PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Fencing is one of the oldest sports at NJIT, and for many years under legendary coach Paul Hausser, it was among the best teams in the East. Now, under two coaches with international experience, the program is already showing much improvement. The men's team had four finalists at the MACFA Championships, set school records with six participants and two medalists at the NCAA Regionals, and had a national qualifier for the second consecutive year.

In 2003-04, the women's team was re-established as a separate entity from the men for the first time in 11 years. The Highlanders picked up the first win in program history and sent two fencers to NCAA Regionals. Both NJIT fencing programs have a limited number of partial scholarships available, and welcome fencers with all levels of experience.

The Highlanders practice and host meets in the **Fleisher Multi-Purpose Room.** This area is equipped with the latest in electrical strips and speed targets.

The teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**. These include three gymnasia, the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts center, a six-lane swimming pool, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

JANUSZ MYLNEK Head Coach

Janusz Mlynek begins his fifth season as head coach at NJIT's men's fencing team and his third guiding the rejuvenated women's team as a separate entity from the men.

Under Mlynek's tutelage, the Highlanders have shown much technical progress. He has coached 12 NCAA Regional participants, had two conference individual champions and four other finalists, and twice had a fencer invited to NCAA Nationals. Mylnek has stepped up the program's recruiting efforts, and teaches physical education class in beginner fencing at NIIT.

Mlynek is the senior coach/founder of the Polish-American Fencing School in Linden, New Jersey. His students have won over 100 medals in national competition during the past five years. In the 2003-04 season, two of his fencers came in first in the U.S. Fencing Association season rankings. Several of his students are competing at the World Cup level. That year, the USFA named Mylnek as head coach of the U.S. Junior Team for a World Cup saber competition in Europe, at which the United States won six medals and six other medal round semifinalists.

As a competitor fencer, Mlynek spent several years on Poland's National team. He was twice a silver medalist in saber and three times a finalist in epee at Poland's National Championships. More recently, he won three consecutive gold medals at the Garden State games.

Mlynek earned his Master of Arts degree from the Academy of Physical Education in Krakow, Poland, in 1991. He resides in Elizabeth with his wife Jola.





DONOVAN HOLTZ Assistant Coach

Donovan Holtz, a resident of Montclair, NJ, is an undergraduate student majoring in mechanical engineering at New Jersey Institute of Technology. An accomplished fencer, he is helping coach the NJIT men and women in his weapon, the epee.

Previously, he attended Rutgers University, where he was a successful intercollegiate fencer, competing in the epee. In one and a half years at Rutgers, he won the regional championship, held at Drew, in 2002 and then placed seventh at the NCAA Championships that same year, also at Drew.

In 2001, he placed first out of 66 competitors in competition hosted by Temple and he was fifth out of 36th fencers in the Penn State Open.

He also won the 2002 national team championship in the epee and the junior team championship in the epee.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION



New Jersey Institute of Technology, the state's public technological research university, enrolls more than 8,200 students in bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in 100 degree programs offered by six colleges: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. NJIT is renowned for expertise in architecture, applied mathematics, wireless communications and networking, solar physics, advanced engineered particulate materials, nanotechnology, neural engineering and eLearning.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included signifi-

cant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation, with state-of-the-art facilities on its 45acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.
