and second-year captain. Already the Highlanders' all-time assist leader, Ballou will likely be given more chances to play shooting guard than ever before. The team will also look for increased pro-

duction from junior **Lindsey Reggo** (10.1 ppg, 35 3-ptrs.).

Freshmen **Shonté Dixon** and **Jessica Vogel** are expected to be regulars in the playing rotation.

"Kya is a major scoring threat," Bowen said, "and Nicole gives us great leadership. We're looking for Lindsey to be more of a scorer; her confidence is up tremendously. And the freshmen will be asked for solid minutes."

Junior Laquana Guy and transfer Sharaé Robinson provide depth in the backcourt.



Last year's starters, sophomore **Selena Kershaw** (11.2 ppg, 8.1 rpg, 34 blocks) and jun-

ior **Kate Duncan** (5.8 ppg, 7.6 rpg) once again appear to be the lead post players.

"Selena had a good freshman season," Bowen said. "Now we're looking for more consistency and more offense. Kate has gotten stronger and looks more aggressive than ever before, especially on the offensive boards."

Graduate student **Chevanese Samms** (5.0 ppg, 7.1 rpg, 16 blocks) will once again look to use her long six-foot-two frame to disrupt opposing shooters. Five-foot-11 Canadian freshman **Breanna Turnbull** has shown the ability to play four positions.

The Highlanders also hope for a mid-season spark from sophomore transfer **Jackie Lupo**, who is out until January due to a stress fracture.

Administration

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002. He succeeds Dr. Saul K. Fenster, who retired after 24 years of service to the university.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in

university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July



1990. In his current position of vicepresident for academic and student services, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including physical education and athletics.

Bloom also serves as the dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls 460 students from 15 states and several foreign

countries with an average SAT score of 1322.

Prior to NJIT, Bloom spent seven years as assistant commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education for the division of general academic education. He currently chairs the State College Advisory Bound Board and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Bloom earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a master's and doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created po-



sition of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals. He has since taken on the responsibilities of director of athletics.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of op-

erations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000.

While at NJIT, Kaplan has served on NCAA regional and ECAC selection committees. He is a member of the finance committee for the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference.

Kaplan is a native of Commack, New York, and attended Commack High School South. He resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

KIM BOWEN

Interim Head Coach

With her promotion from assistant coach in September 2002, Kim Bowen becomes one of the young-

est head coaches in the nation at age 24.



Bowen spent last season as NJIT's first assistant under Sharon Beverly. When Beverly resigned over the summer to take an administrative position at Vassar College,

Bowen was awarded the head job on an interim basis.

Prior to NJIT, Bowen spent two years as a graduate assistant at the University of New Haven.

Bowen was a four-year swing player and two-year captain at Southern Connecticut State University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1999. She holds the Owls' school record for assists in a game, dishing out 15 against Albertus Magnus College during her junior season. At the end of that year, she was named Honorable-Mention all-New England Collegiate Conference.

A native of Valhalla, New York, Bowen earned a master's of business administration with a concentration in sports management from New Haven in 2001. She is engaged to be married to James Lusk Jr. in March 2003, and resides in Valhalla.

AMY VALENTINO

Assistant Coach

Amy Valentino enters her first season on the NJIT women's staff. A native of Downingtown, Pennsylva-



nia, she has given the Highlanders a strong recruiting presence in the greater Philadelphia area.

Valentino was a member of two state championship teams at Downingtown High, then played collegiately for two seasons at East Stroudsburg University. She was a

starter on the 1993-94 ESU squad which reached the round of 16 in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

She then transferred to Temple University and earned a bachelor's degree in exersice science in 1998.

Valentino was a graduate assistant at Pittsburg (Kansas) State University in 2000-01. She helped the Gorillas reach the conference playoffs, and received a master's in physical education. She currently resides in Garfield.

CAPTAIN SUE PHILLIPS

Assistant Coach

Captain Sue Phillips, a 1995 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy, enters her second season with the Highlanders. It is her first collegiate coaching position.

Phillips is an assistant professor of aerospace studies at NJIT for the Air Force ROTC Department. Along with her teaching responsibilities, she is the ROTC's admissions officer for northern New Jersey.

Collegiately, Phillips played basketball and softball for the Falcons. Upon graduation, she was commissioned and began a career in communications and information technology for the Air Force. She has been stationed at Travis Air Force Base (Fairfield, California), Wright-Patterson AFB (Dayton, Ohio) and Nellis AFB (Las Vegas, Nevada).

Phillips hails from Salem, New York. She has a bachelor's degree in humanities and a master's in information resource management. She resides in New York City with her husband Captain Kevin Magaletta.



About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction. search, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university has state-of-the-art facilities with more than

2,000,000 square feet of space located on a 45-acre campus in Newark, a Technology and Engineering Center at our campus in Mount Laurel shared with Burlington County College, and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering** (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture

schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the fore-front of many national research activities from solar physics to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, ecommerce) with the power of information and technol-

ogy management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.



Yahoo! Internet Life magazine has perennially ranked NJIT as a "most-wired" university. As such, the university is nationally recognized as a pioneer in the use of computing and information technologies.

As a public research university, NJIT is educating leaders for a technology-driven economy. The university is rethinking educational programs to emphasize marketplace skills, and redesigning its meth-



ods of delivering education. Indeed, computing and information technology underpin every facet of the NJIT mission.

NJIT received Carnegie Foundation designation as a Doctoral II university in 1994 and has ranked among the top universities by U.S. News and World Report every year since. NJIT expends more than \$50 million in a panoply of research and development partnerships with industry, government, and other universities. NJIT researchers are making important advances in a wide range of areas, including the bio-

sciences, manufacturing, microelectronics, multimedia, transportation, computer science, solar physics, environmental engineering and science, and architecture and building science.

NJIT plays an essential role in the economic and social life of the state and nation. At NJIT, the objective is to provide graduates with the requisite analytic skills as well as an ability to integrate the work of multiple disciplines to manage and lead knowledge-based and technology-dependent businesses.

The mission of a technological university requires that NJIT continue to recognize emerging trends in the economy, the sciences, and technology, and to anticipate their impact on society by developing appropriate educational and research programs.

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the **Estelle** and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center.

Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.




The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling, plus a full intramural program. The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, learn to swim, skiing, strength training

and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.

Garden State Parkway (GSP): Take exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

New Jersey Turnpike: Take exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.

Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. 

COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Divison II from Division III in 1997, the Highlanders joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 when they became members of the **Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference** (CACC).

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For the last two seasons, NJIT was the only league school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

However, six other CACC members have completed their provisional requirements and will make their NCAA debuts in 2002-03: Bloomfield College, Caldwell College, Dominican (N.Y.) College, Felician College, Georgian Court College, and Teikyo Post University.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries. The CACC champion does not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament, but Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC playoffs on an at-large basis.
