2003 Outlook

The New Jersey Institute of Technology men's soccer is facing a milestone year, as its last season as a member of Division II is its first under head coach **Pedro Lopes**. A former Rutgers University assistant who will lead the program's transition to Division I, Lopes understands the small steps the Highlanders must take in pursuit of excellence.

"In a new situation, you always set the ultimate goal as winning the national championship," Lopes. "But until you know what you have, that cannot become a reality. Right now our goal is to get the guys to learn to play as a team, and within a system. They are working hard and seem eager to learn."

Fans of the Highlanders can expect to see a team that will improve from game to game and week to week. As a new coach entering from outside the program, Lopes expects to mix and match many different line-ups in the early going until he becomes familiar with his personnel.

"Everyone needs to keep an open mind about where they'll play," he said. "I've told everyone that no one has a set position in the preseason; they will have to earn starting roles. Right now, the team needs to get some games under its belt, and I need to see them in game situations. Only then will I be able to figure out what works best for us."

GOALKEEPERS: Senior **Jason Manzi (pictured)** (447 min, 0-6, 3.21 GAA in 2002) was the starter for his first two seasons, and his experience,

quickness and leadership give him the inside track on regaining that role. Sophomore **René Cevallos** (168 min, 0-1, 1.61) will challenge.

DEFENDERS: Junior veterans **Adam Gross** (13 GP) and **Andrew Ma** (14 GP, 2g 1a) have impressed the staff with their sharpness. Junior **Shannon Abraham** (9 GP) and sophomore **Gideon Ki** (6 GP, 1a) will look to make

the transition from role players to regular contributors. Veteran **Mario Douglas** is back after taking a medical redshirt season in 2002. **W a l k - o n Johnathan Van Duyn**e is also a candidate.

MIDFIELDERS: This is NJIT's deepest unit, with seniors **Cherno Cham** (14 GP, 4a) and **Keith Samuel** (15 GP, 3g 5a) leading the way. Samuel was last year's team Most Valuable Player and leading scorer, while Cham and junior

Rafiqul Chowdhury (7 GP) have stood out with the quickness of their passing

games. Other strong candidates include junior **Amr Mohamed** (12 GP, 3g 1a), senior **Ranston Coke** (9 GP), and the team's two most prominent newcomers, **Abhishek Mathur** and **Craig Tonicic**. **Jorge Padilla** (1 GP) and **Randy Weston** provide depth.

FORWARDS: Seniors **Kevin Rojas-Britto** (14 GP, 2a) and **Julius Hoyes** (13 GP, 3g 2a) are returning starters. Lopes has moved junior **Oswald Fombrun** (6 GP) and his big 6-foot-3 frame up from the back line to spell the starters and provide a target. Samuel and Cham have the ability to attack from the midfield.



DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH**President**

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch was once a prominent soccer official. He was the referee for the 1987 NAIA women's national championship game, and also worked the middle for five consecutive Kentucky state high school championships.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.

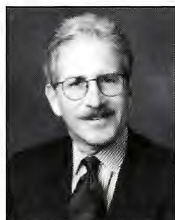
**DR. JOEL BLOOM****Vice President for Academic and Student Services**

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990. In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the University, including Physical Education and Athletics.

Dr. Bloom is also Dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls more than 525 students who are typically in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.

Prior to NJIT, Dr. Bloom spent seven years as Assistant Commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He is currently the Chair of the NASULGC Council of Chief Student Affairs Officers and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Dr. Bloom earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a Master's and Doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

**LENNY KAPLAN****Director of Athletics**

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, Lenny Kaplan was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education, recreation and intramurals. He assumed the duties of director of athletics shortly thereafter.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000. He is a member of the NCAA Division II nomination committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

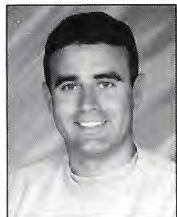


Coaching Staff

PEDRO LOPES

Head Coach

Newark native **Pedro Lopes** became the ninth men's soccer coach in NJIT history in July of 2003.



Lopes takes on his first head coaching position after spending seven of the last eight seasons on Bob

Reasso's staff at Rutgers University. In addition to serving as the recruiting coordinator for the last six years, Lopes was responsible for alumni relations, travel arrangements and academic assistance.

"It's always a challenge when you go to a new place," Lopes said. "But from speaking with [athletics director] Lenny Kaplan, I believe the future of NJIT athletics is bright. This is the place I want to be."

Lopes began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Rutgers in 1995, then spent one season with Centenary (N.J.) College before returning to the Scarlet Knights. He is also the coaching director for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club.

Lopes was a two-time NSCAA All-American as a sweeper for Reasso at Rutgers after playing midfield for his first two seasons. He was the Atlantic-10 Conference Player of the Year as a senior. In all four of his playing seasons — 1990, 1991, 1993 and 1994, the Scarlet Knights won the A-10 championship and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Rutgers was the national runner-up in 1990, and, with Lopes as captain, made another semifinal appearance in 1994. Lopes was also a member of the United States U-23 National Team in 1993 and 1994.

Prior to attending Rutgers, Lopes was a high-school All-American and New Jersey Player of the Year at pe-

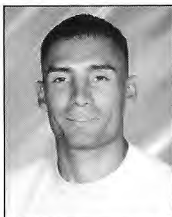
rennial national power St. Benedict's Prep in Newark. He played three seasons professionally for the North Jersey Imperials of the United Soccer League.

"My approach to achieving success at NJIT will not change from what my beliefs are," Lopes said. "I will continue to recruit the top student-athletes in the country and will demand hard work both in the classroom and on the playing field."

JAVIER VELASCO

Assistant Coach

Javier Velasco enters his first collegiate coaching position by joining the NJIT staff.



Velasco is a coach/trainer for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club, currently leading the U-16 boys' Noblemen. He was the head coach

for one season at Manville (N.J.) High School, and maintains his own soccer training Web site, hometown.aol.com/soccertraining.

After playing one season for Mercer Community College, Velasco transferred to Centenary (N.J.) College and was a member of the Cyclones' 1995 NAIA national championship team. He was named the most valuable player of the title game.

Velasco completed his collegiate career at Kean College in 1996, then embarked on a seven-year professional career which began with a season in Ecuador. He returned to New Jersey for stints with the New Jersey Stallions, the North Jersey Imperials and the Central Jersey Riptide.

Velasco completed his bachelor's degree in international business at Kean in 2000. A two-time all-state selection at North Brunswick High, he currently resides in South Plainfield.

NJIT TO ELEVATE MEN'S SOCCER TO DIVISION I

Highlanders Accepted By Atlantic Soccer Conference

NEWARK, N.J. (Aug. 11, 2003) –The NCAA has accepted the application of New Jersey Institute of Technology to reclassify its men's soccer program to Division I, NJIT director of athletics **Lenny Kaplan** announced today. The Highlanders have also been approved for membership in the Atlantic Soccer Conference (ASC).



NJIT will play in its final season as a member of the Division II Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference in 2003. The Highlanders

must meet Division I scheduling requirements the following season, and expect to be a full Division I member for 2005.

"This is a step toward improving the level of national visibility of our entire athletics program," Kaplan said. "One benefit of athletics to universities is to help create a higher profile and more visibility and marketability."

Upgrading athletics has been a priority for **Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch** since he was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002. Last fall, Altenkirch, Kaplan, and **Dr. Joel Bloom**, Vice President for Academic and Student Services, had several discussions about how best to use the sports programs to improve the University's visibility and awareness. When Kaplan mentioned that a lower-division school is allowed to elevate one sport in each gender to Division I, the trio accepted the idea as the best option.

"The NCAA does not allow basketball to be upgraded alone," Kaplan said. "We have three other sports, men's and women's fencing and men's volleyball, which are classified as 'national collegiate' sports, and as such, already face Division I opponents. After an evaluation of our remaining sports on facilities, program history, conference availability, and other factors, men's soccer was an easy choice."

Altenkirch presented the proposal to NJIT's Board of Trustees, and on February 15, it was unanimously approved. A few months later, Kaplan filled the program's vacant head coaching position with Rutgers University assistant **Pedro Lopes**.

"After spending the last six years as an assistant at a top Division I program, I felt that it was very important to continue my coaching career in Division I," said Lopes, the ninth head coach in Highlander history. "NJIT's elevation of its soccer program to that level, and its joining a strong conference in the Atlantic Soccer Conference, shows every prospective student-athlete that NJIT's wants all of its student-athletes to experience college academics and athletics at the highest level."

The ASC was established in 2000 with nine schools offering Division I men's soccer while holding various NCAA classifications. On May 20, the league accepted NJIT as its seventh current member, joining Adelphi University, Florida International University, Hartwick College, Howard University, Oneonta State University, and Philadelphia University. In 2002, the ASC had an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time.

"We are very excited with the addition of NJIT to the Atlantic Soccer Con-

ference," said ASC President **Tom Shirley**. "We feel like we have one of the top NCAA Division I men's soccer conferences in the country, and with this addition, it further illustrates our commitment to excellence."

Obtaining approval for reclassification of one sport is a two-year process. Last month, Kaplan submitted an application and strategic plan. For the 2003 season, all players must meet the Division I standards for satisfactory academic progress and continuing athletic eligibility. In 2004, NJIT must play a minimum of 11 Division-I opponents. Updates to the strategic plan also must be submitted each of the next two summers.

The NJIT men's soccer program has made 17 postseason appearances in its history, including an NAIA national championship in 1960, when it was known as Newark College of Engineering. Seventeen Highlanders have been named All-Americans. In 51 seasons, the team has 372 victories and a winning percentage of .560.

NJIT Men's Soccer Division I Timeline

November 2002 – President Robert A. Altenkirch, Vice President Joel Bloom and Athletics Director Lenny Kaplan hold preliminary discussions regarding improving the status and image of the university through athletics.

January 2003 – Based on those discussions, Altenkirch presents a proposal to the Board of Trustees to reclassify the men's soccer program to NCAA Division I.

February 15, 2003 – Board of Trustees unanimously approves proposal.

May 20, 2003 – Atlantic Soccer Conference accepts NJIT as a provisional member.

June 1, 2003 – Pedro Lopes named ninth head men's soccer coach in NJIT history.

June 30, 2003 – Official application and strategic plan for reclassification submitted to NCAA.

September 6, 2003 – NJIT will travel to Adelphi University to play its first game against a Division-I opponent since hosting both Howard University and Manhattan College in 1992.

NJIT and Rutgers students have library privileges at both campuses. NJIT students may also enrich their educational experience by enrolling in Rutgers-Newark courses and in full degree programs in disciplines not offered at NJIT, such as art, music, geology and psychology.

Each year the two universities co-sponsor a common season of theatrical productions, as well as "World Week," a joint program of honors colloquia, and a variety of other cultural and social activities.

New Jersey/New York Metropolitan Region

The NJIT campus is in one of the nation's most exciting cultural and business regions. Advantages include:

- Minutes from New Jersey Performing Arts Center, Liberty Science Center, Meadowlands Sports Complex, Manhattan and all of its attractions, Newport Center Mall, and Secaucus Outlet Center.

About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a **fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service**, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30 graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering (NCE)** has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer

technology into the design curriculum.

The **College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA)**, established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The **Albert Dorman Honors College**, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The **College of Computing Sciences**, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes

and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
- extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$50 million today. The university conducts cutting-edge applied research through

multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

U.S. News: NJIT A "Top School"

NJIT is again among the top-ranked universities in the nation in U.S. News and World Report's annual "Best Colleges" issue. NJIT's rankings place the university among the leaders in education, research, diversity, and cost-effectiveness.

Overall, NJIT ranked No. 117 of 248 national universities offering a full range of undergraduate majors, plus master's and doctoral degrees. There are nearly 600 such universities, but not all are selected to be ranked. Among the 89 public universities in the rated group, NJIT ranked 59th.

The magazine uses expert opinion about program quality and statistical data that it says are reliable indicators of the quality of a school's research, faculty and students. Among the criteria used to score schools are the rate of students who graduate, class size, the student/faculty ratio, and the class ranks and test scores of entering freshmen. The current study is based on interviews and data collected in 2002.

NJIT's ranking ties it with Howard University, SUNY-Stony Brook, the University of Oklahoma, and the University of San Francisco.

In a separate study, NJIT's engineering school's undergraduate program was rated 84th out of 115 ranked engineering schools.

Athletics Facilities

The NJIT soccer teams play their home games at **Lubetkin Field**, a lighted, natural-grass campus facility adjacent to the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**.



The Fleisher fitness center features computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track.

The main facility in the Fleisher Center. Entwisle seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

The women's soccer team also has access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a free-weight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building.

The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Lubetkin, which is also home to the Highlanders' baseball team, contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and has seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators. The field is also used for physical education and intramurals.

The NJIT men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home games in **Entwisle Gymnasium**,

The Newark College of Engineering (NCE) soccer team became national champions on November 26, 1960. Not before and not since has any NCE/NJIT athletic team accomplished this feat.

The championship game of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) tournament was halted by darkness after 16 minutes, 45 seconds, of overtime play and NCE tied with Elizabethtown College, 2-2. The teams were declared co-national champions by the NAIA, and NCE had completed its first (and still only) undefeated season, 12-0-1.

Under the leadership of sixth-year head coach **Mal Simon**, the Highlanders swept through the 1960 regular season with a 10-0 record, outscoring their opponents by a combined 41-9, including four shutouts. They then won the NAIA Area #3 championship and advanced to the national semifinals with a 2-1 victory against Pratt Institute.

NCE needed two overtimes to defeat Fitchburg State in the semis, and set up the championship meeting with Elizabethtown. The match, played at Slippery Rock State University, proceeded to the fourth extra period before being stopped. Sophomore **Andy Handwerker** and senior **Gary Freimuth** scored the Highlander goals.

The team's balanced scoring attack was led by freshman **John Savicky** with nine goals. Handwerker had eight tallies, followed by senior **Anatole Kulyk** and sophomore **Ed Cruz** with six each.

After the season, halfback **Werner Zorn** was named NCE's first All-American. Only a junior, Zorn repeated the honor in 1961. Zorn, Savicky and Handwerker were named all-area, while sophomore **Alex Khowaylo** was selected the outstanding NAIA goalkeeper.

Many members of the 1960 team were still a part of the Highlanders the following year, when NCE again com-

pleted the regular season undefeated. The Highlanders returned to the national championship game, but lost to Howard University, 3-2, on a goal with 18 seconds remaining in regulation. From 1960 to 1962, NCE amassed a three-year record of 26-2-1 (.914).

(Notes: NCE changed affiliation from the NAIA to NCAA Division III in 1974. The university changed its name to NJIT in 1975. The Highlanders reclassified to Division II in 1997.)

Garden State Parkway (GSP): Take exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

New Jersey Turnpike: Take exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.

Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. When NJIT reclassified its athletics programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997, it joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC).

After three years of NYCAC play, the Highlanders began a new era in the fall of 2000 as members of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC).

The CACC is in a transitional phase. For its first two seasons in the league, NJIT was the only CACC school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Five men's soccer-playing institutions completed their provisional requirements in the fall of 2002, and this year, three more make their NCAA debuts: Goldey-Beacom College, Holy Family University, and Nyack College.

The CACC has allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT is centrally located in the conference, and four other member schools are in New Jersey, allowing the opportunity to foster local rivalries.
