ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's swim teams compete and practice in Fleisher Pool. The six-lane facility on the first floor of the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center** is also staffed by certified lifeguards for recreational swimming.

Additionally, the teams have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts center, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Highlanders basketball and volleyball teams practice and play their home events in the main gymnasium of the athletic center. The facility, which underwent renovation in the summer of 2006, can entertain crowds of up to 1,500, and is also open to the campus community for recreation during selected hours.

Lubetkin Field, home to the men's and women's soccer teams, underwent a \$1.2 million renovation project in 2004, including the installation of SprinTurf artificial grass and a running track. It contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT is in the midst of a 10-year agreement with the independent Newark Bears Professional Baseball Club to play its home baseball games at **Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium** in downtown Newark.

ERIC RASMUSSEN

Head Coach



Beginning his 22nd year of college coaching, **Eric Rasmussen** returns for a second year as head coach of the Highlanders. With 14 years of Division I experience, Rasmussen looks forward to leading the Highlanders as they move up to Division I status.

Prior to his arrival at NJIT, Rasmussen was an assistant at Loyola (MD) College. During his three-year stay in Baltimore, the Greyhounds experienced a great deal of success. Rasmussen was instrumental in the recruiting of

some of the program's top swimmers; including a high school state champion and a USA Swimming senior national qualifier. In 2004 and 2005, he helped guide a swimmer to consecutive conference MVP titles. The culmination of his efforts came at the 2005 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) championship meet where Loyola swimmers recorded over 50 personal best swims, breaking 19 school records and three conference records.

Before his move south, Rasmussen was the head men's and women's swimming and diving coach at Saint Peter's College in nearby Jersey City. During his eight-year stint, he orchestrated a mass overhaul of the school's swimming and diving records, with many of the records being broken numerous times. Upon his departure, only the men's 400 individual medley and women's 50 freestyle records belonged to swimmers not coached by Rasmussen.

Before Saint Peter's, Rasmussen was at the University of Texas working as a graduate assistant with the men's swimming program. There he worked with one of the top coaches in the world, Eddie Reese an eight time NCAA Coach of the Year and a member of five U.S. Men's Olympic Swimming Team coaching staffs. Consistently one of the top collegiate programs in the country, the Longhorns won two NCAA titles during Rasmussen's tenure.

Rasmussen also worked as the head counselor/coach for the Longhorn Swimming Camp for many summers, guiding some of the most promising age-group swimmers in the nation. It was there that he worked under two more Olympic head coaches-Mark Schubert who was recently named National Team Head Coach and Richard Quick, who retired in 2005 after 17 years at Stanford.

Rasmussen began his coaching career at Ocean County College (NJ) where he spent six years. During his tenure at OCC, Rasmussen led over 40 athletes to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championships, where they collected nine All - American certificates.

Additionally, Rasmussen who has been invited to coach at three NCAA YES clinics, worked as an assistant to the meet directors at the 1988 Olympic Swimming Trials, and served as the assistant ticket manager at the 2004 Women's NCAA Division I championships. He recently completed a six summer run as a guest coach at the Lehigh University Swimming Camp.

A 1983 Phi Kappa Phi graduate of Ithaca College with a bachelor of science in Physical Education, Rasmussen also attended graduate school at the University of Texas. Born in nearby Irvington, NJ, Rasmussen makes his home in Toms River, NJ.

ANA OSSA Assistant Coach



Unquestionably the best female swimmer in NJIT history, Ana Ossa is helping this year's team as assistant coach.

Born in Medellin, Colombia, her hometown is Bogota and she was a national-level swimmer in her home country.

After attending college and swimming one year at Pontifica Universidad Javeriana in Colombia, she transferred to NJIT, where she excelled in the pool and in the classroom.


An electrical engineering major, she graduated in January 2007 with a cumulative grade point average above 3.9. As an athlete she was the three-time Female Athlete of the Year at NJIT and represented the school in National Girls and Women in Sports Day celebrations in New Jersey.

In the pool, she completed her career as the school record holder in 16 individual events, setting new standards many times in most of the events. At the end of her career, she lacked only the school record in the 50-yard freestyle. She was also a member of two of the four school-record relay teams.

At the Metropolitan Swim Conference championships, in the final competition of her college career, she scored points in all three events that she entered and set new school records each time.



UNIVERSITY INFORMATION
