

ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's swim teams compete and practice in **Fleisher Pool**. The six-lane facility on the first floor of the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center** is also staffed by certified lifeguards for recreational swimming.

Additionally, the teams have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts center, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Highlanders' men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home events in the main gymnasium of the athletic center. The facility can entertain crowds of up to 1,500, and is also open to the campus community for recreation during selected hours.

Lubetkin Field, home to the men's and women's soccer teams, recently underwent a \$1.2 million renovation project, including the installation of SprinTurf artificial grass and a running track. It contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT is in the midst of a three-year agreement with the independent Newark Bears Professional Baseball Club to play Highlanders home baseball games at **Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium** in downtown Newark.

2005 OUTLOOK

An exceptional 2004-05 campaign, where 25 school records were broken, the addition of one of the best freshman classes in recent years and the hiring of a new full-time coach give the Highlanders a renewed, enthusiastic outlook.

Despite a number of key losses due to graduation, the Highlanders expect another strong showing this season. Junior Marc Ubaldi and senior Edmund Lui, both of whom broke indivdual school records last year, will get help from a talented freshman class. Look for contributions from Andrew Coslow, Brad Weidman, Steve Schreyer and other from the class of 2009. On the women's side, multiple school record holder and New Jersey Institute of Technology Female Athlete of the Year, Ana Ossa should continue to lead the way. Expect to see a strong showing from freshmen Alaine Fairweather and Lorin Diaz.

Another exciting aspect of the Highlander program is the NJIT's reclassification to NCAA Division I from NCAA Division II. The multi-year process is being led by men's soccer, which reached Division I championship eligibility for the 2005 season. For the swimmers, the process becomes visible in the 2006-07 season when they will compete against a full schedule of Division I opponents.

ERIC RASMUSSEN Head Coach



Beginning his 21st year of college coaching, Eric Rasmussen joins the Highlanders as their new coach. With 14 years of Division I experience, Rasmussen looks foward to leading the Highlanders as they reclassify to Division I status.

Prior to his arrival at NJIT, Rasmussen was an assistant coach at Loyola (MD). During his three-year year stay in Baltimore, the Greyhounds experience great success. At Loyola,, Rasmussen was instrumental in recruiting some of the program's top

swimmers, including a high school state champion and a USA Swimming senior national qualifier. In 2004 and 2005, Rasmussen helped guide a swimmer to consecutive conference MVP titles. The culmination of his time there was the 2005 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship meet where Loyola swimmers recorded over 50 freestyle records that had existed before he joined the program.

Before his move south, Rasmussen was the head men's and women's swimming and diving coach at St. Peter's College in nearby Jersey City. During his eight-year stint, he orchestrated a mass overhaul of the school's swimming and diving records, with many records being broken numerous times. Upon his departure, only two school individual records that existed before his tenure still stood.

Before Saint Peter's, Rasmussen was at the University of Texas working as a graduate assistant with the men's swimming program under head coach Eddie Reese. One of the top coaches in the world, Reese has been on five U.S. Men's Olympic Swimming Team coaching staff.

Working at Texas, which consistently ranks among the top collegiate programs in the country, Rasmussen helped guide the Longhorns to two NCAA titles.

Rasmussen also worked as the head counselor/coach for the Longhorn Swimming Camp for many summers, guiding some of the most promising age-group swimmers in the nation. It was there that he worked under two more Olympic head coaches; Mark Schubert, who is now at Southern California, and Richard Quick, who recently retired from Standford.

Rasmussen began his coaching career at Ocean County College (NJ) where he spent six years. During his tenure at OCC, he led over 40 athletes to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championships, where they collected nine All- American certificates.

Additionally, Rasmussen has been invited to coach three NCAA YES clinics, worked as an assistant ticket manager at the 2004 Women's NCAA Division I championships. He recently completed a six-summer run as a guest coach at the Lehigh University Swim Camp.

A 1983 Phi Kappa Phi graduate of Ithaca Collge with a bachelor of science in physical education, Rasmussen also attended graduate school at the University of Texas. Born in nearby Irvington, NJ, he resides in Toms River, NJ

PATRICK McGURRIN Assistant Coach



Patrick McGurrin is returning for his second season as assistant coach. A four-year letterwinner at Montclair State University, he specialized in the middle distance freestyle events. McGurrin earned a bachelor of arts degree in justice studies in the sping of 2004 after serving as a captain of the Red Hawks during his senior year.

McGurrin graduated from Sparta (NJ) HS in 2000. Joining the Spartans swimming team during

his junior year, McGurrin's leadership earned him a spot as their captain his senior year. In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, McGurrin coached at the club level from 2001–2002 with the Lake Tamarack Torpedoes in Hardyston, NJ.

He works in the corporate security division of Federal Express at Newark's Liberty International Airport and resides in Little Falls, NJ.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION



MIKE PETERS

New Jersey Institute of Technology, the state's public technological research university, enrolls more than 8,200 students in bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in 100 degree programs offered by six colleges: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. NJIT is renowned for expertise in architecture, applied mathematics, wireless communications and networking, solar physics, advanced engineered particulate materials, nanotechnology, neural engineering and eLearning.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was

founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.
