AL ALONSO Head Coach

When NJIT revived its men's cross-country program and added a women's team for the first time ever, **Adalberto M. Alonso, P.E.**, was the ideal candidate to coach both programs.

Alonso spend the last 19 years as the head men's coach at Stevens Institute of Technology, and was the only coach in the 11year history of the Ducks' women's program. Stevens's men's teams won their final 53 dual meets under Alonso, and never had a losing season. His women's teams were 28-12 and won their last 18 dual meets. He was the youngest head coach in Stevens history in any sport, and ranks first all time at the school in winning percentage in any sport.

Alonso was named Independent Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1993, 1995 and 1996, and has produced 34 all-conference runners. He was also the head men's and women's track and field coach at Stevens for the last six years,

As an undergraduate at Stevens, Alonso was instrumental in making cross-country a varsity sport. He was president of the Ducks' club team his first two years, then as a junior led the inaugural varsity squad to the IAC championship.

Alonso earned a bachelor of engineering degree in electrical engineering from Stevens in 1983 and an MBA from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1988. He is a licensed professional engineer in the state of New Jersey and has Level-2 certification from United States of America Track & Field (USATF). He resides in West New York, New Jersey.

DAVID CZEIZINGER Assistant Coach

David Czeizinger has been a collegiate assistant coach for nine years.

Czeizinger began as a volunteer coach at Stevens Institute of Technology under Coach Alonso. The women's team struggled to a 5-8 dual meet record



in the year before his arrival. After his inaugural season, Alonso hired him to help build the women's team to a conference championship level.

Over the next seven seasons, the Ducks posted a 23-4 record, won the first conference title in school history, and had an individual league champion for the first time. Due in part to Czeizinger's recruiting skills and excellent personal rapport with his athletes, the Stevens women also brought home many trophies from invitational meets.

Czeizinger has been an avid runner for more than 25 years, and still competes in the master's division at distances from the mile to the marathon. He is a 1978 graduate of Stevens with a degree in materials engineering.

ATHLETICS FACILITIES

The NJIT cross-country teams host meets at **Van Cortlandt Park** in Bronx, New York. The athletics department is looking to map out a course at Newark's **Branch Brook Park** in the near future.

The teams have access to all of the facilities in the **Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center**. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, Cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer-strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts center, a six-lane swimming pool, and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Highlanders' men's and women's basketball and volleyball teams play at **Entwisle Gymnasium**, the main gym in the athletic center. Entwisle, which can entertain crowds of up to 1,500, is also open to the campus community during selected hours for recreation.

Lubetkin Field, a lighted, natural grass facility adjacent to the athletic center, is home to the Highlanders' baseball and men's and women's soccer teams. It contains a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleacher seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators. Also, the newly expanded and renovated Campus Center houses six bowling lanes.

The above facilities are also used for physical education classes, club sports, and intramurals. Intercollegiate club sports include cricket, judo, lacrosse and water polo.

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION



New Jersey Institute of Technology is a public, scientific and technological research university enrolling more than 8,800 students. The university offers bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees to students in 80 degree programs throughout its six colleges: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College, and College of Computing Sciences. Expertise and research initiatives include architecture and building science, applied mathematics, biomedical engineering, environmental engineering and science, information technology, manufacturing, materials, microelectronics, multimedia, telecommunications, transportation and solar physics.

NJIT's history spans from the Industrial Revolution to the Information Age. Newark was a factory town when the tuition-free evening school was founded in 1881 to support local industries. From the early days, science and techology have been the engines fueling the university's development.

Over time, the university both anticipated and responded to change by expanding its curriculum and mission. Most notably, in 1919, the university established baccalaureate programs in three engineering fields. By 1975, NJIT offered a broad range of undergraduate and graduate degrees.
