COURSE APPS:

• **FLIPGRID MOBILE APP** To help jump-start the discussions that will we have in our face-to-face class sessions, I may ask several of you each week to do a **special homework assignment**: you will be asked to respond to a question on the week's reading/film by making a short, selfie-style video using a simple but powerful app called Flipgrid.
