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Course Description: Students will develop the public speaking skills that are eminent for success in academic, civic, business, and professional life. Students who complete COM 312, will have constructed and delivered two short informative speeches, a demonstrative speech, a short persuasive commercial, and a researched persuasive speech. The goal is for speakers to become competent in organizational writing, academic research, extemporaneous delivery, and effective electronic visual construction (i.e. Google Slides/Canva/PPT). The overall goal is for students to speak consistently with the intent of leading to greater speaking skills and an increase in confidence. Additional readings and quizzes will be required.
