**Ally Nick**  
**Head Coach**

Ally Nick, who took her first college head coaching assignment with the Highlanders on March 8, 2016, is a product of the extremely successful program at La Salle University in Philadelphia, where she was a player coached by Paul Royal, who added her to his coaching staff after she graduated.

As a player, her teams won 39 games and tied 6 in four seasons and La Salle's won-lost in her five years on the coaching staff was 70-27-11. Nick completed her fifth season as an assistant coach with La Salle in November 2015.

Her first four seasons on the staff were the best in La Salle history, as the Explorers reached the NCAA Tournament four seasons in a row, capturing the Atlantic 10 regular season title three times and the A-10 tournament twice.

In that 4-year span, La Salle was 61-18-8, the 13th-best record in Division I.

Playing for and then coaching on Paul Royal's staff, Nick learned from the three-time Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and she, herself, was honored by her peers in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America as a Regional Assistant Coach of the Year following both the 2012 and 2014 seasons (there is one honoree in each of eight regions nationwide).

"I think she will be a shining star," said Kaplan in hiring Nick as head women's soccer coach. "I am excited and looking forward to starting a new era of NJIT women's soccer."

"Ally is hard-working and passionate about soccer. You can tell from her in-person interview and then from speaking to others she is thought of highly in the soccer community."

In her first season at NJIT, Nick guided the Highlanders to a 6-9-3 overall mark, its second highest win total over the last six seasons under the direction of Nick. The six wins surpassed NJIT's wins output from 2015, when the team finished 2-14.

The Highlanders started the 2016 season 4-0-2 through the first six matches, the best start in program history and recorded the first-ever ASUN Conference win at USC Upstate, 3-0, on September 24 (first season competing in the ASUN Conference; 2015).

In Nick's second season, she guided the Highlanders to a program record for wins in a season (9), shutouts (7) and finished above .500 (9-8 overall). NJIT concluded its non-conference portion of its schedule with a 7-3 mark and went 6-2 at home. Briana Hackos, who led the team in total goals (4) and points (10), ranked tied for second in assists (2), was selected to the 2017 ASUN All-Academic team. Newcomer Yasmeen Malik was selected to the 2017 ASUN All-Freshmen Team.

2019 ASUN Coach of the Year Ally Nick's squad, recorded a program-record 11 victories, nine shutouts, placed second in the regular season, earning the No. 2 seed in the programs first postseason appearance in the ASUN since joining the league in 2015-16.

NJIT, which started off the season with a 1-0 loss at five-time defending MAAC champions Monmouth, went 4-0-1 over the next five contests. The Highlanders closed out the regular season with a 5-1-1 mark, which included wins over both Florida Gulf Coast and Kennesaw State in the regular season. Both wins marked the first time the Highlanders defeated the Owls and Eagles.

Under Nick in 2018, Fiona Wright was selected ASUN Freshman of the Year, ASUN first-team and All-Freshmen team, ECAC Rookie of the Year and became the first female Highlander recognized to the All-South Region second team. Senior Arianna Gerber capped her collegiate career earning United Soccer Coaches NCAA Division I Women's Scholar All-East Region (third-team) honors.

Among her duties in the La Salle program, Nick had a direct hand in organizing the defense, which has been a cornerstone of the team's success under Royal.

As La Salle's defensive coach, Nick helped establish a backline that is a force in the A-10. In 2011, the Explorers went unscored upon for the first 11 games of the season and maintained a 0.58 goals against average on the way to an 18-game unbeaten streak.

The Blue and Gold were undefeated in the A-10 in 2012 and 2014, held opponents to a 0.72 goals against average in 2013, notching 31 shutouts over those three seasons. Nick coached three players to A-10 Defender of the Year Award winners.

She was also responsible for monitoring team academic progress, where La Salle's success in the classroom may actually outshine the glowing success on the soccer pitch.

In eight of nine semesters, La Salle women's soccer had the highest team GPA of any of the University's 23 varsity intercollegiate teams. Individually, women's soccer garnered 31 academic awards at the national, regional, and conference level during Nick's coaching tenure.

She began coaching at La Salle in August 2011, shortly after graduating from the school earlier that year.

Known as Ally Kenney when she was a star student-athlete and three-year team captain at La Salle, the resident of Sewell in South Jersey made the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie team as a freshman and continued to receive playing and academic honors throughout her time in an Explorers uniform.

As a senior, she was second-team All-Atlantic 10 and Philly Soccer News Women's College Best XI first team.

In addition, she made the A-10's All-Academic team, the CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District 2 first team (precursor to Academic All-America) and the Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Area team.

Playing for La Salle against NJIT, she scored a goal vs. the Highlanders in her sophomore season; and had a goal and an assist vs. the Highlanders in her junior season.

She graduated from La Salle tied for third on the all-time list in games played (78) and tied for first in career starts (76). Her 14 career assists are eighth all-time at La Salle and her nine assists as a senior equal the fifth-best total in program annals. She scored 9 career goals.

Outside of college soccer, Nick is an identification staff coach for the United States Soccer Federation U-14 Youth National Team, as well as a staff coach for the Region 1 Olympic Development Program in Brick, NJ.

She is further involved in the sport at the camp and club level, including the South Jersey Elite Barons club and Penn Fusion Soccer Academy ECNL, where she is a staff coach.

"I would like to thank Lenny Kaplan, Senior Associate Athletic Director, Andrew Schwartz and the rest of the search committee for this opportunity to lead NJIT's Women's Soccer program," Nick said as she took the helm at NJIT. "I would also like to sincerely thank everyone at La Salle University, especially (coach) Paul Royal and (Director of Athletics) Dr. Thomas Brennan, who have been instrumental in my career and incredible mentors."

I am excited to build a strong, winning program at NJIT and I believe with the institution's high academic standards, administration's support and new facility, it is a great time to be a Highlander!"

She took over at NJIT from Mandi Riden, who stepped down after three seasons as head coach and five years as an assistant coach before that. NJIT's overall record in 2015 was 2-14, including 0-7 in its first season as a member of the Atlantic Sun Conference.

Nick holds a BA (May 2010) and MBA (December 2013) from La Salle University.

Ally and her husband, Joe, reside in Hightstown, NJ with their daughter Kennedy.



**Mary Hearin**  
**Assistant Women's Soccer**

Mary Hearin, a former player and assistant coach at University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC), has joined the NJIT women's soccer staff as an assistant coach in June 2016.

A native of North Potomac, MD, Hearin graduated magna cum laude from UMBC with a degree in history in 2006. As a player, she was all-state at Watkins Mill High School in Maryland before going to the next level at UMBC, where she appeared in 69 games and started 63 for the Retrievers during her college career.

She excelled on the field and off at UMBC, earning America East Conference all-conference second team and all-rookie in 2003 and making the America East championship all-tournament team in 2005.

She was a tri-captain of the Retrievers from three seasons from 2004 through 2006 and served as president of the UMBC Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in 2004-05 and 2005-06.

Phi Beta Kappa, Chi Alpha Sigma and a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars and Golden Key International Honor Society, she was twice honored on the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District team, receiving second-team honors in 2005 and first-team recognition in 2006.

As a coach, she served on the staff at her alma mater, which competes in NCAA Division I as a member of the America East Conference, and she has also worked at some of the top club programs in Maryland.

She was a graduate assistant coach at UMBC in 2007-08 and a full assistant coach with the Retrievers in 2008, filling that post until 2009. Coincidentally, the UMBC head coach was Alyssa Radu, who guided NJIT's transition into NCAA Division I from Division II (2004 to 2007) as head coach prior to taking over at UMBC ahead of the 2008 season.

Since 2013, Hearin has worked as a staff assistant coach at Maryland United Football Club with the Elite Clubs National League u13 through u18 girls teams. At the same time, she was assistant girls coach at The McDonogh School in Owings Mills, MD.

Hearin was a head coach and assistant coach at Freestate Soccer Alliance, based in Bowie, MD, from 2007 through 2013.

"Mary is a great addition to our staff and to the future of NJIT women's soccer," said Ally Nick, who was announced as the new head coach of the Highlanders in early March following a successful playing and assistant coaching career at La Salle University in Philadelphia. "She brings a wealth of knowledge from her playing experience, as well as coach high-caliber players and teams.

"Mary's work ethic and ability to identify and develop highly successful student-athletes will be a great asset to our program. I am excited for her to join our staff and expect her to make an immediate impact to our program."



**Chris Duggan**  
**Assistant Women's Soccer Coach**

Chris Duggan, who specializes in coaching goalkeepers, joined the coaching staff at NJIT as an assistant women's soccer coach in August 2015.

Prior to signing on with Division I NJIT, Duggan served on the staff of two NCAA Division II programs, Bloomfield (NJ) College and East Stroudsburg (PA) University, his alma mater.

As goalkeeper coach/assistant coach/graduate assistant at East Stroudsburg from 2011 to 2014, he worked with both the women's and men's teams for the Warriors. Working at nearby Bloomfield in 2014, he was assistant coach/goalkeeper coach for the women's soccer program.

Away from the field at East Stroudsburg, he was responsible for coordinating and implementing study hall for the two soccer teams and they both earned multiple team academic awards from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (women: 2012, 2013, 2014; men 2013, 2014).

Holder of an NSCAA National Diploma and a Goalkeeping Level 1 Diploma, he is active teaching goalkeepers at numerous camps in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

A four-year member of the men's soccer team at East Stroudsburg, Duggan earned a BA in secondary education and in history and is a master's candidate in history at ESU, with graduation expected in 2015.

As a player outside of college, he played for American Soccer League 2015 pro champions Icon FC, which also won the NJ State Open Cup in both 2013 and 2014 and was US Open Cup Regional champion and national finalist in 2013.

Additionally he played for Lehigh Valley United Sonic of the National Premier Soccer League and the Jersey Express PDL team. Jersey Express played most of its home matches on NJIT's Lubetkin Field at Mal Simon Stadium prior to construction of the Highlanders new soccer stadium, which is scheduled to open in August 2019.

### Conference notes:

--For 1996 in NCAA Division III, NJIT held membership in both the WIAC (Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference) and IAC (Independent Athletic Conference; the IAC sponsored championship competition in sports for both genders).

--In 1997, moving to NCAA Division II, NJIT joined the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference, which later changed its name to the current East Coast Conference. NJIT moved from the NYCAC to the CACC (Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference) in 2000 and remained there until reclassifying to NCAA Division I.

--In 2006 (1st first year in NCAA Division I), NJIT was an independent. In 2007, NJIT was a founding member of the USC (United Soccer Conference), a one-sport alliance of programs that previously were independents. In 2009, when the GWC (Great West Conference) became a multi-sport league, it absorbed the USC, with those teams forming an Eastern Division in women's soccer (NJIT joined the GWC in multiple sports, while the other USC teams joined for women's soccer only). In 2011, the GWC dropped its divisional format for women's soccer. The GWC ceased operation on July 1, 2013, returning NJIT to independent status.

--In 2015, NJIT began its first season in the AUSN Conference. The new affiliation with the A-Sun marks the first time that NJIT has been a full member of an automatic qualifying NCAA Division I multisport conference.
