# 2003 Outlook

The New Jersey Institute of Technology men's volleyball team has taken the first step back toward respectability, following a disappointing 1-22 season in 2002 with a 5-19 mark a year ago. Now, second-year coach **Michael Borga** is ready to accelerate the rebuilding process and make waves in the newly-realigned Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association.


"Anything less than a trip to the EIVA Playoffs in 2004 will be a disappointment," Borga said. "That objective will require us to win the Sweeney Division. Having said that, I would consider a tripling of our 2003 win total to be a very successful campaign."

With five returning starters, the Highlanders will not lack for experience. Team members will also settle into their roles much earlier in the season with Borga given a full year's worth of evaluation time. These factors, combined with an expected increase in athleticism brought about by newcomers, are what NJIT will depend upon for success.

"One thing our fans will see early on is that many of our starters can also back up at other positions," Borga said. "This is a tribute to the all-around potential of our players."

**SETTER:** After playing a variety of positions over his career, senior co-captain **Rob Miller** (*pictured*) claimed the setter's job in the middle of last season and has not relinquished it. Classmate **Shawn Donlin**, after starting at setter and outside last season, will renew his previous role as the Highlanders' utility man.

**OUTSIDES:** Sophomore **Brian Como** should see a boost in his production as he shifts from the middle to his high-school position as an outside hitter. Freshman **Rob Tani** impressed the coaching staff in fall workouts, especially with his power, and has earned the other starting spot. Tani will also be counted upon as a primary passer. Donlin and newcomers **Brian Gadaleta** and **Juan Mantilla** provide depth.



**MIDDLES:** The key to the stability of NJIT's line-up will be how quickly senior **Keith Samuel** adjusts from being a role player to a starter. An all-conference soccer player in the fall, Samuel is in only his second season of organized volleyball, but his marked improvement allowed Borga to feel comfortable moving Como outside.

Junior **Matt Thorkildsen** was the Highlanders' leading blocker last season after seeing limited work as a freshman. He will be asked to take on more responsibility, including passing and a larger role in the offense.

**OPPOSITES:** Senior co-captain **Ryan Walsh** enters his third year starting opposite the setter, and has been praised by the coaches for his passing, offense and leadership. Donlin and Tani can fill in if needed.

**LIBERO:** Walk-on **Frank Nanes** is the projected starter at libero. According to Borga, Nanes best exemplifies the "utter abandon and complete disregard for his personal safety" needed to play the position. Nanes will be pushed by returnee **Jeremy Dela Rosa**.

## **DR. ROBERT A. ALTENKIRCH**

### ***President***

Dr. Robert A. Altenkirch was selected the seventh president of NJIT in May 2002.

Altenkirch, a mechanical engineer, was most recently the vice president for research at Mississippi State University (MSU). He brings to NJIT a wide background in university research, teaching and administration, with extensive experience in program development, fundraising and federal relations. He has served the University of Kentucky as professor and chair of mechanical engineering, MSU as professor and dean of the College of Engineering, and Washington State University as professor and dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Altenkirch holds a Ph.D. from Purdue University, a M.S. from the University of California-Berkeley, and a B.S.M.E. from Purdue. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he is a member of several professional societies and a reviewer for numerous professional journals.



## **DR. JOEL BLOOM**

### ***Vice President for Academic and Student Services***

Dr. Joel Bloom has worked at NJIT

since July 1990. In his current position, he is responsible for nine divisions of the University, including Physical Education and Athletics.

Dr. Bloom is also Dean of the Albert Dorman Honors College, which enrolls more than 525 students who are typically in the top 10 percent of their high school graduating class.

Prior to NJIT, Dr. Bloom spent seven years as Assistant Commissioner in the New Jersey Department of Education. He is currently the Chair of the NASULGC Council of Chief Student Affairs Officers and the Newark Consortium Board for Pre-College Education.

Dr. Bloom earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Hunter College, and holds a Master's and Doctorate from Columbia University Teachers College.



## **LENNY KAPLAN**

### ***Director of Athletics***

After serving 11 years in the athletics department at Division-I Manhattan College,

**Lenny Kaplan** was appointed in August 2000 to NJIT's newly-created position of senior administrator for athletics, physical education,

recreation and intramurals. He assumed the duties of director of athletics shortly thereafter.

Kaplan is a 1988 graduate of St. John's University with a degree in athletics administration. After three years as Manhattan's director of operations, he served as an assistant athletics director from 1991-2000. He is a member of the NCAA Division II nominating committee, the D-II Women's Soccer Regional Advisory Committee, and the Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association Executive Committee.

Kaplan resides in Merrick, New York, with his wife, Nancy, and their sons, Michael and Joshua.





# Coaching Staff



Borga is the co-founder, president and chief executive officer of the Jersey Shore Volleyball Association (JSVBA). Based in Point Pleasant, New Jersey, the JSVBA is one of the largest beach volleyball tours in the world, with more than 200,000 participants since its founding in 1986.

Borga graduated from Toms River High School in 1969 before earning an Associate's degree at Ocean County College. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education from Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado, in 1976.

## PAVLINA KLIMOVA

### Assistant Coach

Pavlina Klimova, a native of the Czech Republic, joined the NJIT men's staff after completing her first season as the head women's volleyball coach in the fall of 2003.



Klimova was a four-year starter and four-time Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Scholar-Athlete as an undergraduate at American University in Washington, D.C. She played on two CAA championship teams, and as a senior captain in 1999, was chosen for the all-CAA Tournament Team. A former member of the Czech junior national team, she played on two national championship squads with the club team KP Brno.

Klimova is the first full-time women's volleyball coach at NJIT in 12 years. She spent the last two seasons as a graduate assistant coach at Division-I Wagner College. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration/international economics from American in 2000 and a master's of business administration in marketing from Wagner in 2003.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and technology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees. All programs included significant research and public service components with the goal of providing an academic environment that fostered intellectual depth and breadth, as well as social responsibility.

Today, continuing a **fourfold mission of instruction, research, economic development and public service**, NJIT is among the leading comprehensive technological universities in the nation. The university offers 100 degree programs in 27 undergraduate majors and 30 graduate specialties. It has state-of-the-art facilities on a 45-acre campus in Newark and a solar observatory in Big Bear, California.

## **NJIT's Six Colleges**

While there has been tremendous growth and diversification at NJIT, its roots are in engineering education. For more than eight decades, **Newark College of Engineering (NCE)** has been preparing engineering students to use science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills to design, construct, test and maintain products, services, and information systems.

The **New Jersey School of Architecture**, established in 1973, is one of the largest architecture schools in the nation and is nationally recognized for the innovative integration of computer

technology into the design curriculum.

The **College of Science and Liberal Arts (CSLA)**, established in 1982, is moving into the forefront of many national research activities from solar astronomy to computational and mathematical modeling. CSLA provides students with the skill sets for the professional marketplace including literacy in the computer, mathematical, physical and biological sciences, as well as the traditional liberal arts disciplines.

The **School of Management**, established in 1988, combines the best of the traditional business disciplines (e.g., finance, marketing, accounting, e-commerce) with the power of information and technology management to develop professionals who can manage and communicate effectively.

The **Albert Dorman Honors College**, established in 1993, offers one of the nation's leading technologically oriented honors programs for students who are prepared to undertake a rigorous and individualized course of study.

The **College of Computing Sciences**, established in 2001, encompasses a department of computer science, focused on both the theoretical areas of computing and the development of new computer technology, as well as a department of information systems, concentrated on applications involving people and organizations.

## **NJIT: New Jersey's Technological Research University**

NJIT plays a critical role in shaping New Jersey's future. As a major public technological university, NJIT is an important conduit through which technology flows into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve pro-

cesses and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university hopes to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In addition to its degree programs, the university offers a full spectrum of resources in technological specialties including:

- enrichment programs for professionals through the Division of Continuing Professional Education
- programs designed to attract elementary and high school students through careers in technology.
- extensive eLearning courses.
- selected courses available at locations throughout New Jersey.

A **strong applied research program** is the very core of the technological research university, generating the advances that fuel a knowledge-based economy. NJIT's research programs have grown exponentially over the past 25 years, from a total expenditure of \$500,000 in 1978 to more than \$50 million today. The university conducts cutting-edge applied research

through multidisciplinary centers of excellence, specialized high-tech labs, and partnerships with industry to develop commercially promising new technologies.

**NJIT is committed to economic development** for Newark, New Jersey, and the region. The university operates several outreach centers that provide direct technical assistance to the state's businesses with the goal of helping small and medium-sized companies become more productive, profitable, and globally competitive.

NJIT is also the home of New Jersey's oldest and largest incubator facility, and was one of the first institutions in the nation to adopt economic development as a fourth mission element. The university's research centers work in collaboration with corporate partners to speed technology transfer, and numerous outreach programs help businesses become more productive. Extensive initiatives in transportation research based at the university focus on the infrastructure New Jersey needs for a thriving economy.

## U.S. News: NJIT A "Top School"

*NJIT is again among the top-ranked universities in the nation in U.S. News and World Report's annual "Best Colleges" issue. NJIT's rankings place the university among the leaders in education, research, diversity, and cost-effectiveness.*

*Overall, NJIT ranked No. 117 of 248 national universities offering a full range of undergraduate majors, plus master's and doctoral degrees. There are nearly 600 such universities, but not all are selected to be ranked. Among the 89 public universities in the rated group, NJIT ranked 59th.*

*The magazine uses expert opinion about program quality and statistical data that it says are reliable indicators of the quality of a school's research, faculty and students. Among the criteria used to score schools are the rate of students who graduate, class size, the student/faculty ratio, and the class ranks and test scores of entering freshmen. The current study is based on interviews and data collected in 2002.*

*NJIT's ranking ties it with Howard University, SUNY-Stony Brook, the University of Oklahoma, and the University of San Francisco.*

*In a separate study, NJIT's engineering school's undergraduate program was rated 84th out of 115 ranked engineering schools.*


# About Newark

## New Jersey/New York Metropolitan Region


The NJIT campus is in one of the nation's most exciting cultural and business regions. Advantages include:

# Athletics Facilities

The NJIT volleyball teams play their home matches at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main gym of the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**.

Entwisle, also home to the Highlanders' men's and women's basketball

teams, seats approximately 1,500 spectators. The back bay, "C gym," area can be sectioned off from the main floor, making the entire gymnasium useful for intramural events, physical education classes, and campus recreation time, and able to host multiple events simultaneously.

Adjacent to the athletic center is **Lubetkin Field**, which

hosts NJIT's soccer teams. Lubetkin contains a scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and has seating to hold approximately 1,000 spectators. The field is also used for club sports and intramurals.

The men's volleyball team also has access to all of the other facilities in the athletic center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), a free-weight room and a hammer-strength weight room, four racquetball courts (which can be converted for squash), a martial arts center, and an aerobics/dance studio. A six-lane swimming pool is home to NJIT's men's and women's swimming teams, while the two varsity tennis squads utilize the four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts behind the building. The newly-renovated Campus Center houses six regulation bowling lanes.

# Directions to NJIT

**Garden State Parkway (GSP):** Take exit 145 to Route 280 East, then follow Route 280 East directions.

**New Jersey Turnpike:** Take exit 15W to Route 280 West, then follow Route 280 West directions.

**Route 280 West:** After drawbridge, take Exit 14B (Broad Street/King Blvd.). At bottom of exit ramp, make a left. Go one block to stop sign. Make a left on King Blvd. Go five lights to Warren Street. Make a right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

**Route 280 East:** Take Exit 13 (First Street/Newark). At light, make a right on First Street. Go three lights to W. Market Street. Make the soft left on W. Market Street. Go four lights to King Blvd. Make a left on King Blvd. Go one light to Warren Street. Make a left on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

**Route 1 & 9 North & South:** Take exit marked Newark, Route 21 (McCarter Highway). Cross bridge. At light at end of bridge, make quick left then quick right for Broad Street. [There are clear signs for Broad Street] Go about 1 mile. Make a left on Court Street. Make a right at third light on King Blvd. Make a left at fifth light on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

**Route 78:** Take Route 78 to the Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions.

**Route 22:** Take Route 22 to Route 21 North. Follow directions for Route 21 North.

**Route 21 North:** From 21 North, turn left onto Raymond Boulevard.

When Raymond Boulevard turns into Lock Street, turn right onto Warren Street. Turn right onto Colden Street and follow signs to NJIT parking deck.

**Route 21 South:** From 21 South, turn right on Bridge Street. Turn left on Broad Street. Go one block and turn right on Washington Place. Go one block and turn left on Halsey Street. Go one block and turn right on Central Avenue. Make the third left on King Blvd. At first light, turn right on Warren Street. Go two blocks to Colden Street. Make a left on Colden Street. Follow signs to NJIT Parking Deck.

**New York Thruway:** Thruway to Exit 14A, Garden State Parkway. Follow GSP directions above.

**George Washington Bridge:** NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

**Lincoln Tunnel:** West on Route 3 to NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W. Follow Route 280 West directions above.

**From Brooklyn, Queens and Long Island:** Take Verrazano-Narrows Bridge (Interstate 278) and follow 278 across Staten Island. Cross Goethels Bridge. Follow signs to New Jersey Turnpike North then follow New Jersey Turnpike directions above.

The EIVA was realigned prior to the 2004 season, and the Highlanders were placed in the brand-new Sweeney Division with Harvard University, Roger Williams University, Sacred Heart University, and Vassar College. The Sweeney is equal in stature to the Hay Division, and the winner of each earns a spot in the EIVA Tournament.

In its first year as a Division II member, NJIT reached the EIVA finals in 1998, losing to Penn State. The Highlanders returned to the semifinals in 1999. Prior to that, they won the EIVA Division III championship in 1991 and were the Division III runners-up in 1993 and 1995.
