<u>Course Description:</u> Students will develop public speaking skills that are eminent for success in academic, civic, business, and professional life. Students who complete COM 312, will have constructed and delivered one short informative speech, a demonstrative speech, an interactive entertainment speech, and a researched persuasive speech. The goal is for speakers to become competent in organizational writing, academic research, extemporaneous delivery, and effective electronic visual construction (i.e. Google Slides/Canva/PPT). The overall goal is for students to speak consistently with the intent of increasing speaking skills and confidence. Additional reading and quizzes will be required.
