2004 Outlook

The New Jersey Institute of Technology men's soccer program takes the next step in its reclassification to NCAA Division I this fall when, for the first time, it plays a full Division I schedule. The Highlanders have one more year of provisional membership before attaining full Division I status in 2005, but both school administrators and second-year head coach **Pedro Lopes** are hard at work on the transition.

Of the many ways the university has increased its support of athletics, the most visible has been the recent renovation of Lubetkin Field, the Highlanders' on-campus soccer home. The pitch sports a brand new artificial surface and new landscaping. Not only will the field not be damaged by bad weather and regular usage, but Lopes expects it to be a boon to recruiting.

Lopes's first full recruiting season, which concluded before the renovations were complete, yielded 16 new players for the 2004 Highlanders, including 11 freshmen. He hopes they will be the cornerstone for NJIT's future Division-I success.

"It's always a challenge to move divisions," Lopes said. "With the increased support from the school is going to come an increased expectation of results. However, I'd be a fool to think we can make that happen right away. It's a process, and this class will do a great job of starting that process."

As part of the Division-I enhancements, assistant coach **Javier Velasco** was promoted and became the first full-time assistant in program history. The 2004 challenge for Lopes and Velasco will be to balance the desire to win with a realistic view of the team's competitive situation.

"This year, playing a full Division-I schedule will challenge us both mentally and physically. There will be no easy games, but we will also gain valuable playing experience which will only make us stronger for next year. I'm sure that our team will rise to the challenge of the competitive nature of college athletics at its highest level."

"By the same token, I hate to lose. At the end of the year we'll look at our record as one factor in our evaluation. But the little things between the lines will be the basis of if we get better, more so than a certain win total."

GOALKEEPERS

With the graduation of 2003 starter Jason Manzi, this position is wide open. Junior **René Cevallos** (pictured) (90 min, 5.00 GAA in 2003), the No. 2 man last year, will compete with three incoming freshmen, **Dalton Carofilis**, **Collin Cunning**, and **Ryan Sutherland**.

DEFENDERS

Senior co-captains **Mario Douglas** (13 GP, 0g 1a) and **Andrew Ma** (16 GP, 0g 1a) form the heart of NJIT's back line. Vying for the other two spots in Lopes's "flat four" formation will be senior **Adam Gross**, junior **Sean Pyne**, and freshmen **Daniel Bautista**, **Mina Bestawros** and **Andrew Suozzo**.



Junior **René Cevallos** is one of just six returnees for the Highlanders.

MIDFIELDERS

Senior **Rafiqul Chowdhury** and sophomore **Abhishek Mathur** are two of only six returnees for the Highlanders, and are expected to man the wings. Chowdhury will look to create opportunities, while Mathur can add to the attack with well-timed runs. In between, the frontrunners are transfer **Dario Brito** and freshman **Robert Herrera**, who will be asked to assume leadership roles right away. Transfer **Victor Vides** also brings leadership skills, while freshman

Michael Correa has impressed with his creativity with the ball. Freshman **Kevin Connor** may also see time.

FORWARDS

Lopes is excited about his pair of rookies that will likely lead the offensive attack in **André Dionisio** and **Eddie Romero**.

"Both guys have a wealth of experience at a high level of competition," Lopes said. "They won't play like first-year players."

NJIT'S TRANSITION TO DIVISION I CONTINUES

Highlanders To Begin Atlantic Soccer Conference Play This Fall

NEWARK, N.J. (Aug. 18, 2004) – Some of the changes have been visible and others subtle as the New Jersey Institute of Technology men's soccer program continues its march to NCAA Division I.

Many positive things have happened for the program in the year since the NCAA accepted NJIT's application for reclassification. The scholarship and operating budgets have been enhanced, and second-year head coach **Pedro Lopes** took advantage by bringing 16 new players to the program, including 11 freshmen. Assistant coach **Javier Velasco** was promoted to full-time, and a part-time assistant, **Oren Daniel**, was added. More prominently, SprinTurf artificial grass was installed on the athletic field this summer (see page 20).

Obtaining approval for reclassification of one sport is a two-year process. Last summer, athletics director **Lenny Kaplan** had to submit a strategic plan with the application. An update to the plan was submitted in June, and another must be sent next summer.

This season, the program must be in full compliance with all Division I rules and by-laws, including the scheduling of at least 11 Division I opponents. (Lopes's 16-game slate contains only D-I schools). NJIT expects to be a full Division I member in 2005.

Adding to the excitement is NJIT's membership in the Atlantic Soccer Conference (see page 36). The ASC approved NJIT on a provisional basis a year ago. In 2004, the Highlanders can be listed in the league standings and are eligible for individual weekly and postseason awards.

"Division I men's soccer is a step toward improving the level of national visibility of our entire athletics program," Kaplan said. "One benefit of athletics to universities is to help create a higher profile and more visibility and marketability."

Upgrading athletics has been a priority for **Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch** since he was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002. That fall, Altenkirch, Kaplan, and **Dr. Joel Bloom**, Vice President for Academic and Student Services, had several discussions about how best to use the sports programs to improve awareness of the University. When Kaplan mentioned that a Division II or III school is allowed to elevate one sport in each gender to Division I, the trio accepted the idea as the best option.

"The NCAA does not allow a single-sport reclassification for basketball," Kaplan said. "We have three other sports, men's and women's fencing and men's volleyball,

which are classified as 'national collegiate' sports, and as such, already face Division I opponents. After an evaluation of our remaining sports on facilities, program history, conference availability, and other factors, men's soccer was an easy choice."

Altenkirch presented the proposal to NJIT's Board of Trustees, and on February 15, 2003, it was unanimously approved. A few months later, Kaplan filled the program's vacant head coaching position with Lopes, then a Rutgers University assistant.

"After spending the last six years as an assistant at a top Division I program, I felt that it was very important to continue my coaching career in Division I," said Lopes. "NJIT's elevation of its soccer program to that level, and its joining a strong conference in the Atlantic Soccer Conference, shows every prospective student-athlete that NJIT's wants all of its student-athletes to experience college academics and athletics at the highest level."

The NJIT men's soccer program has made 17 postseason appearances in its history, including an NAIA national championship in 1960, when it was known as Newark College of Engineering. Seventeen Highlanders have been named All-Americans. In 52 seasons, the team has 375 victories and a winning percentage of .555.

NJIT Men's Soccer Division I Timeline

November 2002 – President Robert A. Altenkirch, Vice President Joel Bloom and Athletics Director Lenny Kaplan hold preliminary discussions regarding improving the status and image of the university through athletics.

January 2003 – Based on those discussions, Altenkirch presents a proposal to the Board of Trustees to reclassify the men's soccer program to NCAA Division I.

February 15, 2003 – Board of Trustees unanimously approves proposal.

May 20, 2003 – Atlantic Soccer Conference accepts NJIT as a provisional member.

June 1, 2003 – Pedro Lopes named ninth head men's soccer coach in NJIT history.

June 30, 2003 – Official application and strategic plan for reclassification submitted to NCAA.

August 11, 2003 – Application accepted by NCAA.
September 6, 2003 – NJIT loses, 6-0, at Adelphi University in its first game against a Division-I opponent since 1992, when it hosted both Howard University and Manhattan College.

June 2004 – Update to strategic plan submitted.

July 23, 2004 – NCAA accepts the update and advances NJIT to year two of the reclassification process.

August 2004 – Installation of artificial grass on the Highlanders' on-campus home, Lubetkin Field, is completed.

September 1, 2004 – NJIT will host Monmouth University in the opening game of its first-ever Division I season.

Administration

DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH *President*

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch, formerly vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU), joined NJIT as the university's seventh president in July 2002. During his tenure as MSU vice president for research, science and engineering, expenditures as reported to National Science Foundation (NSF) increased dramatically—75 percent from 1997 to 2001.

Prior to his appointment as vice president at MSU, Altenkirch served as professor of mechanical and materials engineering and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture at Washington State University. From 1988 to 1995, he was professor of mechanical engineering and dean of the College of Engineering at MSU. He also served as professor and chair of mechanical engineering at the University of Kentucky.



In addition to the research program, his responsibilities encompassed congressional relations, intellectual property management and economic development. While dean of engineering at MSU, he led the effort to secure National Science Foundation funding for the establishment of the MSU NSF Engineering Research Center for Computational Field Simulation in 1990. Additionally, the Center was instrumental in helping the State of Mississippi attract a \$1 billion Nissan manufacturing plant.

Altenkirch holds a PhD from Purdue University, an MS from the University of California, Berkeley, and a BSME from Purdue, all in mechanical engineering. He is the author of over 50 publications and nearly 100 presentations in combustion and heat transfer and served as principal investigator for ten Space Shuttle experiments investigating the spread of fire in reduced gravity. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

DR. WILLIAM N. ANDERSON *Acting Vice President for Academic and Student Services*

Dr. William N. Anderson was appointed acting Vice President for Academic and Student Services effective April 1, 2004. In this position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including Physical Education and Athletics.

Anderson was initially hired at NJIT in 1987 as Dean of Enrollment Planning. In 1990, he was promoted to Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs and has served as Associate Vice President for Enrollment Services since 2000.

Prior to joining NJIT, Anderson held admissions/marketing positions at Marist College and Ohio Dominican College.

Anderson owns a BA degree in English from Marist, Master's degrees in student personnel services from Indiana State University and in computer science from Marist, and MBA and PhD degrees from Rutgers University.



LENNY KAPLAN *Director of Athletics*

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, **Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to head NJIT's division of physical education and athletics.



Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director with the Jaspers from 1991-2000.

Kaplan is the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference Executive Committee Supervisor for men's basketball, and serves on the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.


Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

PEDRO LOPEZ

Head Coach

Newark native **Pedro Lopes** became the ninth men's soccer coach in NJIT history in July of 2003. He took on his first head coaching position after spending seven of the previous eight seasons on Bob Reasso's staff at Rutgers University.

Lopes began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Rutgers in 1995, then spent one season with Centenary (N.J.) College before returning to the Scarlet Knights. He is also the coaching director for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club.

Lopes was a two-time NSCAA All-American as a sweeper for Reasso at Rutgers after playing midfield for his first two seasons. He was the Atlantic-10 Conference Player of the Year as a senior. In all four of his playing seasons — 1990, 1991, 1993 and 1994, the Scarlet Knights won the A-10 championship and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Rutgers was the national runner-up in 1990, and, with Lopes as captain, made another semifinal appearance in 1994. Lopes was also a member of the United States U-23 National Team in 1993 and 1994.

Prior to attending Rutgers, Lopes was a high-school All-American and New Jersey Player of the Year at perennial national power St. Benedict's Prep in Newark. He played three seasons professionally for the North Jersey Imperials of the United Soccer League.

JAVIER VELASCO

Assistant Coach

Javier Velasco entered his first collegiate coaching position by joining Pedro Lopes at NJIT in 2003. He was recently promoted to a full-time position at the university.



Velasco is also a coach/trainer for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club, currently leading the U-17 boys' Noblemen.

Velasco was a member of Centenary (N.J.) College's 1995 NAIA national championship team. He was named the most valuable player of the title game.

After playing at Kean College in 1996, Velasco embarked on a seven-year professional career which began in his native Ecuador. He returned to New Jersey for stints with the New Jersey Stallions, the North Jersey Imperials and the Central Jersey Riptide.

He once won a U-16 national title in Ecuador, representing the state of Manabi.

Velasco completed his bachelor's degree in international business at Kean in 2000. A two-time All-State selection at North Brunswick High, he currently resides in South Plainfield.

OREN DANIEL

Assistant Coach

Oren Daniel brings seven years of club coaching experience to the NJIT staff.



Daniel received a BS degree in management science and information systems from Rutgers University in 1996. He then played five years of professional soccer, including one apiece with the New Jersey Stallions and the South Jersey Barons. He also played professionally in Slovakia and Israel. He owns a United States Soccer Federation 'C' coaching license.

A native of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Daniel is a claims division administrator for AEGIS Insurance Services. He resides in Hoboken.

About NJIT – Campus Center

NJIT's **Campus Center**, opened in September 2004, is the final phase of a three-year, \$83.5-million campus makeover. It is designed to be the focal point of a vibrant campus life. The center features a soaring, two-story circular dining hall, sheathed in gleaming, double-pane, energy-conserving glass.

The construction program encompasses two tall multi-story buildings – the East Building, housing the Albert Dorman Honors College, the Department of Biomedical Engineering, and administrative offices, and the center itself, featuring dining facilities, student offices and lounges, game rooms, campus store and ballroom. The two buildings are connected by



a sky bridge, and a European-style piazza featuring a 55-foot clock tower.



In an effort to improve communication and socialization on the 45-acre urban campus, the architects scaled the complex to create the feel of an outdoor room and give more spatial definition to the campus. "To promote socializing, we wanted to encourage people to move through spaces, not around them," said **Thomas Levering**, associate partner at the architectural firm.

The new round campus dining hall adds height and verve plus doubles the dining space. Its smoky gray glass provides a strong presence on the campus green. A 28,000 square-foot, rooftop grass terrace crowns it. Paths around it reroute traffic to the center. The clock tower stands adjacent to one entrance to the center. The donated tower features a carillon that will chime hourly.

The construction represents a major portion of more than a \$100 million facilities improvement plan. Completed are additional residence space and an additional building for the business incubator program. Upgrades in the works include two of NJIT's oldest buildings, Cullimore and Eberhardt halls, located adjacent to the complex.

"A good-looking center tells a visual story," said Levering. "A cen-

ter with the right stuff says life outside the classroom is as important as life within it."

About NJIT

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30

graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT's Six Colleges

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, Newark College of Engineering (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The New Jersey School of Architecture, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The School of Management, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

ment of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education.
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
- extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$75 million today. The university conducts cut-

ting-edge applied research through multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

The NJIT soccer teams play their home games at **Lubetkin Field** (see page 20), a lighted campus facility, with a newly-installed SprinTurf surface, adjacent to the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Lubetkin, contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and has bleacher seating for approximately 1,000 spectators. Lubetkin is also used for club sports and intramural events, as well as by the NJIT baseball team for practice.

The soccer teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a free-weight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio.



The NJIT men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home games in **Entwistle Gymnasium**, the main facility in the Fleisher Center. Entwistle seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramurals, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building. The newly-renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium in downtown Newark, the facility of the Newark Bears of the Atlantic League, became the home of the Highlanders baseball squad in 2004.

NJIT offers several club sports, including cricket, judo, men's lacrosse, and track and field, plus a full intramural program.

Each NJIT student must pass two physical education classes as a graduation requirement. Offerings include aerobics, archery, bowling, dance, fencing, golf, karate, swimming, skiing, strength training and conditioning, volleyball and water safety.

Lubetkin Field Resurfacing

NJIT SOCCER FIELD RECEIVES ARTIFICIAL GRASS

SprinTurf, New Landscaping Highlight Lubetkin Renovations

NEWARK, N.J. (August 27, 2004) – With the soccer seasons set to begin for New Jersey Institute of Technology, the men's and women's Highlanders were not the only squads hard at work on Lubetkin Field. A team of workers has spent the week putting the finishing touches on summer-long renovations of NJIT's on-campus home.



The highlight of the project was the replacement of Lubetkin's natural grass with SprinTurf, an artificial surface. SprinTurf is the only artificial grass on the market that does not use sand in its infill. The 100-percent rubber infill feels and reacts more like natural grass and allows the surface to last longer, without changing characteristics, than those with sand-based infills.

"We desperately needed a new soccer facility," said NJIT director of athletics **Lenny Kaplan**.

"The old natural grass surface gave us limited use, and was unable to take the wear and tear of practices and an increasing intramural and club sport program. The new artificial grass facility can be in use 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and still be in top shape."

The first NJIT varsity event on the new pitch will take place on August 29, when the women's soccer team meets St. Anselm College at noon. On September 1, the men's soccer team plays host to Monmouth College at 6:30 p.m. in its first-ever game as a member of NCAA Division I.

"The decision to put in the field coincided with the plan to elevate the men's soccer program to Division I," Kaplan said. "It also fits in nicely with the ongoing campus beautification project."

Among other enhancements to Lubetkin was the installation of a running track around the soccer field. When weather permits, the track's surface will be rubberized. The addition of pavers improved wheelchair accessibility to the spectator area, and the perimeter was beautified with shrubbery.

"One of the best recruiting tools in college athletics is a facility, and now ours creates excitement," said second-year NJIT men's soccer coach **Pedro Lopes**. "Any athlete that can move from high school to play on a beautiful facility with a beautiful surface in the middle of campus has to get excited. President **(Robert A.) Altenkirch**, Lenny, and everyone behind this project did a great job of speeding up the process to get it done in time for this season."

1960 National Champions

The Newark College of Engineering (NCE) soccer team became national champions on November 26, 1960. Not before and not since has any NCE/NJIT athletic team accomplished this feat.

The championship game of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) tournament was halted by darkness after 16 minutes, 45 seconds, of overtime play and NCE tied with Elizabethtown College, 2-2. The teams were declared co-national champions by the NAIA, and NCE had completed its first (and still only) undefeated season, 12-0-1.

Under the leadership of sixth-year head coach **Mal Simon**, the Highlanders swept through the 1960 regular season with a 10-0 record, outscoring their opponents by a combined 41-9, including four shutouts. They then won the NAIA Area #3 championship and advanced to the national semifinals with a 2-1 victory against Pratt Institute.

NCE needed two overtimes to defeat Fitchburg State in the semis, and set up the championship meeting with Elizabethtown. The match, played at Slippery Rock State University, proceeded to the fourth extra period before being stopped. Sophomore **Andy Handwerker** and senior **Gary Freimuth** scored the Highlander goals.

After the season, halfback **Werner Zorn** was named NCE's first All-American. Only a junior, Zorn repeated the honor in 1961. Zorn, Savicky and Handwerker were named all-area, while sophomore **Alex Khowaylo** was selected the outstanding NAIA goalkeeper.

Many members of the 1960 team were still a part of the Highlanders the following year, when NCE again completed the regular season undefeated. The Highlanders returned to the national championship game, but lost to Howard University, 3-2, on a goal with 18 seconds remaining in regulation. From 1960 to 1962, NCE amassed a three-year record of 26-2-1 (.914).

Notes: NCE changed affiliation from the NAIA to NCAA Division III in 1974. The university changed its name to NJIT in 1975. The Highlanders reclassified to Division II in 1997 and to Division I (provisionally) in 2004.

Directions to NJIT

By Car

Garden State Parkway (GSP): Take Exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

New Jersey Turnpike: Take Exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.

Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 1 & 9 North & South: Take exit marked Newark, Route 21 (McCarten Highway). Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. (There are clear signs for Broad Street) Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 78: Take Route 78 to the Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions.


Route 22: Take Route 22 to Route 21 North. Follow directions for Route 21 North.



Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference

The NJIT men's soccer team was a member of the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) from 2000-03. Seven of the university's other 14 varsity sports still compete in the CACC.



For its first two seasons in the league, NJIT was the only CACC

school with full NCAA membership. The others were in a provisional period while switching affiliation from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. However, five other men's soccer-playing members completed their provisional requirements in 2002, three more did so in 2003, and this season, Wilmington (Del.) College culminates the transition by making its NCAA debut. As a conference, the CACC was voted into active status by the NCAA Membership Committee in July 2004.

The CACC allowed the Highlanders to save tremendously on travel time and costs. NJIT was centrally located in the conference, and three other member schools were in northern New Jersey, creating the opportunity for heated local rivalries.

NJIT reclassified its athletic programs to NCAA Division II from Division III in 1997. It was a member of the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference from 1997-2000.

Atlantic Soccer Conference



One of the major factors that made reclassifying to NCAA Division I feasible for the NJIT men's soccer program was the existence of the **Atlantic Soccer Conference** (ASC).

The ASC was established in 2000 with nine schools offering Division-I men's soccer while holding various NCAA classifications. The founding members were: Adelphi University, University at Albany, Binghamton University, Florida International University, Hartwick College, Howard University, Oneonta State University, Philadelphia University, and the University at Stony Brook.

Following the ASC's first season in 2000, Albany and Stony Brook accepted invitations to move their entire athletic programs to the America East Conference. Binghamton did the same the following year. On May 20, 2003, NJIT was accepted as the seventh current member of the ASC effective with the 2004 season.

In 2002, the ASC received an automatic qualifier to the NCAA College Cup for the first time. Florida International has won three of the four previous ASC championships.

NJIT, which is playing a full Division-I schedule for the first time, is in the second year of a two-year provisional membership in Division I. The Highlanders expect to earn full D-I membership, including eligibility for the College Cup, in 2005. The team played the last four seasons in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference.
