WHY THE HIGHLANDERS?

The area on which the NJIT campus sits, now known as University Heights, was formerly called the Newark Highlands. The mailing address of the University used to be on High Street, until the road was re-named Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

ON THE COVER

The adventure continues for New Jersey Institute of Technology men's soccer, as the Highlanders prepare to write the 2005 chapter in the program's evolution.

For the first time, NJIT is a full NCAA Division I member, eligible to compete for the Atlantic Soccer Conference title and the accompanying automatic College Cup berth. In the previous two years, the Highlanders were provisional members of Division I, with 2004 marking the program's first full Division I schedule.

As a veteran of more than a decade of soccer at Rutgers-four as a player and seven as an assistant coach-Highlanders head coach Pedro Lopes knew what to expect from his opponents last year. In 2004, the new level proved difficult at times for the players, but the experience taught valuable lessons.

"Last year we were thrown into the lion's den," said Lopes, who marks his third year at the helm in 2005. "Our players competed hard, but lacking Division I experience showed with our young players. As the season progressed, we were able to adjust and compete. I am extremely proud of last year's team and thank our departing seniors, Mario Douglas, Andrew Ma, Adam Gross, Victor Vides and Rafiqul Chowdhury for leading our young players into Division I."

Lopes remains focused. "Now that we are fully a Division I member and are allowed to compete for postseason play, my expectations remain as high as ever," he said. "I will challenge our returning players and incoming players to play like champions."

This year's Highlanders will be infused with new talent and even a bit of quality experience from a couple of newcomers. The recruits will join returnees who gained valuable experience in the lion's den of Division I last season.

"We will continue to be a young team, but our staff did an excellent job in bringing in a stellar recruiting class," commented Lopes. "We will continue to go through our growing pains, but the foundation to succeed is in place."

GOALKEEPERS

A year ago, then-freshmen Collin Cunning and Ryan Sutherland divided the time in goal evenly. They return, joined by a third sophomore, transfer Josh Osit, who played last season at UMBC, as roles will be determined after preseason.

BACKS

Mario Douglas, Andrew Ma and Adam Gross graduated from last year's back line, clearing the way for new faces in 2005. "Defensively, we will need to learn our lessons quickly," Lopes warns.

Sophomore Andrew Suozzo saw action in 12 games as a freshman. Danny Bautista, injured early last preseason, should make his delayed collegiate debut after missing all of 2004. He is a sound technical player, who lends composure to the defense.

Adding the crucial element of experience to the Highlanders is Pablo Ponce, a native of Bolivia who played in three seasons at Rutgers and will complete his college eligibility as an NJIT graduate student.

Lopes is familiar with Ponce, having recruited him twice, first to Rutgers, and now to NJIT. Said the coach: "We will count on him to help our newcomers understand the commitment needed to be successful at the Division I level."

Sophomore Victor Bertini, a University of Buffalo transfer, is another important newcomer. Rookies Rafael Barrera and Scott Rietze will aim to start from the outset.

Barrera, from Red Oak, Texas, played for the second-ranked club team in North Texas. "He has great instincts to win the ball before the attacker receives it," said Lopes.

Rietze, one of two newcomers from Ontario, Canada (midfielder Kayo Emojong is the other), was a standout in the Toronto Lynx defense that allowed Y League foes to score a total of two goals in 13 contests.

MIDFIELD

Attacking midfielder Victor Vides is gone, leaving sophomore captain Bobby Herrera (1 goal, 1 assist in 2004) as a top returnee.

Thiago Caffaro, a native of Sao Paolo, Brazil, who played two seasons at Missouri Valley College, should fill the defensive midfield role. "Thiago is an intelligent, experienced player, who brings great tenacity and composure to a key position," Lopes commented.

Graduate student Jason Williams joined the Highlanders last spring and showed promising athleticism. Others likely to be in the mix include: freshmen Ekayproit "Kayo" Emojong, Dylan Broadley, Jeffrey Clay Smith, Greg Spaulding, Osvaldo Perez and Thomas Dores. Looking ahead to putting the group on the field, Lopes said: "This is an exciting group of young players. They all have the right tools to step in and make a difference."

FORWARDS

Sophomore captain Eddie Romero, the leading scorer a year ago (3 g, 1 a), enjoyed a fruitful offseason. The Laurel, Delaware, resident was called up to training camp with the U20 national team of Honduras, where his father, Edgardo Moradel, was a 1980 Olympian and then a professional player.

Romero did not accompany the Honduran team to the U20 World Championships in Holland, but his time in training will pay dividends for him and the Highlanders, according to Lopes. "Eddie experienced great competition," said the coach. "Most important, he saw what it takes to play at the highest level."

Andre Dionisio, who played on four state champion teams at St. Benedict's Prep in Newark, was set to challenge for a starting role with NJIT in 2004 but was sidetracked by a preseason ankle injury. Dionisio, back in the hunt for 2005, combines power with touch and is also capable of setting up others to score.

Returnees Sean Pyne (1 g), Michael Correa, Abhishek Mathur, Rene Cevallos and Jodha Kandola are back to fight for playing time in 2005.

Joining them up front will be freshmen Fernando Londono and Kevin Blanco, both of whom could push for starting jobs. "If they grow quickly, we will have great competition for our attacking positions," Lopes predicted.

New Jersey Institute of Technology men's soccer arrives in 2005 as a full member of NCAA Division I, eligible for postseason championship consideration at the highest level of the college game.

Having obtained full Division I status, men's soccer is at the vanguard of NJIT's overall athletic reclassification to NCAA Division I.

The men's soccer Highlanders have completed the two-year one-sport reclassification process, with women's soccer following on a similar track, with full Division I classification due in Fall 2007.

Meanwhile, the NCAA has approved NJIT's request to undertake the first-year reclassification of its entire intercollegiate athletics program to NCAA Division I, a process that takes four years to complete.

As the first program eligible for Division I championship competition, the 2005 men's soccer team embodies the first wave in the exciting and challenging future of NJIT athletics.

Men's soccer's move to Division I advanced quickly from the time it was first discussed in November 2002 talks among President Robert A. Altenkirch, Vice President Joel Bloom and Athletics Director Lenny Kaplan.

From there, came a proposal from Dr. Altenkirch to the Board of Trustees, which unanimously approved in February 2003 a plan to reclassify men's soccer to Division I.

In rapid succession, the Atlantic Soccer Conference accepted NJIT as a provisional member, former Rutgers player and assistant coach Pedro Lopes was named as NJIT's new head coach and the NCAA received and accepted an official application and strategic plan for reclassification.

Less than a year after the preliminary discussions, NJIT, in September 2003, was in its first season of reclassification. The process continued into 2004, with all of the necessary NCAA compliance, including a schedule comprised exclusively of Division I opponents.

Off the field, the scholarship and operating budgets have been enhanced, enabling Lopes, who spent more than a decade at Rutgers, to strengthen NJIT's roster as he moves toward his third season at the Highlander helm. Before 2004, assistant coach Javier Velasco was promoted to full-time and a part-time assistant was added to the staff.

Even the playing field, itself, was upgraded with the installation of SprinTurf artificial grass on NJIT's Lubetkin Field.

Now that they are eligible for NCAA postseason competition, the Highlanders' prime path to the College Cup will be the Atlantic Soccer Conference, with an automatic berth in the NCAA field for the ASC champion.

"NJIT's elevation of its soccer program to (Division I) and its joining a strong conference in the Atlantic Soccer Conference, shows every prospective student-athlete that NJIT wants all its student-athletes to experience college academics and athletics at the highest level," said Lopes.

Upgrading athletics has been a priority for Dr. Altenkirch since he was selected as the seventh President of NJIT in May 2002.

"As NJIT continues to grow academically, and as a residential university, strengthening the athletics program through the transition to Division I will allow us to align the university athletically with our academic peers," said Altenkirch. "It will also enable us to recruit the best and brightest student-athletes, improve athletics facilities available to the entire NJIT community, gain regional and national visibility, and build strong linkages with students that will carry over to their days as alumni."

The NJIT men's soccer program has made 17 postseason appearances in its history, including 1960, when the school, then called Newark College of Engineering, was NAIA national champion. Seventeen Highlanders have been named All-Americans. In 53 seasons, the team has 375 victories and a winning percentage of .542.

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch

President

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch, formerly vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU), joined NJIT as the university's seventh president in July 2002. During his tenure as MSU vice president for research, science and engineering, expenditures as reported to National Science Foundation (NSF) increased dramatically—75% from 1997 to 2001.



Prior to his appointment as vice president at MSU, Altenkirch served as professor of mechanical and materials engineering and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture at Washington State University. From 1988 to 1995, he was professor of mechanical engineering and dean of the College of Engineering at MSU. He also served as professor and chair of mechanical engineering at the University of Kentucky.

In addition to the research program, his responsibilities encompassed congressional relations, intellectual property management and economic development. While dean of engineering at MSU, he led the effort to secure National Science Foundation funding for the establishment of the MSU NSF Engineering Research Center for Computational Field Simulation in

1990. Additionally, the Center was instrumental in helping the State of Mississippi attract a \$1 billion Nissan manufacturing plant.

Altenkirch holds a PhD from Purdue University, an MS from the University of California, Berkeley, and a BSME from Purdue, all in mechanical engineering. He is the author of over 50 publications and nearly 100 presentations in combustion and heat transfer and served as principal investigator for ten Space Shuttle experiments investigating the spread of fire in reduced gravity. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

Dr. Joel Bloom

Vice President of Academic and Student Services

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT since July 1990. In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the university, including Physical Education and Athletics.



Dr. Bloom is also Dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls more than 525 students who are typically in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.

Prior to NJIT, Dr. Bloom spent seven years as assistant Commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He is currently the Chair of

the NASULGC Council of Chief Student Affairs Officers and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Dr. Bloom earned his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from Hunter College, and holds a Master's and Doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.

Lenny Kaplan

Director of Athletics

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College, Lenny Kaplan was appointed in August 2000 to head NJIT's division of physical education and athletics.



Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director with the Jaspers from 1991-2000.

Kaplan is the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference Executive Committee Supervisor for men's basketball, and serves on the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.

Pedro Lopes

Head Coach

Newark native Pedro Lopes became the ninth men's soccer coach in NJIT history in July of 2003. He took on his first head coaching position after spending seven of the previous eight seasons on Bob Reasso's staff at Rutgers University.



Lopes began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Rutgers in 1995, and then spent one season with Centenary (N.J.) College before returning to the Scarlet Knights. He is also the Coaching Director for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club.

Lopes, a two-time All-American and two-time recipient of the Bob McNulty Award as the team's Most Valuable Player, played in four NCAA Tournaments, including two Final Fours during his storied collegiate career. He was named the Atlantic-10 Player of the Year in 1994 when Rutgers advanced to the Final Four for the third time in five seasons. He spearheaded a defense that allowed just 10 goals in 1990, 93 and 94. In all four of his playing seasons - 1990, 1991, 1993 and 1994, the Scarlet Knights won the A-10 championship and appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Rutgers was the national runner-up in 1990. He scored the game-winning goal in the 1993 Atlantic 10 Championship game and started all 86 games in his collegiate

career. Lopes was also a member of the United States U-23 National Team in 1993 and 1994. Most recently he was inducted into the Rutgers Olympic Hall of Fame class of 2004.


Upon graduation, he played professionally with the NJ Imperials.

Prior to attending Rutgers, Lopes was a high-school All-American and New Jersey Player of the Year at perennial national power St. Benedict's Prep in Newark.

Javier Velasco

Assistant Coach

Javier Velasco begins his third season as an assistant coach for the Highlanders men's soccer program.



Velasco assists Coach Lopes with all aspects of the program, with a concentration on recruiting and scouting. He is also responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Highlanders men's soccer program. Serving as head coach Pedro Lopes's right-hand man, he coordinates the extensive logistics of the Highlanders road trips and is responsible for assembling game schedules for future seasons.

This past summer Javier was added to the Region 1 ODP Player Evaluator Staff. Velasco is also a Coach/Trainer for the Jersey Knights Soccer Club, currently leading the U-17 boys' Imperials. Velasco was a member of Centenary (N.J.) College's 1995 NAIA national championship team. He was named the most val-

able player of the title game.

After playing at Kean University in 1996, Velasco embarked on a seven-year professional career. He played for the New Jersey Stallions, the North Jersey Imperials and the Central Jersey Riptide of the United Soccer Leagues (USL).

Velasco won a U16 National Title in Ecuador in 1989, representing the State of Manabi. While at North Brunswick High School, he was selected to the All State Team.

Velasco completed his bachelor's degree in International Business from Kean University in 2000; he currently resides in South Plainfield.

Oren Daniel

Assistant Coach



Oren Daniel begins his second year as an assistant coach. He brings seven years of club coaching experience to the NJIT staff. Daniel received a BS degree in management science and information systems from Rutgers University in 1996. He then played five years of professional soccer, including one apiece with the New Jersey Stallions and the South Jersey Barons. He also played professionally in Slovakia and Israel. He owns a United States Soccer Federation "C" coaching license. A native of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Daniel is a claims division administrator for AEGIS Insurance Services. He resides in Hoboken.

R.A. Session II (Reggie) Goalkeeper Coach

R.A. Session II (Reggie) is joining our staff as the volunteer assistant coach where he will be in charge of coaching the goalkeepers. Reggie is originally from Dallas, Texas. He played youth soccer with the Dallas Texans Soccer Club. He was also a member of the US Under-20 National Team Player Pool, Region III Team, and North Texas State Select Team. Reggie received an athletic scholarship to the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. UNC-Charlotte was ranked in the top 25 three of his five years with two top 10 rankings. After college he played with the South Jersey Barons of the USL and the Baltimore Blast of the MISL. While in graduate school at Texas A&M University Reggie played for the Dallas Sidekicks reserve team. A new 800 bed housing facility is being constructed adjacent to the university. It is scheduled for opening in the Fall of 2006.

NJIT's Campus Center, opened in September 2004, is the final phase of a three-year, \$83.5-million campus makeover. It is designed to be the focal point of a vibrant campus life. The center features a soaring, two-story circular dining hall, sheathed in gleaming, double-pane, energy-conserving glass.

The construction program encompasses two tall multi-story buildings – the East Building, housing the Albert Dorman Honors College, the Department of Biomedical Engineering, and administrative offices, and the center itself, featuring dining facilities, student offices and lounges, game rooms, campus store and ballroom. The two buildings are connected by a sky bridge,

and a European-style piazza featuring a 55-foot clock tower.

In an effort to improve communication and socialization on the 45-acre urban campus, the architects scaled the complex to create the feel of an outdoor room and give more spatial definition to the campus. "To promote socializing, we wanted to encourage people to move through spaces, not around them," said Thomas Levering, associate partner at the architectural firm.

The new round campus dining hall adds height and verve plus doubles the dining space. Its smoky gray glass provides a strong presence on the campus green. A 28,000 square-foot, rooftop grass terrace crowns it. Paths around it reroute traffic to the

center. The clock tower stands adjacent to one entrance to the center. The donated tower features a carillon that will chime hourly.

The construction represents a major portion of more than a \$100 million facilities improvement plan. Completed are additional residence space and an additional building for the business incubator program. Upgrades in the works include two of NJIT's oldest buildings, Cullimore and Eberhardt halls, located adjacent to the complex.

"A good-looking center tells a visual story," said Levering. "A center with the right stuff says life outside the classroom is as important as life within it."

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 92 degree programs in 33 undergraduate majors, 40 masters and 19 doctoral programs. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

NJIT'S SIX COLLEGES

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, Newark College of Engineering (NCE) has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The New Jersey School of Architecture, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer technology into the design curriculum.

The College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA), established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The School of Management, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The Albert Dorman Honors College, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The College of Computing Sciences, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

NJIT: NEW JERSEY'S TECHNOLOGICAL RESEARCH UNIVERSITY

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- *enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education.*
- *programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.*
- *extensive eLearning courses.*
- *selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.*

A strong applied research program is the very core of the technological research university, generating the

advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$75 million today. The university conducts cutting-edge applied research through multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

NJIT is committed to economic development for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of

helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.


The NJIT soccer teams play their home games at Lubetkin Field, a lighted campus facility, with a newly-installed SprinTurf surface, adjacent to the Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center.



Lubetkin contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities and has bleacher seating for approximately 1,000 spectators. Lubetkin is also used for club sports and intramural events, as well as by the NJIT baseball team for practice.

The soccer teams also have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a free-weight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio.

The NJIT men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home games in Entwistle Gymnasium,



the main facility in the Fleisher Center. Entwistle seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, 'C gym,' area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramurals, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building. The newly-renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium in downtown Newark, the facility of the Newark Bears of the Atlantic League, became the home of the Highlanders baseball squad in 2004.

NJIT offers several club sports, including cricket, judo, men's lacrosse, and track and field, plus a full intramural program.



NJIT students may also enrich their educational experience by enrolling in Rutgers-Newark courses and in full degree programs in disciplines not offered at NJIT, such as art, music, geology and psychology.

Each year the two universities co-sponsor a common season of theatrical productions, as well as 'World Week,' a joint program of honors colloquia, and a variety of other cultural and social activities.

The Newark College of Engineering (NCE) soccer team became national champions on November 26, 1960. Not before and not since has any NCE/NJIT athletic team accomplished this feat.

The championship game of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) tournament was halted by darkness after 16 minutes, 45 seconds, of overtime play and NCE tied with Elizabethtown College, 2-2. The teams were declared co-national champions by the NAIA, and NCE had completed its first (and still only) undefeated season, 12-0-1.

Under the leadership of sixth-year head coach Mal Simon, the Highlanders swept through the 1960 regular season with a 10-0 record, outscoring their opponents by a combined 41-9, including four shutouts. They then won the NAIA Area #3 championship and advanced to the national semifinals with a 2-1 victory against Pratt Institute.

NCE needed two overtimes to defeat Fitchburg State in the semis, and set up the championship meeting with Elizabethtown. The match, played at

Slippery Rock State University, proceeded to the fourth extra period before being stopped. Sophomore Andy Handwerker and senior Gary Freimuth scored the Highlander goals.

After the season, halfback Werner Zorn was named NCE's first All-American. Only a junior, Zorn repeated the honor in 1961. Zorn, Savicky and Handwerker were named all-area, while sophomore Alex Khowaylo was selected the outstanding NAIA goalkeeper.

Many members of the 1960 team were still a part of the Highlanders the following year, when NCE again completed the regular season undefeated. The Highlanders returned to the national championship game, but lost to Howard University, 3-2, on a goal with 18 seconds remaining in regulation. From 1960 to 1962, NCE amassed a three-year record of 26-2-1 (.914).

Notes: NCE changed affiliation from the NAIA to NCAA Division III in 1974. The university changed its name to NJIT in 1975. The Highlanders reclassified to Division II in 1997 and to Division I (provisionally) in 2004.

By Car

Garden State Parkway (GSP): Take Exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

New Jersey Turnpike: Take Exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.



Route 280 West: After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 280 East: Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 1 & 9 North & South: Take exit marked Newark, Route 21 (McCarter Highway). Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. (There are clear signs for Broad Street) Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

Route 78: Take Route 78 to the Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions.

Route 22: Take Route 22 to Route 21 North. Follow directions for Route 21 North.

Route 21 North: Turn left onto Raymond Boulevard. When Raymond Boulevard turns into Lock Street, turn right onto Warren Street. Turn right onto Colden Street and follow signs to the NJIT parking deck.

Route 21 South: From 21 South, turn right on Bridge Street. Turn left on Broad Street. Go one block and turn right on Washington Place. Go one block and turn left on Halsey Street. Go one block and turn right on Central Avenue. Make the third left on King Blvd. At first light, turn right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

New York Thruway: Thruway to Exit 14A, Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions above.

George Washington Bridge: NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

Lincoln Tunnel: West on Route 3 to NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

From Brooklyn, Queens & Long Island: Take Verrazano-Narrows Bridge (Interstate 278) and follow 278 across Staten Island. Cross Goethels Bridge. Follow signs to New Jersey Turnpike North then follow New Jersey Turnpike directions above.

ATLANTIC SOCCER CONFERENCE

One of the major factors that made reclassifying to NCAA Division I feasible for the NJIT men's soccer program was the existence of the Atlantic Soccer Conference (ASC).

The ASC was established in 2000 with nine schools offering Division-I men's soccer while holding various NCAA classifications. The founding members were: Adelphi University, University at Albany, Binghamton University, Florida International University, Hartwick College, Howard University, Oneonta State University, Philadelphia University, and the University at Stony Brook.

Following the ASC's first season in 2000, Albany and Stony Brook accepted invitations to move their entire athletic programs to the America East Conference. Binghamton did the same the following year. On May 20, 2003, NJIT was accepted as the seventh current member of the ASC effective with the 2004 season.

In 2002, the ASC received an automatic qualifier to the NCAA College Cup for the first time. Florida International captured the conference's automatic 2004 College Cup berth, notching its fourth ASC title in the last five seasons.

NJIT, as a full member of NCAA Division I in 2005, is eligible to compete for the Atlantic Soccer Conference title and the automatic berth in the Division I College Cup championship field that goes with the ASC crown. The Highlanders, who were in the second year of their two-year provisional transition to Division I last season, played a full ASC schedule in 2004, but were not eligible for the conference title.


