PHIL BABOULIS Head Coach

NJIT graduate **Phil Baboulis** was named interim men's tennis coach at his alma mater prior to the 2005 season. In his four semesters as NJIT's head women's coach, the Highlanders have a 14-13 record after recording only one victory in the previous 2 1/2 seasons. The 2004-05 squad began the spring season ranked

No. 9 in the NCAA Division II East Region.

Baboulis is a United States Professional Tennis Association certified instructor with 14 years of teaching experience. He is currently the president of USA Tennis, which runs clinics for children and adults in the New Jersey towns of Bergenfield, Oradell and Parsippany. He is also a teaching professional at the Tenafly Racquet Club.

Baboulis was the first varsity men's tennis coach at Bergen Community College from 1997-99. Prior to that, he was the head boys' coach at Lincoln High School in Jersey City, where he was also a mathematics teacher and assistant boys' basketball coach. As a player, he won singles championships at the 1989 Union County Open and the 1990 Westwood Open.

Baboulis played one season of tennis at NJIT before receiving a bachelor of science degree in computer science. His brother, Paul, is a former baseball captain and MVP for the Highlanders. Baboulis, who attended Teaneck High, resides in Bergenfield.

CARLOS JIMENEZ Assistant Men's Coach

Carlos Jimenez joined the NJIT tennis staff this season as assistant men's coach. Jimenez once held a world ranking on the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) tour.

A native of Barcelona, Spain, Jimenez founded the Washington Heights Tennis Program at Columbia University. He is a teaching pro at the Harlem Tennis Center and the Tenafly Racquet Club. He played collegiately for Georgia State University, helping the team to a national ranking before graduating with a BS in psychology in 1979. Jimenez resides in Bronx, New York.

KEILA RAVELO Assistant Women's Coach

Keila Ravelo became the women's tennis assistant at NJIT this spring. She is a former Division III regional coach of the year in volleyball at Upsala College.

An attorney, Ravelo owns a JD from Columbia University School of Law and is a litigation partner in the firm of Clifford Chance US, LLP. She received a BA in chemistry from Upsala in 1988. Ravelo lives in Englewood Cliffs.

ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT men's and women's tennis teams compete and practice indoors at the **Tenafly Racquet Club** in Tenafly, N.J., and outdoors on four lighted, hardcourt tennis courts adjacent to the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Additionally, the teams have access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free weight and hammer strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts/fencing center, and a six-lane swimming pool.

The Highlanders' men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play their home events in the main gymnasium of the athletic center. The facility can entertain crowds of up to 1,500, and is also open to the campus community during selected hours for recreation.

Lubetkin Field, home to the men's and women's soccer teams, recently underwent a \$1.2 million renovation project, including the installation of SprinTurf artificial grass and a running track. It contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

NJIT is in the midst of a three-year agreement with the independent Newark Bears Professional Baseball Club to play its home baseball games at **Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium** in downtown Newark.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION



New Jersey Institute of Technology, the state's public technological research university, enrolls more than 8,200 students in bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in 100 degree programs offered by six colleges: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. NJIT is renowned for expertise in architecture, applied mathematics, wireless communications and networking, solar physics, advanced engineered particulate materials, nanotechnology, neural engineering and eLearning.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was

founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.
