#### **General Course Information**

#### **Course Format**

Most of the work will be at an individual pace, although there will be strict deadlines for each assignment. There are videos you are responsible for viewing as well as weekly assignments and postings. You will engage in other activities online, both individually and in a team. All are mandatory. You will be responsible for reading the textbook and online materials, participating in online discussion and activities, and doing all assignments.

#### **Prerequisites**

As prerequisites, IS 350 requires an introductory course in computing, an introductory course in the social sciences, and HUM 101. This course is an upper-level course designed for juniors and seniors.

#### **Course Goals**

Upon completion of this course, you should be able to:

- Explain beneficial and detrimental ways in which computing affects people, including the primary and secondary effects, and intended and unintended consequences.
- 2. Utilize theories of ethical decision-making and professional codes of ethics to analyze difficult situations with computing aspects.

- 3. Find and critically evaluate relevant literature pertaining to a situation of concern.
- 4. Communicate about difficult issues in the computing sciences.

This is an ambitious set of goals, which meets several of the requirements for an ABET accredited degree in Computing Sciences.

- 3. **Time Required –** This course requires a significant amount of work to help you achieve these goals. On average, you need to set aside up to 10 hours a week for this course, including discussion postings, lecture reviews, online activities, reading, studying the materials, homework and team activities.
- 4. **Lecture & Recitations –** The lecture slides cover the major course content and supplement (not repeat) the textbook. Readings and other online materials further supplement both the lecture slides and the textbook.
- 5. Canvas Course materials and other information are on Canvas.
- 6. Graded Assignments
  - Ethical Case Analysis Assignment The only way to truly understand ethics
    is to apply ethical theories to real-world situations. Individuals will be
    responsible for reading and analyzing an ethical case scenario using the
    analysis protocol presented in class (week 2).
  - 2. Weekly Discussions We will hold substantial discussion of the week's topics online via discussion postings in the forum. This is where we will begin by introducing ourselves, discussing course content or current events related to ethics and technology. For each discussion assignment, you must post one original post and reply to two classmates' posts with substantive posts. Substantive posts add to the discussion. A simple post such as, "I agree" or "I disagree" is not substantive and will not receive credit. The original post can be graded to a maximum of 3 points while each of the two replies can be graded to a maximum of 2 points for a possible total of 7 points. Some weeks there will be a specific topic(s) to discuss in the Forum. Other weeks, you will be asked to discuss one or more of the assigned contents for that week. Be sure to read Forum instructions.
  - 3. **Weekly Short Quiz** To ensure you are prepared and have read the material, there is a quiz most weeks on the upcoming week's readings, including the chapter for the week.

- 4. **Debate** As part of a team you will persuasively argue about an ethical dilemma concerning technology in a debate format. This will be a recorded presentation. You will be assigned to a team and assigned to a topic and position (pro or con).
- 5. **Current Events Assignment** This is an individual assignment that focuses on an interesting and timely topic that you are assigned which demonstrates the impact of technology on society. There are several parts to this assignment. They are:
  - 1. Investigate the Current Event Topic assigned to you.
  - 2. Create a recording of your Current events topic (presentation)
- 6. Midterm Current Event Report
- 7. Final Current Event Report
- 8. Introduce Yourself The first Discussion Forum assignment, due at the end of the first week, is to post a brief introduction to yourself so we may all get to know one another. For each Discussion Forum assignment, unless otherwise specified, you will make an original post and then reply to at least two of your classmates' postings. Original postings and replies must be substantive. They must add to the conversation. For example, a reply of "I agree" is not substantive and will not be awarded any points.
- 9. Community Service Internship (optional and NOT during the summer) NJIT Career Services can provide you the opportunity to work with a Newarkarea non-profit organization using your skills to help that organization achieve its goals. This is a great experience, great service, can open doors for you, and looks great on your resume! Once information is available, it will be posted on Canvas.

For Online classes: Attendance will be counted such that you are present for a week only if you post all required submissions to the week's Discussion Forum.

For Face-to-Face classes: Attendance will be taken in Class.

### You are expected to attend every class.

Attendance for an Online class is taken such that you are present for a week ONLY if you post all required submissions to the week's Discussion Forum.

Each student is permitted **Three** absences during the semester. Additional absences will affect the students' grade by one letter lower.

Any student with more than five (5) absences will receive an automatic grade of "F" for this course.

The following guidelines apply:

If you are absent up to three (3) times without a medical excuse - no effect on your grade.

Four (4) times and your grades are **lowered** by **one** letter Grade.

Six (6) times and you will be given an "F".

<u>Medical Excuses</u> need to be reported to the Dean of Students and they, the Dean's Office, will decide if the absence is valid or not.

- 5. Your justification, following the instructions below.

Justification using Grading Rubric/Template: You must clearly justify why you believe you should deserve a different grade. This is the most important part. You have to explain using the rubrics (grading template) provided for each assignment why you deserve a different grade. If your justification is clear, well-reasoned, and correct, and the desired grade matches your justification you will get the full credit.

- For example, if you believe you should get 100 instead of a 70 and you justify it correctly, you will get the 100.
- However, if you instead deserved an 85 and asked for 100, you won't get anything.

It's a "deserved amount or nothing" situation, so be truthful regarding the grade you think you deserve.
