



Jelinek owns degrees in elementary education from William Paterson University and in fine arts from Centenary College. She resides in Sparta with her husband, Hank, and two daughters.

ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's swim teams compete and practice in Fleisher Pool. The six-lane facility on the first floor of the Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center is also staffed by certified lifeguards for recreational swimming.

Additionally, the teams have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts center, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Highlanders' men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main gym in the athletic center. Entwisle, which can entertain crowds of up to 1,500, is also open to the campus community during selected hours for recreation.


Lubetkin Field, a lighted, natural grass facility adjacent to the athletic center, is home to the Highlanders' men's and women's soccer teams, It contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators. The newly-renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

The above facilities are also used for physical education classes, club sports, and intramurals. Intercollegiate club sports include cricket, cross-country, judo, lacrosse and water polo.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION



New Jersey Institute of Technology is a public research university enrolling more than 8,800 bachelor's, master's, and doctoral students in 80 degree programs through its six college: Newark College of Engineering. New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. Research initiatives include manufacturing, microelectronics, multimedia, transportation, computer science, solar astrophysics, environmental engineering and science, and architecture engineering and building science.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was

founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation, with state-of-the-art facilities on its 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.
