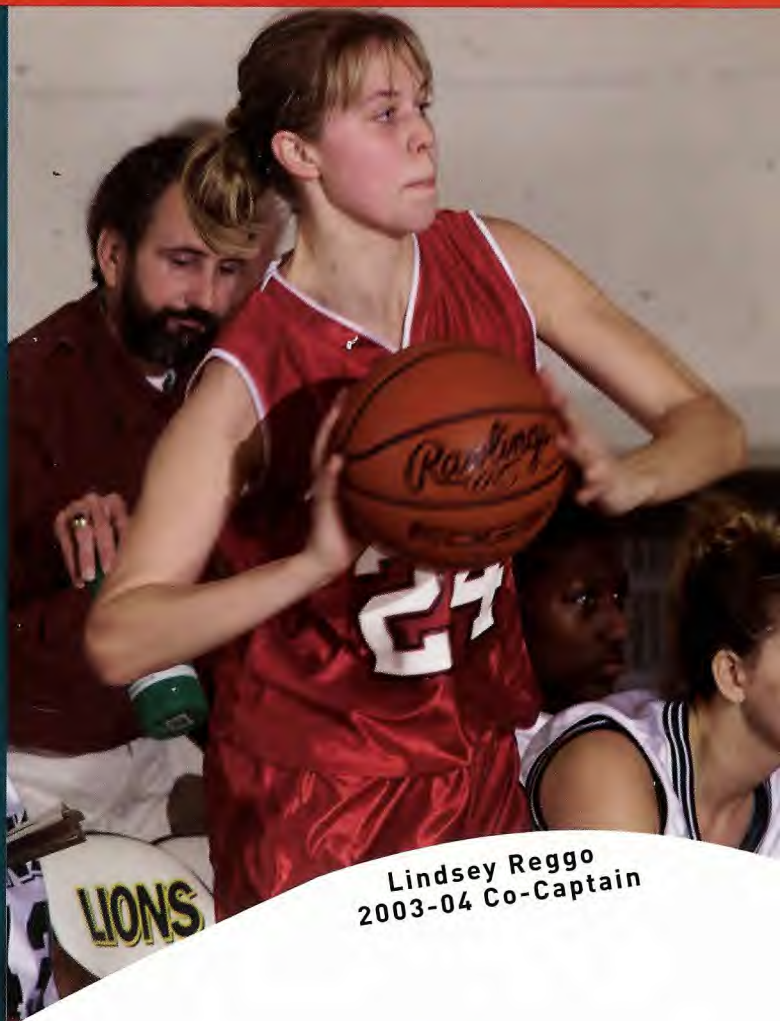

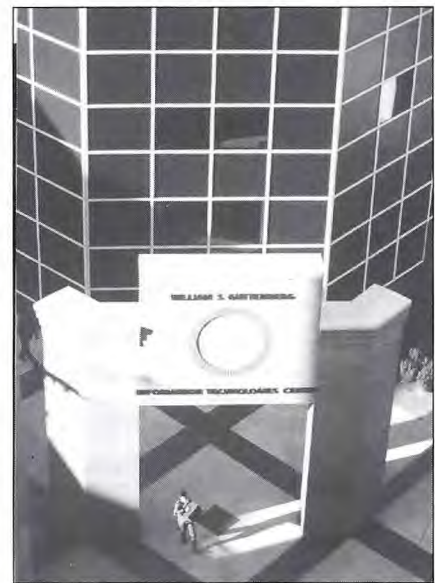

"NJIT Women's Basketball – The Best of Both Worlds"

Improvement from the previous season is a goal that virtually every basketball coach sets each October. If the New Jersey Institute of Technology women's team meets that standard, it will be a record-breaking year.

Under new head coach **Kim Bowen Lusk**, the 2002-03 Highlanders tied the school record for victories with 16. It was the most wins ever for NJIT in its six years as a member of NCAA Division II. Another winning season would be the program's third consecutively, tying another program record.

To reach their goals, NJIT must seamlessly replace graduated starters **SchrKya Massey** and **Nicole Ballou**, who combined for more than 25 of the team's 65.6 points per game last season, were the primary ball-handlers, and provided numerous intangibles. According to Lusk, this will take a team effort.

"Every player must have as their goal to improve from last year," Lusk said. "We're not placing high expectations on any one player. We expect to be well-balanced."

As a player at Southern Connecticut State University, Lusk competed against some of the best teams in the Northeast region. With this experience in mind, she has scheduled four Northeast-10 Conference opponents, including her alma mater, an NCAA Tournament team a year ago.

"The goal of our non-conference schedule is to play tough regional opponents and to get an idea of where we stand," Lusk said. "It's the best experience our players can get. When we get into conference play, we want to be able to step on the court every game knowing we can defeat our opponent."

Backcourt

NJIT will once again start in a three-guard set. Co-captain and fourth-year starter **Lindsey Reggo** (13.4 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 58 3FG in 2002-03) is already among the top 10 scorers in school history. Irish import **Aine O'Dwyer** is the leading candidate on the wing, but sophomore **Jessica Vogel** (7.0 ppg, 4.6 rpg) and freshman **Kelly Crowe** are expected to be significant parts of the playing rotation.

At point guard, sophomore **Shonte Dixon** (1.9 ppg, 1.9 rpg) and freshman **Erika Velez** are in a battle for the starting job. Lusk is torn between Dixon's knowledge of the game and year of experience and Velez's passing and defensive prowess.

"On the whole, we're a better outside shooting team than we were last year," Lusk said. "All of our guards add something to the mix and I feel confident using them at any position."

Frontcourt

The Highlanders hope to receive a breakout year from their third-year starting center, junior **Selena Kershaw (pictured)** (6.2 ppg, 6.5 rpg, 18 blocks).

"Selena looks stronger and more confident than ever before," Lusk said. "We expect her to make her presence known on both ends of the court."



At power forward, three-year incumbent and co-captain **Kate Duncan** (3.3 ppg, 6.1 rpg) will be pushed for her starting role by junior **Jackie Lupo** (4.9 ppg, 2.4 rpg). Also competing for time will be freshmen **Eti Ebewo** and **Denaya Hemingway** and transfer **Jady Alvarez**.

Sophomore **Breanna Turnbull** (4.5 ppg, 3.6 rpg) has missed much of the preseason due to injury, and hopes to be back by mid-December to help out at small forward and in the backcourt.

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch was once a prominent soccer official. He was the referee for the 1987 NAIA women's national championship game, and also worked the middle for five consecutive Kentucky state high school championships.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



DR. JOEL BLOOM

Vice-President for Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990.



In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including Physical Education and Athletics.

Dr. Bloom is also Dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls more than 525 students who are typically in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.

Prior to NJIT, Dr. Bloom spent seven years as Assistant Commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He is currently the Chair of the NASULGC Council of Chief Student Affairs Officers and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Dr. Bloom earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a Master's and Doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

LENNY KAPLAN

Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals. He assumed the duties of director of athletics shortly thereafter.



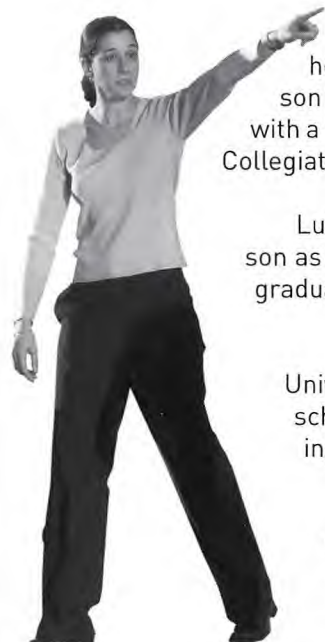
Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000. He is the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference Executive Committee Supervisor for men's basketball, and serves on the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

KIM BOWEN LUSK

Head Coach



Kim Bowen Lusk was elevated from interim women's basketball coach at NJIT to assistant athletics director and head coach in April 2003. Her promotion followed a 2002-03 season in which the Highlanders tied the school record for victories with a 16-12 record and reached the semifinals of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference Tournament.

Lusk was named interim coach in September 2002 after one season as first assistant under Sharon Manning Beverly. Prior to NJIT, she spent two years as a graduate assistant at the University of New Haven.

Lusk was a four-year swing player and two-year captain at Southern Connecticut State University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1999. She holds the Owls' school record for assists in a game, dishing out 15 against Albertus Magnus College during her junior season.

A native of Valhalla, New York, Lusk earned a master's of business administration with a concentration in sports management from New Haven in 2001. She is also NJIT's senior woman administrator. She resides in New Rochelle, New York, with her husband, Jim.



NICOLE BALLOU

Assistant Coach

Nicole Ballou joins the coaching staff directly off a successful playing career at NJIT.



A four-year starter at point guard, Ballou is the program's all-time leader in games (109), assists (396) and steals (193). She never missed a game in her collegiate career.

A two-year captain, she was named the Highlanders' Co-Most Valuable Player as a senior, leading NJIT to a CACC playoff berth.

She holds the school record with 12 assists in a game on January 15, 2002, versus Felician College.

Ballou is a graduate of Notre Dame Academy in Staten Island, New York. She received a bachelor's degree in management from NJIT in 2003, and lives in Staten Island.

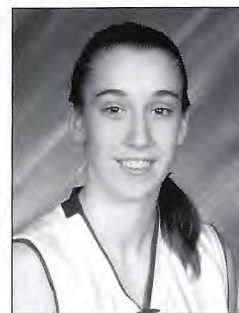

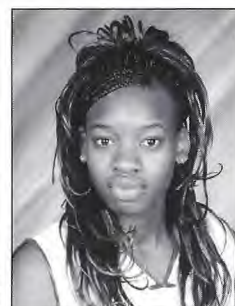

Division II at a Glance



Almost every serious sports fan is familiar with the three NCAA membership classifications: Divisions I, II and III. The public may be less familiar with what the classifications mean, especially in the case of Division II.

In brief, Division I members are required to sponsor the most sports and provide the most athletically related financial aid for student-athletes. Division III members, on the other hand, are prohibited from providing athletically related financial assistance.

So, what does it mean to be an NCAA Division II member? More than anything, it is a commitment to balance.

First, members are required to sponsor at least 10 varsity sports (at least five women's sports) and offer at least a limited amount of athletically related financial aid, although the requirement is far less than Division I's. Those are the principal nuts-and-bolts standards that separate Division II from Divisions I and III.

But other, less tangible, considerations characterize Division II membership. Student-athletes generally come from the area in which their institution is located. They are integrated with the student body. Many coaches and administrators perform other jobs or functions at their institutions, including teaching. Most Division

II student-athletes pay for school through a combination of scholarship money, grants, student loans and employment earnings. The division's philosophy emphasizes participation, and its financial aid requirement helps ensure quality competition.

National championship opportunities in Division II are comparable to those in Divisions I and III. For 2003-04, Division II national-championship competition will be offered in the following sports:

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30 graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, Newark College of Engineering (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The New Jersey School of Architecture, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The School of Management, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The Albert Dorman Honors College, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The College of Computing Sci-

ences, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
- extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$50 million today. The university conducts cutting-edge applied research through

multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

U.S. NEWS: NJIT A "TOP SCHOOL"

NJIT is again among the top-ranked universities in the nation in *U.S. News and World Report's* annual "Best Colleges" issue. NJIT's rankings place the university among the leaders in education, research, diversity, and cost-effectiveness.

Overall, NJIT ranked No. 117 of 248 national universities offering a full range of undergraduate majors, plus master's and doctoral degrees. There are nearly 600 such universities, but not all are selected to be ranked. Among the 89 public universities in the rated group, NJIT ranked 59th.

The magazine uses expert opinion about program quality and statistical data that it says are reliable indicators of the quality of a school's research, faculty and students. Among the criteria used to score schools are the rate of students who graduate, class size, the student/faculty ratio, and the class ranks and test scores of entering freshmen. The current study is based on interviews and data collected in 2002.

NJIT's ranking ties it with Howard University, SUNY-Stony Brook, the University of Oklahoma, and the University of San Francisco.

In a separate study, NJIT's engineering school's undergraduate program was rated 84th out of 115 ranked engineering schools.

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT men's and women's basketball teams play their home games at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the Estelle and "Zoom" Fleisher Athletic Center.

Entwisle, with seating for approximately 1,500 spectators, is also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's volleyball teams. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium area useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.



The basketball teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads host meets and practices at four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The NJIT baseball and men's and women's soccer teams play and practice at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility immediately adjacent to the Fleisher Center. Lubetkin, which is also used for physical education and intramurals, contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, with seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, men's lacrosse and wrestling, plus a full intramural program. The newly expanded and renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Physical education offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, swimming, skiing, strength training and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.

Each year the two universities co-sponsor a common season of theatrical productions, as well as "World Week," a joint program of honors colloquia, and a variety of other cultural and social activities.

When NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997, the Highlanders joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC). After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 when they became members of the **Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC)**.

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For its first two seasons in the league, NJIT was the only CACC school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

However, six other CACC members completed their provisional requirements in 2002, and this year, four more make their NCAA debuts: Goldey-Beacom College, Holy Family University, Nyack College, and University of the Sciences in Philadelphia.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries. The CACC champion does not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament, but Highlanders are eligible for both the NCAA and ECAC playoffs on an at-large basis.
