NJIT FACULTY HONORED FOR RESEARCH, PUBLIC SERVICE

NEWARK, N.J.--Two New Jersey Institute of Technology faculty members will be honored for their research and public service achievements at the university's commencement exercises Thursday, May 23.

Eugene Golub, chairman of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, will receive the NJIT Foundation Overseers Award for outstanding public service and service to the Institute. Vladislav Goldberg, professor of mathematics, will be presented with the Harlan J. Perlis Award for Excellence in Research.

Dr. Golub has long been active in improving the quantity and quality of New Jersey's water supply, providing much of the technical foundation for public policy in this area. Over the past several years, he has worked closely with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, producing the alignment for a pipeline from the Round Valley Reservoir, the environmental assessment for a new Raritan River reservoir, and the analyses of water supplies in the Raritan, Passaic and Hackensack River basins.

He is currently chairman of the Freehold Township Environmental Commission and a member of that township's Lone Pine Technical Review Committee, a member of the board of directors of the Newark Watershed Conservation and Development Corporation, a member of the Advisory Committee to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs Study on a Model Development Ordinance, and chairman of the DEP Citizen's Advisory Committee for the Statewide Pretreatment Program.

Dr. Goldberg, a Soviet emigre who joined NJIT in 1981, is known throughout the world as one of the foremost experts in web geometry. He is credited with bringing the field from relative obscurity into the forefront of modern mathematical research, and with establishing connections between web theory and other fields of mathematics that have enabled researchers to sharpen their understanding of mathematical problems.

Dr. Goldberg is the author or co-author of five mathematics textbooks, and his more than 70 scientific articles have appeared in mathematics journals in the United States, Soviet Union, Republic of China, France, Japan, Italy and other countries. His professional affiliations include membership in the American Mathematical Society, Moscow Mathematical Society (until 1979), Tensor Society (Japan) and Peloritana Pericolanti Academy in Italy. He is listed in such prominent directories as American Men and Women in Science, Who's Who in the World, Dictionary of International Biography, The International Directory of Distinguished Leadership, and The International Book of Honor.
