ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's swim teams compete in practice in Fleisher Pool. The six-lane pool on the first floor of the Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center also hosts physical education classes and intramurals, and is staffed by certified lifeguards for recreational swimming.

Additionally, the teams have access to all of the facilities in the athletic center. These include the Fleisher fitness center and weight room, four racque leal courts, a martial arts center, an aerobics/dance studio, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Highlanders men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play at Entwisle consisting the state of th

Lubetkin Field, a lighted, natural grass facility adjacent to the athletic center, is home withe Highlanders baseball and men's and women's soccer teams, as we'll as several physical education classes and in amural events, it contains a midfield scoreboard and pressboy facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT also offers several club sports, including bowling, cricket, golf, judo, lacrosse and wrestling. The Hazell Student Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION

New Jersey Institute of Technology is a public research university enrolling over 8,800 bachelor s, master s and doctoral students in 80 degree programs through its six colleges: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. Research initiatives include manufacturing, microelectronics, multimedia, transportation, computer science, solar astrophysics, environmental engineering and science, and architecture and building science.

NJIT history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. The first 90 students studied algebra, geometry, trigonometry, chemistry, physics and drawing. From

those early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. Yahoo! Internet Life magazine has perennially named NJIT a most-wired university in its annual rankings. The school received Carnegie Foundation designation
